BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÁHAN:

WHEREAS, the mission of the Society of American Military Engineers (SAME) is to develop effective strategies that educate, mentor, and assist military members who are transitioning out of the military and into the civilian sector. They accomplish this by extending opportunities for military members through a robust offering of conferences, workshops, networking events, and publications at national and regional levels; and

WHEREAS, the Society was established as a nonprofit organization after World War I in 1920 to capitalize on the technical knowledge, lessons and camaraderie shared between civilian engineers and military personnel during combat. SAME intended to promote solidarity and cooperation between engineers in civilian and military life and disseminate technical knowledge and the application of engineering science; and the Society has aimed to preserve and maintain the best standards and traditions in the interests of patriotism and national security; and

WHEREAS, the Society's headquarters is in Alexandria, Virginia, and it has grown to include some thirty thousand (30,000) members across the United States, and consists of one hundred five (105) Posts, and more than fifty (50) student and field chapters. The Society's Guam Post has two hundred eighty-seven (287) members in Guam's public, private, military, and academic sectors, and forty-three (43) member organizations in the architecture, engineering, construction, and business industries; and the Society also supports the Philippine Field Chapter and a student chapter at the University of Guam; and

WHEREAS, the national and local Society of American Military Engineers share similar visions of being recognized as multi-disciplined integrators of military, public, private, and academic national infrastructure-related capabilities to produce viable solutions for America's national security. SAME's goals are to build relationships that foster trust and understanding among military, public, private, academic, and professional organizations, and to leverage the Society's culture of service to develop a sustainable growth of leaders in military members' chosen professions; and

WHEREAS, the Society provides tailored opportunities that support plans to train, educate, and promote military members in order to help them grow personally and professionally while they pay it forward through direct contributions to the development of future professionals. The Society's military members also contribute to government and private sector partnerships by enhancing responses to natural or manmade threats; and

WHEREAS, the Society has initiated programs and events that support military members' transition, including small business and youth mixers, beach cleanups, home building events, Guam Animals In Need (GAIN) fence restorations, American Red Cross typhoon relief drives, STEM activities, competitions and camps, and donations of wheelchairs and crutches to veterans. SAME also sponsors the annual Charlie Corn Scholarship, which awards a total of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) to ten (10) Micronesian students pursuing, or planning to pursue, a full time undergraduate technical degree in engineering or architecture; and

WHEREAS, in partnership with the Guam National Guard, the Society held its inaugural Veterans/Warriors Transition Workshop on October 26, 2019, at the Guam National Guard Readiness Center in *Barrigada*. The workshop provides educational information from a panel comprised of former military professionals that have successfully transitioned into the civilian sector, and will engage military members in open dialogue, to be followed by peer breakout sessions; and

WHEREAS, the Veterans/Warriors Transition Workshop will support local military members in their transition from active military service to the civilian sector by providing them with opportunities for professional growth and development, and will contribute to the community by arming a variety of local industries with skilled workers and warriors bolstered by their unwavering loyalty and devotion to serving their nation, island, and the people of Guam; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Singko Na Liheslaturan Guáhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guáhan* and the people of Guam, recognize the members of the Society of American Military Engineers Guam Post for their contributions in assisting military members transitioning into careers in the civilian sector; and commend them for their efforts in hosting the Veterans/Warriors Transition Workshop on October 26, 2019; and be it further






