### I. OVERVIEW

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan convened a public hearing on September 30, 2011 at 1:00 pm in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. On the agenda was Resolution No. 171-31 (COR): "Relative to petitioning the United States Congress to *amend* the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act of 1990 that would include Guam and to improve and increase compensation for those affected by ionizing radiation." Sponsored by Senator Vicensete (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan.

### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

The public hearing was called to order at 4:00 p.m.

**Senator Pangelinan:** Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen, our last item on the agenda today is Resolution 171-31, Relative to petitioning the United States Congress to *amend* the Radiation Exposure

Compensation Act of 1990 that would include Guam and to improve and increase compensation for those affected by ionizing radiation.

This is a resolution that continues to be of extreme importance to the people of Guam and most especially to the members of our community that are afflicted

with the many diseases caused by exposure to radiation. We are once again here to express the sentiments of the people of Guam through legislative resolution to continue to petition us congress to assist the proponents of increasing the radiation compensation program in Guam to include Guam and its people in the programs that are made available to those affected by the radiation exposure. I want to thank Vice-Speaker and acting Speaker B.J. Cruz for his support over the years and if we just listened to him way back when, we would never have this illness if the Pacific stayed nuclear free. That's how long his efforts have been and his efforts will continue with this resolution.

We have signed up with us Mr. Robert Celestial from the Pacific Association for Radiation Survivors (PARS) who is with us this afternoon.

Thank you Mr. Celestial, Si yu'os ma'ase.

**(b)Testimony**

**1. Mr. Robert Celestial**

**Mr. Celestial:** *(Read written testimony)*

**Comments and Questions**

**Senator Pangelinan:** Thank you very much Mr. Celestial. I would like to extend my personal gratitude to the continual work that you do on this matter. I know that the many diseases that we have in our community attributable to radiation exposure continue to afflict our people and we continue to be left outside of many federal programs that are meant to compensate for harm inflicted to those individuals like our people who are exposed to this. It's thankless work sometimes but the only person that really matters, that is on this, is the good Lord who always thankful for those good deeds.

**Mr. Celestial:** It's this resolution, we understand, the procedures, how things flow between our government and we just do what we can do and you are doing a great job, both of you, and the other senators and our government. Like Dr. Perez said today, we've done all we can, and it's up to the good Lord and he's going to pass this bill and people are going to get compensated. The good thing is this gives us benefits for our people for medical benefits.

**Senator Pangelinan:** As I mentioned earlier, the fight that the Vice Speaker has done is more than we can forget, that's how much he has done and worked on this issue and I would like to apologize to him for not having him on here as a sponsor, but I think he was off island when we did this. But we can be sure of his continued support all these years and I will make that promise on his behalf.

**Mr. Celestial:** Thank you Chairman Pangelinan.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz:** There is only one thing more amazing, Roberts humility and I think the entire community of Guam owes Robert a debt of gratitude for his persistence. I know, I've

been on the other end of this persistence when my phone is going off at 6:30am and it's Robert saying he has gone online, he must have been up all night, and he's found something on some committee report that is in the work that he and Dr. Perez did to finally prove that we had been in fact down wind. I was happy because it confirmed that I wasn't completely crazy because in the 70's I was saying that the fallout is moving in this direction and nobody wanted to believe me. But his work has continued since I came to the Legislature seven (7) years ago. Robert was at my door within the first couple of days to get my support to move this. It's been long but I commend you and the medical group that put together the evidence that proves we were affected downwind and especially the testimony that you gave in congress. Now if only Congress would have the good conscience that some compensation is due to all of you that were affected by the downwind effects of radiation. I'm really happy to see that Guam has been included in this act, as a result of all of your efforts and we will do all we can to push this forward. I will be in Washington in about two weeks and when I get there I will do my best to do some lobbying .

**Mr. Celestial:** That's good news Vice Speaker because I spoke to the President of the Downwinders of Idaho and their Senators submitted a letter to the committee for a committee hearing just this month.

**Vice Speaker Cruz:** Well, keep us informed, we are behind you even if we are asleep in the morning and we don't answer your phone call. We really support your work, on my behalf and I don't believe it's out of turn to say I speak for the Legislature. We really appreciate all of your efforts in making sure that we don't loose sight of this important movement.



