Relative to recognizing Captain Daniel P. Turner for his service as Commanding Officer of Naval Facilities Engineering Command Marianas and Regional Engineer for Commander Joint Region Marianas in Guam; and commending him for his contributions to the people of Guam and the nation.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, since 2018, Captain Daniel P. Turner has served as the Commanding Officer of Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC) Marianas and Regional Engineer for Commander Joint Region Marianas in Guam (JRM); and during this time, he has undertaken tremendous efforts, to include the delivery of mission-focused support to local commanders in implementing sound processes and procedures while serving for the Department of Defense (DoD) and its growth in the Asia-Pacific region. His expertise has resulted in the completion of mission projects and initiatives worth billions of dollars that has furthered the DoD's mission to maintain a forward military presence capable of deterring aggression, maintaining stability, and ensuring free access to common domains; and

WHEREAS, Captain Turner's timely and effective contingency response provided executive leadership for NAVFAC Marianas throughout the aftermath of two (2) super typhoons that struck Guam and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) in 2018. He secured \$15.3 Million Dollars for storm repairs while concurrently executing an annual \$245 Million Dollar budget ahead of plan. He created the Task Force West J4 Lead for the Super Typhoon Yutu recovery of the CNMI where the completion of five hundred forty-six (546) temporary roof repairs, the assembly of two thousand (2,000) tents, and the delivery of \$60 Million Dollars in life-sustaining supplies was accomplished. His deployment and reach-back efforts accelerated the disaster recovery and eased the suffering on Saipan, Tinian and Rota while advancing U.S. military relations in the region, resulting in positive impacts to civilian-military relations in the CNMI and significantly advancing future United States Air Force (USAF) airfield divert plans; and

WHEREAS, in May 2020, the U.S. Navy and the Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to enhance partnerships to share critical infrastructure data to improve the island's water and wastewater systems as a shared goal to improve the quality of service for both military and local communities; and Captain Turner worked closely with the GWA General Manager to partner with GWA and fulfill this MOU; and

WHEREAS, Captain Turner was also instrumental in furthering a comprehensive DOD H-2B temporary work visa process per the Fiscal Year 2018/2019 National Defense Authorization Acts to provide an essential labor pool to underpin the massive military construction efforts. Under this process, over two thousand one hundred (2,100) applications have been approved by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services; and the number of H-2B visa holders working on Guam has increased from zero (0) to more than one thousand two hundred (1,200). Additionally, he has been instrumental in working with the CNMI leadership to enhance government, business, and educational relationships in that jurisdiction in support of the USAF Divert Program on Tinian; and

WHEREAS, Captain Turner was also successful at facilitating a \$2 Million Dollar DoD Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) Program to establish conservation easements on selected Government of Guam lands aimed at improving the ecological condition of Guam's forest resources and the native species that depend on them; and this conservation initiative implements ecosystem level forest enhancement and watershed restoration activities; and

WHEREAS, in terms of collaborative policy, Captain Turner was able to carry out numerous politically-sensitive initiatives and helped to uphold the Guam Four (4) Pillars policy - the Navy's foundational policy regarding the DoD's commitments to the local government in support of the military buildup on the island. The four (4) pillars are: "One Guam," the Department's commitment to improve the quality of life for all people who call Guam home; "Green Guam," the Department's commitment to develop energy efficient infrastructure; 24/7 access to *Pagat* Cave historical sites; and "Net Negative," the Department's commitment to reduce the footprint of DoD-owned land on Guam after the buildup. Following a request from the Governor of Guam to the U.S. Secretary of the Navy to return an additional two thousand six hundred (2,600) acres of DoD property, Captain Turner guided the Joint Region Marianas in its in-depth review of fifty-eight (58) individual parcels of land; and

WHEREAS, Captain Turner was also instrumental in a Cultural Repository Intergovernmental Team MOU in which the U.S. Navy supported the Government of Guam's effort to timely and effectively execute the \$12 Million Dollar cultural repository project that addresses cumulative DoD impacts to unearched cultural artifacts as a result of the Guam military buildup construction activities; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Singko Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize Captain Daniel P. Turner for his service as Commanding Officer of Naval Facilities Engineering Command Marianas and Regional Engineer for Commander Joint Region Marianas in Guam; and commend him for his contributions to the people of Guam and the nation; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chair of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Captain Daniel P. Turner; to Rear Admiral John Menoni, Commander, Joint Region Marianas; and to the Honorable Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero, *I Maga'hagan Guåhan*.

1 **WHEREAS**, Captain Turner was also instrumental in a Cultural Repository
2 Intergovernmental Team MOU in which the U.S. Navy supported the Government of
3 Guam's effort to timely and effectively execute the \$12 Million Dollar cultural
4 repository project that addresses cumulative DoD impacts to unearthed cultural artifacts
5 as a result of the Guam military buildup construction activities; now therefore, be it


6 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Singko Na*

16 *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*.


