BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I 1 2 MINA'TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN: 3 WHEREAS, Josephine O'Mallan, also known as Josie, is the daughter of +Fred 4 and Annie Taitague, and is sister to Fred Jr. and Trisha; and WHEREAS, Josie is the wife of Michael O'Mallan and mother to Jace, Rosanna, 5 Brittney and Michael Jr., and the proud grandmother of grandson Shane, and resides in 6 7 the beautiful village of Ipan; and WHEREAS, Josie pursued her education and earned her high school diploma 8 9 from Notre Dame High School in Talofofo, Guam, and her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Psychology from the College of St. Benedict in St. Joseph, Minnesota; and 10 WHEREAS, after graduating from college and returning to Guam, Josie began 11 her government career as a Social Worker I at the Department of Mental Health and 12

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Substance Abuse on September 4, 1984, and was promoted to Social Worker II the 1 2 following year on August 25, 1986; and

3 WHEREAS, Josie accepted a lateral transfer and promotion to the Department 4 of Public Health and Social Services as Social Worker III in the HIV/AIDS Program on April 4, 1988, starting her long and distinguished career in the department. In her new 5 role, she counselled clients with HIV and AIDS and educated family members on the 6 disease. She prepared surveillance reports, provided technical assistance to health 7 providers in the development of AIDS related services, applied for AIDS grants and 8 9 maintained the Countermeasure Tracking System; and

10 WHEREAS, on May 17, 1993, Josie became the Communicable Disease Control 11 (CDC) Coordinator Supervisor for the STD/HIV Program and ensured that the goals and objectives of the STD/HIV grant were met, grant applications and required reports 12 were submitted on a timely basis, and STD/HIV staff complied with program 13 14 procedures and protocols; and

WHEREAS, Josie assumed her current position as CDC Program Administrator 15 for the Bureau of Communicable Disease Control (BCDC) on May 26, 1997, where she 16 17 has done an excellent job overseeing the Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity 18 Program, the Foreign Quarantine and Enteric Disease Program, the Immunization 19 Program, STD/HIV Program, the Guam Public Health Laboratory (GPHL), the Public Health and Emergency Preparedness Program, the Tuberculosis and Hansen's Disease 20 21 Control Program, and Central Pharmacy; and

WHEREAS, although Josie has had to deal with budget cuts, decreased grant 22 23 funding, personnel shortages, slow recruitment, cumbersome procurement, increasing 24 incidences of Tuberculosis and Syphilis on Guam, the programs in BCDC continue to meet their mandates and in some cases, even surpassed expectations under her 25 26 outstanding leadership. In 2018, the Immunization Program received four awards

including three for improving vaccination coverage on Guam. The GPHL has been CLIA certified since 2008 and in 2017 received zero deficiency during their 2017 CLIA Recertification Inspection. She was able to procure a GeneXpert DX System for the GPHL so that the STD/HIV Program can perform rapid testing procedures on their clients so that health providers can manage their patients on a more timely basis. Josie was successful in recruiting for a territorial epidemiologist for the department in 2018 after being vacant since 2004 with the retirement of Dr. Robert Haddock; and

8 WHEREAS, Josie is willing to take on additional duties including Acting Chief 9 Public Health Officer, Acting Administrator for the Bureau of Primary Care Services 10 and Acting Administrator for the Bureau of Family Health and Nursing Services, 11 sometimes all at the same time; and she has also volunteered her time to process clients 12 at immunization health fairs at the malls and in schools when needed; and

WHEREAS, the department is losing one of their most dedicated and knowledgeable employees, the administration would like to wish Josie well and thank her family for their endless sacrifice so that the people of Guam could live better and healthier lives now, therefore be it