**Relative to petitioning the United States Congress to pass H.R. 1490 and S. 791 which will *amend* the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act of 1990 to include Guam and to improve and increase compensation for those affected by ionizing radiation.**

1           **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I**  
2    ***MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:***

3           **WHEREAS**, the United States Government and the Atomic Energy Commission  
4 conducted nuclear tests in the South Pacific from 1946 to 1962; and

5           **WHEREAS**, the Atomic Energy Commission detonated sixty seven (67) nuclear  
6 devices with a total yield of one hundred eight thousand four hundred ninety-two point two  
7 (108,492.2) kilotons in or around the Marshall Islands; and

8           **WHEREAS**, no less than ten (10) of those detonations yielded between five (5) to  
9 ten (10) megatons of radioactive material from the center of the explosion to the height of  
10 between twelve (12) to fifty-five (55) miles, into the jet-stream; and

11           **WHEREAS**, on October 31, 1952 (GMT) Operation Ivy was conducted on Elugelab  
12 Island (“Flora”) in the Enewetak Atoll, in which the first true thermonuclear H-bomb (a 10.4  
13 megaton device) code named Mike was detonated, destroying the entire island leaving behind  
14 a 6240 foot across and 164 foot deep crater in its stead; and

1           **WHEREAS**, in 90 seconds the mushroom cloud climbed to 57,000 feet into the  
2 atmosphere and within 30 minutes had stretched 60 miles in diameter with the base of the  
3 mushroom head joining the stem at 45,000 feet; and

4           **WHEREAS**, Guam is located approximately one thousand two hundred (1,200) miles  
5 directly west of the test sites; and

6           **WHEREAS**, the jet-stream travels generally westward from the Marshall Islands; and

7           **WHEREAS**, radioactive material as fine as dust particles drop onto land surfaces and  
8 enters the food and water supplies which is consumed by local populations; and

9                   **WHEREAS**, radioactive particles have led to increased health and  
10 environmental problems in such areas within the jet-stream path; and

11           **WHEREAS**, Charles Bert Schreiber, Lt., USN-Ret., in his sworn testimony regarding  
12 the fallout of the first hydrogen Bomb tests of 1952, stated that Geiger readings indicated  
13 significant radiation found its way to Guam from the detonation of Ivy Mike; and

14           **WHEREAS**, the National Research Council's committee's analytical findings as  
15 noted in page 328 of their report corroborates Mr. Schreiber's testimony; and

16           **WHEREAS**, reports from the United States Navy indicated full knowledge of the  
17 situation and failed to warn the local population; and

18           **WHEREAS**, ships present during the nuclear testing were decontaminated in Guam  
19 harbors with acidic detergents and the runoff from the operations went directly in the local  
20 fishing and reef environments; and

21           **WHEREAS**, October 15, 1990 former President George H. Bush signed into law  
22 H.R. 2372 (Public Law 101-426) relative to the "Radiation Exposure Compensation Act"  
23 (RECA); and

24           **WHEREAS**, the law covered those who were affected by nuclear fallout during  
25 atmospheric testings in Nevada and the Marshall Islands; and

26

1           **WHEREAS**, RECA established the Radiation Exposure Compensation Program  
2 (RECP) with the Civil Division of the Department of Justice to administer its responsibilities  
3 under the act; and

4           **WHEREAS**, a trust fund was instituted and \$100,000,000 was appropriated for claim  
5 compensation of persons meeting a specific health criteria; and

6           **WHEREAS**, in April 1992, RECP began processing claims; and

7           **WHEREAS**, on July 10, 2000, an amendment to RECA broadened the scope of  
8 eligibility for benefit coverage to include new victim categories and modify the eligibility  
9 criteria for compensation; and

10          **WHEREAS**, the amendment set forth to extend the time period for consideration and  
11 compensation and include other individuals related to nuclear exposure such as uranium  
12 miners, uranium millers, ore transporters, “downwinders” and onsite participants; and

13          **WHEREAS**, according to the Department of Justice and in accordance with Code of  
14 Federal Regulation Title 28, part 78 – Claims under the Radiation Exposure Compensation  
15 Act, Subpart E-Eligibility Criteria for Claims by Onsite participants, Guam meets the  
16 eligibility criteria from the wash down of military vessels/aircraft from the nuclear testings  
17 conducted at the Pacific Proving Grounds Marshall Islands; and

18          **WHEREAS**, after a meeting in 2004 between Guam leaders, Ms. Dianne Spellberg,  
19 Assistant Director for Civil Division, RECP and Dr. Evan B. Douple, Director of the Board  
20 on Radiation Effects Research committee, it was determined that Guam was eligible for onsite  
21 participants and “downwinders”; and

22          **WHEREAS**, that meeting resulted in the submission of a statutory amendment by  
23 Congresswoman Madeleine Z. Bordallo to the U.S. Congress to amend Title 28CFR79,  
24 Subpart E, Section 79.40 in order to include the population of Guam;

