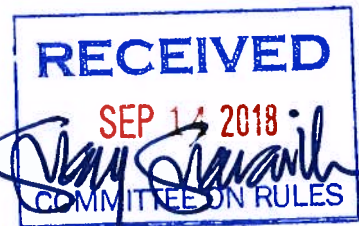

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Hearing for Bill 127-34, 128-34, 129-34, 130-34 (COR) Thursday, September 14, 2017

Senator Rodriguez: "Hafa Adai, good afternoon the Committee on health tourism military affairs and senior citizen now convenes this public hearing. Public hearing notices were provided to the media. First notice was on Wednesday September 6, 2017 and second notice on Tuesday September 12, 2017. For the record, today is Thursday September 14, 2017 and the time now is 4:04p.m. The committee will hear and accept testimonies both oral and written on the following, Bill 130 – 34. This is relative to the establishment of a military limited volunteer nursing license for nurses, licensed within the Guam based military credentialing office to enable them to volunteer in the civilian community. Bill 129-34 is relative to establishment of a military Limited volunteer medical license for Allied Health Practitioner's license within the Guam based military credentialing office to enable them to volunteer in the civilian community. Bill 128-34 is relative to the establishment of a military limited volunteer dental license for dentists license with the Guam based military credentialing office to enable them to volunteer in the civilian community. Bill 127 - 34 is relative to the establishment of a military limited volunteer medical license for physicians licensed for the Guam based military credentialing office to enable them to volunteer in

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the civilian community. Bill 125 -34 which are relative to the establishment of a visiting physician temporary permit. Bill 124 - 34 is relative to adopting the interstate medical licensure compact pursuant to law. We also have Bill 60 - 31 which is relative to establishing a part-time legislature classifying key personnel to provide continuity of essential operations and for other purposes are approved to be known at the Citizens Legislature Act. Bill 60-34 which is relative to the Citizen Legislature Act. I'd like to thank Senator Tommy Morrison for joining me this afternoon and Vice Speaker Terlaje thank you for joining me as well. What we'll do is we'll kind of change up the agenda a little bit we'll go ahead and start first with Bill 125... We'll start with Bill 124. This is an act to add a new article to a Chapter 12, Part 1 of Title 10. Guam Code Annotated for purposes of adopting the interstate medical licensure compact pursuant to law. If you wish to provide any testimony, I ask you to please sign in on the table to my left here and then I can call you up them to provide any oral testimony. I don't believe we have anyone signed up for Bill 124, but before I do go on as well, I like to let everyone know that this is the first public hearing we're having on these bills, at least for the bills that I've introduced. I've committed to have a second public hearing after tonight's, after today's hearing to ensure that we get as much participation from the public. So I'll go ahead and start off with the first bill. So Bill 124-30 for the purpose of this piece of legislation is to strengthen access to health care and in recognition of the advances in the delivery of health care the member states of the interstate medical licensure compact have allied and common purpose to develop a comprehensive process that complements the existing licensing and regulatory authority of state medical boards, provides a streamlined process that allows physicians to become licensed in multiple states thereby enhancing the portability of a medical license and ensuring the safety of patients. The compact creates another pathway for licensure and does not otherwise change the state's existing Medical Practice Act. The compact also adopts the prevailing standard for licensure and affirmative the practice of medicine occurs where the patient is located at a time of the physician patient encounter and therefore requires the physician to be under the jurisdiction of the state medical board, where the patient is located state medical boards that participate in the compact retained the jurisdiction to impose an adverse action against a license to practice medicine in the state issued to a physician to the procedures and the compact. So the intent of this piece of legislation is for Guam to become part of the interstate medical licensure compact. This piece of legislation was introduced during the last term and the requests of the members of the Guam Board of Medical Examiner's and so we weren't able to move it forward and that legislature and so it was decided to move it forward in this legislature, and so there's anyone that wishes to provide testimony I would like to invite you to come forward. If not we'll consider this bill being heard and I've made a commitment that we'll have another hearing on this to ensure that we get as much more public input on this piece of legislation. So the next item on the agenda is Bill 127, 128 and 129 and 130, and now if you have testimony for any of these and you wish to provide testimonies for more than one of these I'll go ahead and entertain your testimony what this what this legislation does is establish a statutory authority for military limited volunteer medical license for physicians for allied health



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practitioners for dentists for nurses and for dentists allied health practitioners physician and dentists to be able to volunteer in the civilian community at outreaches, public health or at any clinic that provides the care to the indigent community. These volunteers will be volunteering on a humanitarian basis. The Bill is very clear is that they are not to be compensated whether directly or indirectly. They must also be licensed in another state. They must also be maintained credentials with the Guam based military credentialing system and so you know what it really is expand the network of providers that come out to any medical missions or come out to volunteer in the in the community and so we're hoping that these piece of legislation would do just that and so I would like to invite those who have signed in to testify to please come forward. We have Bernie Mendoza, Ms. Rosie Fejeran, Evangeline Allen, I know you signed up for Bill 127, please you can come forward signing up for 128 and it's Evangeline Allen for 129 as well for 130."

