I. Overview

The Committee on Labor, the Public Structure, Public Libraries and Technology convened for a public hearing on Tuesday, October 6, 2009 at 9:00 AM at the *I Liheslaturan Guahan*, Hagatna public hearing room. Notice of all hearings was disseminated to all local media outlets via electronic mail on Tuesday, September 29, 2009 and Monday, October, 2, 2009 as required by Guam Open Government Law, copies of which are attached to said report. Notice of said events was also displayed upon the Guam Legislature's website <u>www.guamlegislature.com/calendar.htm</u>.

<u>Committee members/Senators Present</u>: Senator Matthew Rector Chairman Senator Adolpho Palacios, Sr. Vice Chairman Senator Judith P. Guthertz, DPA Member

II. Summary of Testimony

Senator Matt Rector: Senator Rector reads the introduction of Bill No. 200 and then lets Senator Palacios give an overview of the bill.

Senator Adolpho Palacios: Senator Palacios gives an overview of the bill. He states that through his observation of Attorney General that there exists, an equity at the top legal offices in the different government agencies. Senator Palacios states that by law the Attorney General's salary cannot exceed 90% of the superior court judges, notes that it is about \$90 thousand a year with benefits. Senator Palacios then explains where the equity is. The public defender service cooperation, the chief attorney makes \$120 thousands plus with benefits totaling \$155 thousand. Keep in mind that the ag makes \$90 with benefits. The CSC in house legal council \$121 thousand, with benefits \$156 thousand. Port Authority of Guam legal counsel and legal services contract \$577 thousand, The Airport legal counsel just one agency, they make \$800 thousand a per year, the University of Guam Legal counsel \$111 thousand with a total package of \$143 thousand.

Senator Adolpho Palacios: The Guam Public School Systems, legal counsel \$102 thousand with a total package of \$130 thousand, where as the Guam's Attorney General, elected by the Governor, elected by the people of Guam, the Chief legal officer, that defends the people of Guam, that enforces the in criminal statue is paid only \$90 thousand, plus benefits up to \$117 thousand. This has nothing to do with qualifications because the A.G. is highly qualified. The people of Guam's fate lie in the decisions itself. This bill is to repel the law that bases the A.G.'s salary at no more than 90% then that of the Superior judges. That time when the AG's office was established, there was no other legal office in the other agencies.

Senator Matt Rector: Senator Rector calls fourth Phil Tydingco to testify in front of committee.

Phil Tydingco: Mr. Tydingco states on behave of the A.G.'s office we like to thank Senator Palacios for introducing Bill No. 200. He notes that this was not done with their request. The importance of acknowledge the importance of the office, is it like the Senator, it is an elected position, it is a constitutional organic officer. Mr. Tydingco states that unlike the other agencies they are not constitutional or organic officers and they make more than the A.G. The office of A.G.'s unlike her counterparts in the 50 states and 4 territories, less than half have overview of criminal prosecution, which is usually handled by D.A. offices in the U.S. It is very rare that the A.G. prosecutes all criminal matters and also in charge of enforcing child support enforcement. I think that the indeed the chief Attorney public defender service is equal to Chief prosecutor at the A.G.'s office. And yet they make more than the A.G.'s office. It is important that acknowledge is done.

Senator Matt Rector: Senator Rector comments that, when we see that the lawyers from the other agencies are making more then the A.G., it is a matter of respect that they get parody.

Phil Tydingco: Mr. Tydingco again thanks senator Palacios for introducing Bill No. 200.

Senator Adolpho Palacios: Senator Palacios notes where he got his information, which is from the Budget.

Senator Judith Guthertz: Senator Guthertz states she is amazed by these discrepancies officials of the government and also employees. Senator Guthertz states when she was a director, where she was the director for public safety, the first acting chief of G.P.D., when she was in government service leave at U.O.G. It is when U.O.G. release a member of the faculty so they can help the community in a brief time. When it was in leave she saw a reduction in her salary, so you lose money when you are employed into these government jobs. Senator Guthertz states that it is shameful that other attorneys' in the government have a salary that is more than the A.G. this problem should be fixed at the A.G.'s office. Senator Guthertz states that she is worried that the other agencies might want to change their policies to be equal to or higher if this is passed. They might also leave their positions to find a better job, and the government will lose these highly skilled employees, and more importantly the possibility to lose the Attorney General to either the Federal Government or to the private company.

There being no oral or written testimony received, the Chairman indicated that the committee will continue to receive written testimonies for the next (10) days.

The being no comments or discussion, the chairman concluded the public hearing on **Bill No. 200-30** (**COR**) as duly heard.

III. Findings and Recommendations.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. Public Law 25-44, enacted on 3 June 9, 1999, established the compensation for Guam's elected Attorney General 4 (AG). The annual compensation for the elected office was fixed at ninety percent 5 (90%) of the annual compensations of a judge of the Superior Court of Guam, 6 which translates currently to \$90,000 per annum. Since the enactment of P.L. 25-7 44, ten years ago, other legal officer positions were established, each with a 8 compensation prevailing at the time for the position. 9 Since 1999, I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the compensation level for

10 the other legal officer positions within the Government of Guam service, which

- compare in function and responsibility to that of the Attorney General of Guam,
 have risen significantly. For example, currently the annual compensation for the
 following legal officer positions that compare to the elected Attorney General in
- 4 function and responsibility are as follows:
