Relative to urging I Maga'hågan Guåhan to expedite the payment of outstanding A-status error-free tax returns for 2019 and prior years, consistent with the requirements of Public Law 35-36, in order to provide much needed financial relief to families experiencing job loss or reduced work hours due to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I 2 MINA'TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

3 WHEREAS, according to preliminary information the Guam Hotel and 4 Restaurant Association provided to local media at the end of March 2020, 2,500 5

employees have been laid off and more than 3,600 have had their hours reduced due to

6 the COVID-19 public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Department of Labor informed local media organizations during the first week of April 2020 that approximately 30,000 to 40,000 workers may seek benefits under the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance Program which the agency has yet to establish in coordination with the U.S. Department of

11 Labor; and

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WHEREAS, authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, the Public Unemployment Assistance Program provides weekly benefit payments to workers affected by the COVID-19 public health emergency. According to the Governor's Office, eligible applicants include those who are self-employed, independent contractors, workers with limited work experience, and those living in areas without an unemployment benefits program such as Guam; and

WHEREAS, although the CARES Act authorizes weekly benefits for displaced workers for up to 39 weeks, between the period of January 27, 2020 to December 31, 2020, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* recognizes that immediate financial relief is needed now as thousands of employees who have already been laid off or had their work hours reduced are struggling to pay for food, housing, medicine, vehicle and other personal loans; and

WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guåhan further acknowledges that coordination efforts between the Guam Department of Labor and the U.S. Department of Labor may require weeks if not months to develop and implement a local Pandemic Unemployment Assistance Program; and

WHEREAS, with 4,398 tax returns for 2019 and prior years processed but unpaid as of February 2020, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* seeks to provide immediate financial relief to families through expedited tax refund payments as they await implementation of a local Pandemic Unemployment Assistance Program; and

WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guåhan reiterates the policy established through the FY 2020 Budget Act (Public Law 35-36) which prioritizes \$125 million for tax refunds before any other appropriation; now, therefore be it,

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Singko Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people