Rosie Fejeran: "Good afternoon Senator my name is Rosie S. Fejeran and I'm a member of the several organic nonprofit organizations here on the island and I'm one of those people that are very aggressive on trying to get recruit volunteers from Anderson to Navy with medical professions to help us during the outreach of medical outreach for the community, however if I have about 15 volunteers and we go down to the station for them to sign up I would I would only see about two of them that are accepted because only two of them are licensed to give this care or advice to the community and the rest are not accepted as a volunteer and being a military spouse I know that the militaries are very active throughout the community to help not only around any other community therefore I am in the support of this view of 127 through 130."

Senator Rodriguez: "Thank you very much Ms. Fejeran. Commander Allen, first of all congratulations again on your retirement. Thank you very much for your service."

Evangeline Allen: "Thank you, so my name is Evangeline Allen, recently retired after 36 years of active duty Navy. I've had the privilege and the honor of being stationed here on Guam for three tours. Having grown up here on Guam, each time I come back I make sure that I always maintain my license as a registered nurse so that I am able to participate and help out in any type of community service and having been active duty military I know that we're always eager and always happy to reach out and assist in any type of events however there are restrictions because a majority of them are not licensed here so I am in full support of Bill 127 through 130 that would enable us and open the doors for opportunities on for stronger collaboration with the local community."



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Senator Rodriguez: “Thank you very much commander and I just want to make something very clear – is that right now as you stated there, there may be some doctors or other health professionals that are licensed within the military, that- that do work outside and some clinics and that's what you call moonlighting, I believe. So those situations they would still have to go through the through the, the current procedures in attaining Guam licensure to be able to practice this for these 125, 127-130 is only for those outreaches were working at public health or at a clinic that provides indigent care to the community and so that's where this would, would be able to kick in. Okay, thank you very much ma'am. Sir...”

Martin Mendoza: “Good afternoon Senators. My name is Martin Mendoza. I am in support of Bill 127 to 130. Just to give you a little insight on why I'm in support is, in 2013 my wife Bernadette Mendoza went through a series of treatments, MRIs, PET scans, and biopsy, on island to see what was wrong with her. All the treatments and appointments were draining our finances, with no results from a decent diagnosis. It was very frustrating. On January 2014, we made a decision to travel to St. Luke's in the P.I., where we met with Dr. Vesta, Devon Vista who specializes in rheumatology and lupus and Dr. Romeo LaBelle who was a pulmonologist to a referral from Calvo's Select Care service insurance because there were no rheumatologists for pulmonologists on island. Within three days, within three days, my wife was diagnosed in the PI with rheumatoid arthritis and systemic lupus and bronchiectasis since 2014; we must travel every six months to the P.I. for follow-up treatment with Dr. Vista because they're still with no rheumatologists here. Dr. Vista has seen numerous patients here from Guam because of course there's no rheumatologist here. He even recently came here to visit and see patients, but was unable to. He couldn't you know the people who couldn't afford to go to the P.I., but can't travel the people can't afford it couldn't see him. So there's just no way they're ever going to know. One year like I said earlier, one year, nobody, good doctors, we have doctors here who want to treat, but one year nothing, nothing. So I ask you, to please you know support this Bill because we need the patients to see Dr. Vista or- or other physicians who have to treat other patients with other diseases, that have no other options, but to have what we have, and don't ever know what they have until it's too late. Now we can't wait until it's too late. We have to give them a chance to live and have a chance to be treated.”

Senator Rodriguez: “Thank you, thank you very much sir. Is there anyone else that wishes to testify on Bills 127 through 130? This is regarding the volunteer, volunteer licensure and then we'll go on to the other bills as well. Mr. Leon Guerrero?”