25          **WHEREAS**, Ms. Isaf Al-Nabulsi PhD., Senior Study Director of the Board on  
26 Radiation Effects Research (BRER) invited W. Chris Perez M.D., Dr. Wesley Youngberg



1 MPH, Mr. Robert N. Celestial, and Delegate Madeleine Z. Bordallo to attend a committee  
2 hearing in Washington, D.C.; and

3           **WHEREAS**, a Guam delegation, composed of Delegate Bordallo, Senator Carmen  
4 Fernandez, and Mr. Robert Celestial presented oral testimony and submitted documented  
5 evidence, before the Committee to Assess the Scientific Information for the Radiation  
6 Exposure Screening and Education Program, under the auspices meeting of the National  
7 Research Council and mandated by Congress; and

8           **WHEREAS**, *I Liheslaturan Guahan* has submitted Resolution 73 (2005), Resolution  
9 5 (2007), and Resolution 30-62 (2009) to the U.S. Congress and the President of the United  
10 States in support of the delegation’s findings and testimony to extend inclusion of Guam into  
11 RECP; and

12           **WHEREAS**, on April 12, 2011, Senator Tom Udall (NM) and Congressman Ben  
13 Lujan (NM) introduced S. 791 and H.R. 1490, respectively, to amend "Radiation Exposure  
14 Compensation Act of 1990"; and

15           **WHEREAS**, the amendment will expand the “downwind” areas to include all of  
16 Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, and Utah for the Nevada Test  
17 Site; New Mexico for the “Trinity” Test Site; and Guam for the Pacific tests; and

18           **WHEREAS**, the amendment, if passed, would allow for all claimants equal  
19 compensation of \$150,000 regardless if they are milers, miners, ore transporters, onsite  
20 participants or “downwinders”; and

21           **WHEREAS**, the amendment to the act, known as the “Radiation Exposure  
22 Compensation Act Amendments of 2011” will extend the fund for nineteen (19) years from  
23 2011; and be it

24           **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guahan* does hereby, on  
25 behalf of the people of Guam, petition the United States Congress to amend the "Radiation  
26 Exposure Compensation Act of 1990", Public Law 101-426, as amended by Public Law 101-

1 510, 3139 (42 US.C. 2210) and Public Law 106-245 via the passage of H.R.1490 and it  
2 companion bill S. 791 which seeks to increase and improve the compensation to Guam and  
3 the other states covered by the Act; and be it further

4 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption  
5 hereof and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Honorable Senator Patrick

My name is Robert N. Celestial and Current president for the Pacific Association for Radiation Survivors. Mr. Chairman and Co- Sponsors for Resolution 171-31 (Cor), the members of PARS thank you for your sincere support to have Guam included in the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act of 2011. We support this resolution!

Mr. Chairman, the original RECA Bill was signed into law in 2000 giving compensation and an apology to residents from certain States and Counties such as Nevada, Utah, and Arizona, who were affected by Nuclear Fallout without their knowledge and suffering from different diseases.

This information was kept secret and later declassified in 1998 with the Presidential Committee for the Human Radiation Experiments. The Government of Guam was not informed until 2001. A Blue Ribbon Panel was established in 2002 by Former Speaker Tony Unpinco, Former Speaker Mark Forbes with Former Senator Angel Santos.

The Blue Ribbon Panel Report from the (Guam Legislature), with other declassified documents and testimonies from various witness on the exposure to nuclear fallout Guam was submitted before the National Academies of science during a Board of Radiation Research Committee mandated by Congress in 2004.

The findings of this report was published in 2005 in the “Assessment of the Scientific information for the Radiation Exposure Screening and Education Program.”

The BRER “committee initiated an independent assessment of the radiologic consequences related to the weapons tests in the Pacific to the people living on Guam.” (page 200. ASIRESEP, 2005)

Mr. Chairman, the committee of scientist concluded on page 200 "Conclusions As a result of its analysis, the committee concludes that Guam did receive measurable fallout from atmospheric testing of nuclear weapons in the Pacific. Residents of Guam during that period should be eligible for compensation under RECA in a way similar to that of persons considered to be downwinders."

Mr. Chairman, the original intent for RECA was to give compassionate payments and an apology to the American people who were affected by nuclear fallout whether scientific information could be established or not. If you were there and you had one of these diseases then you were eligible.

We will continue to follow the progress in Congress and hopefully Senator Tom Udahl and Congressman Ben Lujan's bill will be passed and signed into law soon.


