## RELATIVE TO SUPPORTING STATEHOOD FOR THE PEOPLE OF WASHINGTON D.C.

1 IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I 2 MINA'TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN: WHEREAS, the nation that is built on the spirit of patriotism and unity, sadly 3 denies equal political rights to the residents of Washington D.C. and Guam in the U.S. 4 Congress. Both our delegates do not have a vote on the final passage of legislation, and 5 unlike D.C., Guam has no votes in the Electoral College. Both the residents of D.C. and 6 Guam lack many fundamental rights afforded to citizens of the fifty states, including 7 full Congressional representation; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the residents of Guam and D.C. both served in the past wars and contributed dearly with their lives in making this nation strong- are still unrepresented 10 and denied citizenship equality; deprived of their own star in that sacred flag we hold 11 12 so dearly; and WHEREAS, no other nation in the world denies right to self-governance -13 14 including lack of participation and access in the practice of our political rights in the United States Congress by the Framers of the Constitution of the United States -15 16 represents serious breaches of universal and human rights, violating Article 2 of the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights that "no distinction shall be 17

1 made on the basis of the political, jurisdictional or international status of the country

2 or territory to which a person belongs, whether it be independent, trust, non-self-

- 3 governing or under any other limitation of sovereignty;" and
- 4 **WHEREAS**, unlike Guam, the residents of Washington, D.C. pay more in total
- 5 federal income tax than residents of 22 other states but have no say over how those tax
- 6 dollars are spent; and
- WHEREAS, although the people of Guam has yet to decide on a political status,
- 8 Washington, D.C. residents affirmed their desire to become a state, and 86% of voters
- 9 supported Statehood in a publicly sponsored plebiscite in 2016; and
- 10 **WHEREAS,** D.C. residents continue to express their support for D.C. Statehood
- by voting to elect non-voting shadow US Senators and Representatives, in publicly
- 12 sponsored elections; and
- WHEREAS, Guam and Washington D.C. both functions and perform all the
- duties that is assigned to states, like administration, health and public services that also
- serves active duty members in the region; and
- WHEREAS, we exist in a so-called democracy where our voices are oppressed-
- however, Guam is not alone in the fight to be heard; now therefore, be it
- 18 **RESOLVED,** that recognizing the history of our nation's foundation on the
- principle of the rights of all people to self-government that *I Liheslaturan Guahan*
- supports statehood for the people of Washington, D.C. to govern themselves without
- 21 congressional interference and call upon the United States Congress and the American
- people to make Washington, D.C. the 51st State in the United States of America; and be
- 23 it further
- 24 **RESOLVED,** that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules
- 25 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of
