## BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAL SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, on July 21, 1968, the Chicago Park District and the Joseph P. 4 Kennedy, Jr. Foundation endorsed the First International Special Olympics 5 Games held in Chicago's Solider Field, hosting one thousand (1,000) athletes 6 with special needs from twenty-six (26) states and Canada completing in track 7 and field, floor hockey and aquatics; and

8 WHEREAS, Congresswomen Madeleine Bordallo and Mrs. Delfina Baza were 9 instrumental in bringing about awareness with the establishment of Special Olympics 10 Guam, a non-profit organization in 1976, and in 1977 held its first Special Olympics 11 games at John F. Kennedy High School with over one hundred and fifty (150) athletes 12 participating in various sports; and

1 WHEREAS, the mission of Special Olympics Guam is to provide year round 2 sports training and competition on a variety Olympic-type sports for individuals with 3 special needs, giving them continuing opportunities to develop physical fitness, 4 demonstrate courage, experience joy and participate in a sharing of gifts, skills, and 5 friendship with their families, other Special Olympics athletes, and the community; and

6 WHEREAS, the ultimate goal of Special Olympics Guam is to help children and 7 adults with mental retardation, physical, learning and emotional disabilities achieve 8 dignity and self-worth by offering them a fair opportunity to develop and demonstrate 9 their skills and talents through sports training and competition, and by increasing the 10 public's awareness of the capabilities and needs; and

WHEREAS, Special Olympics Guam athletes participated in the Hawaiian State Games in 1978, in the 5<sup>th</sup> International Summer Special Olympics Games held at the State University of New York in 1977, and in 1980, Guam because the first "foreign" team to participate in the Hong Kong State Games; and

WHEREAS, our Special Olympics Guam continues to participate in off-island Olympics, including the 8<sup>th</sup> International Summer Special Olympics Games held in Minneapolis, Minnesota, one of the largest special sporting events in the world consisting of six thousand (6,000) athletes from more than one hundred (100) countries; and

WHEREAS, the island community, government, and corporate organizations have supported Special Olympics Guam for many years by providing more games and opportunities to improve services and treatment and establishing a more just community; and

WHEREAS, in 2002, the First Annual Law Enforcement Torch run was created
 for the island community to foster closer relations and familiarity with the heroism of

our cur athletes, who continue to face many challenges, but with their high spirits are
 able to prevail and continue to improve their way of life; now therefore, be it
