WHEREAS, the Guam Police Department's 2018 statistics show that 252 cases
 of sexual assault were reported with 123 rape cases, 62 fondling cases, 94 incest cases,
 and 7 statutory rape cases; and

WHEREAS, the survivors of sexual assault deserve to be treated with dignity,
compassion, and respect; and, sexual assault impacts women, children, and men of all
racial, cultural, and economic backgrounds; and

WHEREAS, it is essential that services and support programs are provided to
sexual assault survivors to help them cope with the consequences of sexual assault
through counseling, medical services, food, and transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Coalition Against Sexual Assault in collaboration with the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center and Healing Hearts Crisis Center has forged partnerships with government agencies and private organizations to enhance the quality of care for survivors of sexual violence; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Coalition Against Sexual Assault and Family Violence, in collaboration with ten college campuses throughout the Pacific region including the University of Guam, Guam Community College, GCA Trades Academy, and Pacific Island University, have engaged in the Pacific Partners Project to focus on campus sexual assault policies and prevention programming initiative; now, therefore be it
