BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is a complex developmental disability that typically appears during the first three (3) years of a child's life and affects their ability to communicate and interact with others; and, there is no single cause for autism, but increased awareness and funding can help families today; and

WHEREAS, autism is defined by a certain set of behaviors and is a "spectrum disorder" that affects individuals differently, to varying degrees; and, it knows no racial, ethnic, or social boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Center for Disease Control's Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring (ADDM) Network found that about one (1) in sixty-eight (68) children were identified with ASD based on tracking across multiple areas of the United

1 States. This same data revealed that some characteristics of children with ASD have

2 remained the same – boys were almost five (5) times more likely to be identified with

ASD than girls. Today, one (1) in forty-five (45) children will be diagnosed with autism

spectrum disorders. More children are diagnosed with ASD than childhood cancer,

5 juvenile diabetes, and pediatric AIDS combined; and

WHEREAS, caring for a child with ASD can place a heavy economic burden on families and communities. The ADDM Network estimates that it costs at least Seventeen Thousand Dollars (\$17,000) more per year to care for a child with ASD, as compared to a child without ASD. Costs include health care, education, ASD-related therapy, family coordinated services, and caregiver time. Taken together, it is estimated that the total societal costs of caring for children with ASD was more than 11.5 billion Dollars in 2011; and

WHEREAS, a quarter century ago, a nationwide effort was launched to promote autism awareness, inclusion, and self-determination for all, and assure that each person with ASD is provided the opportunity to achieve the highest possible quality of life. This year the Autism Society wants to go beyond simply promoting autism awareness, by encouraging friends and collaborators to become partners in the movement towards acceptance and appreciation; and

WHEREAS, parents and family members, support groups, researchers, and professionals have dedicated years of service in their ongoing efforts to advocate for the rights, respect, dignity, humane treatment, and appropriate education of all persons with autism; and, in order to highlight the growing need for concern and awareness about autism, the Autism Community Together (ACT) of Guam has celebrated "Autism Awareness Month" during the month of April, and this year's theme is: Get Your Blue On Guam - Support Autism!; and

WHEREAS, the Autism Community Together (ACT), which was formed in January 2004, has continued to spearhead an awareness effort in order to educate parents, professionals, and the general public about autism and its effects; and, various activities are being coordinated throughout the month of April 2019 to further these goals; now, therefore be it
