- 8 minor in Military Science [Sr. Army Reserve Officers Training (ROTC) Program]
- 9 from the University of Guam; and as commissioned officer from UOG's ROTC
- 10 Program, Lydia joined the US Army after college and served as an Army Officer in
- 11 the Quartermaster Branch; and after twelve (12) years on active duty with the United

1 States Army, Lydia took the early separation Reduction in Force (RIF) in 1994 and 2 returned home to Guam; and 3 WHEREAS, Lydia started her first Government of Guam employment in May 4 1994 with the Guam Department of Education's Parent-Family-Community Outreach Program. Mr. Robert Crisostomo, Principal of FBLG Middle School, described her as 5 6 "an intelligent individual well above average and she understood students, parents, and the social learning process to a degree that is exceptional even among the best teachers 7 8 and counselors."; and Lydia took initiative to establish protocol for her position at the 9 school and maintain a monthly record of accomplishments, which reflects purpose and 10 professionalism in her role as a social worker; and 11 WHEREAS, In June 1997, Lydia expanded her career at the Department of Public Health & Social Services (DPHSS), where she maintained her tenure under the 12 Division of Public Welfare, Bureau of Social Services Administration (BOSSA), as a 13 14 Social Worker in the Case Management Unit (CMU); and her responsibilities at CMU 15 required efficiency in case assessment and planning skills, writing court reports, 16 monitoring the child/ family's progress, ensuring the parents were in compliance with their Service Plan Agreements (SPA), while ensuring the child (ren) was nurtured and 17 18 protected in a caring and loving home; and 19 WHEREAS, Lydia also escorted many children to off-island placements and 20 for off-island medical and mental health treatment throughout her tenure at the 21 Division of Public Welfare; volunteered and served as a Social Worker Eligibility 22 Benefits Worker during Guam's typhoon declared Disaster Emergency Assistance; 23 presented on Child Abuse and Neglect awareness and CPS Mandated Reporting to 24 various government and non-government organizations, to include on-air and television broadcasts and for Career Day at schools; was a frequent participant in 25 26 many of the Bureau's Community Outreach Programs; served as a field instructor for
