Relative to requesting Guam's Delegate to Congress Michael San Nicolas to introduce an Amendment to the Organic Act of Guam regarding protecting culturally significant practices on Guam.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

3 WHEREAS, Cockfighting on Guam dates back to the pre-colonial Spanish Era;

4 and

5 WHEREAS, The Loaisa Expedition in 1525 reported that "there was no kind 6 livestock whatsoever, not even chickens or (land-based) birds except some turtle doves 7 that look very much like them. They keep the said doves and raise them in their houses 8 where they keep them in some cages and train them to fight against one another and 9 place bets on which ones will win." Proves that this is not only a cultural practice, but 10 an ancestral one as well, and WHEREAS, The Mayor's Council of Guam, and the Association of Marianas
 Island Mayors have unilaterally passed a resolution to protect cockfighting rooted as an
 ancestral practice, and

WHEREAS, Cockfighting on Guam is a practice passed down from generations
and is a means for our community to learn family values as well as come together; and
WHEREAS, United States Navy Lt. Commander P.J. Searles in 1850 provided
an account of the existence of cockfighting as a part of Feast Day activities; and

8 WHEREAS, A United States Navy Fiscal Statement prior to the Organic Act, in 9 the year 1913 documents that the Naval Government on Guam profited from a 10 Cockfighting Privilege Tax ; and

WHEREAS, Guam is home to more than 2,500 cockfighters and significantly
 contributes to our local economy; and

WHEREAS, A rider provision in the Federal Farm Bill was passed without any
 input or consideration of those affected – THE PEOPLE OF GUAM; and

WHEREAS, When the Organic Act of Guam was written and ratified, and the
People of Guam had the ability to make amendments to the Organic Act, Cockfighting
was already an accepted cultural norm; and

18 WHEREAS, The provision in the Farm Bill is a violation of Guam's right to Self
19 Determination; and

WHEREAS, banning of cockfighting is one of many examples where a colonial
regime suppresses the Culture of the Indigenous CHamoru People dating back to 1899;
now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'trentai Singko Na
Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people
of Guam request that Guam's Delegate to Congress Michael San Nicholas to

1 introduce an Amendment to the Organic Act of Guam regarding protecting culturally

2 significant practices on Guam; and be it further;