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Mr. Leon Guerrero: “Yes I would like to testify in favor of those bills because here on Guam we have an acute shortage of doctors and I say that as a person who does not have any medical insurance and has been trying to get appointments with the various doctor’s clinics and then let's just put it this way, they're less enthusiastic about taking me on as a patient number. One, because I don't have insurance the other reason is because of this acute shortage that we have a lot of doctors offices here on Guam are not taking new patients because their current schedules are fully booked. Back in the 70s when I was a military dependent I was seeing doctors at Anderson Air Force Base and at Naval Hospital Guam. There were occasions when I would see those same doctors off-base because I don't know what was transpiring back in the 70s, but medical professionals and dentists at the military bases were allowed to practice off-base as well so there were times because of my football schedule and things that I couldn't get in to see the doctor when he was a quantum and they were regional so what they did is they set me up with an appointment in his office at GCIC on Saturday so I saw him as a naval, as a military dependent but he was practicing in an office Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays off-base. So I think the intent of the bills which allows military personnel and visiting physicians the opportunity

to do some form of practice here on Guam is a good thing when we look at the number of doctors here on Guam who began their careers as military physicians but have through their practices that they developed in the community while in military service they stayed here on Guam after they got out and I think that the intent of these bills is to make more service available to the residents of Guam through volunteer efforts and when we look at the fact that you know there's medical missions that are traveling all around the world and even our Guam physicians travel around the world with medical missions I think would be very appropriate if we allowed other professionals for example because of our high diabetes rates and the impact it's having on the vision of the people of this island I was talking to someone over in the I field and they said about 35 to 40 percent of their patients have diabetes so we have exploding chronic disease rates and we are short-staffed at treating them at the lowest common denominator which is the residents of Guam these bills are a good first step to expanding medical service opportunities here on Guam.”

Senator Rodriguez: “Thank you very much Mr. Leon Guerrero for your testimony. I want to give an opportunity for my colleagues here. If they have any questions for those that testify, Senator Morrison, Vice Speaker did you have any questions?”

Senator Terlaje: “I was hoping that the licensing board would be here or public health since this is allowing the exception to be used at public health and other places, but uh...”



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Senator Rodriguez: “You know Vice Speaker, we did get message from GMH and public health that they will be providing written testimony; however in the second hearing that we have committed to do, will ensure that they're here to provide oral testimony and be available for any questions as well.”

Senator Terlaje: “All right thanks I guess yeah I guess I just state my concerns then and hopefully these can be clarified as because we're still going to require these doctors to be licensed to practice a GMH, but we're going to allow an exception at public health and I want to know, what this public health believe is different there that you know from GMH that that they would I guess allow that and, and I'm also curious from the board to find out how long does it take to license visiting, could they come up with their own um you know like fast-track, I'm assuming that everybody would qualify and it's just a matter of the timing is that correct? I guess I want to I want to confirm that if they if all these doctors are would qualify if they apply to be licensed or are we looking at a different type of doctor altogether and- and then the Bill allow this the license shall be in effect upon receipt of the application packet by the Guam Board subject to final review contingent upon military commanders permission. Yeah I guess I, I don't like that subject to review. I read rather they review it or some something prior to just -just so that we're protecting our patients and all the people who are coming to these clinics, but those kinds of things I guess I'll, I hope that we can get some kind of answers. So, thank you -thank you all for your testimony tonight.”

Senator Rodriguez: “Thank you Vice Speaker and Senator Morrison.”

Senator Morrison: “Thank You Mr. Chair, I don't have any questions. I just want to thank those who provided testimony and shared their stories. I certainly know the Mendoza's story very well, good friends, so thank you for taking the time to be here and share your story and ensure that the key here is access getting our folks access to as many medical professionals as we can. Thank you.

Senator Rodriguez: Thank you Senator. Senator Esteves...”

Senator Esteves: “I'd like to echo those sentiments and- and thank you for everybody here at especially Mr. Mendoza for providing the testimony. I myself, who- who have experience in the medical field understand that many of the standards of practices are the same and there has to be a certain point where we need to realize as elected leaders and public officials that the bureaucracy gets in the way of accomplishing what it is we wanted to do so I'd like to thank my Chairman of health for the introduction of the Bills and thank everyone for providing the testimony and I think this is a step in the direction of ensuring that on a volunteer basis those that want to extend their services and skills to help everyone else can continue to do so with the protections that the law will allow them. So, thank you.”



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Senator Rodriguez: “Thank you very much Senator. Vice Speaker...”

Senator Terlaje: “The other question I guess I also have is how would this bill relate with the Bill we heard earlier Bill 124? If we allow that the interstate medical licensure, then what this bill would these bills still are necessary or are the physicians from the military already licensed in other states or not? I guess I’m not sure.”

Senator Rodriguez: “That’s a very good question Vice Speaker- and so when we do have that second hearing with the medical professionals and the board, that will ensure that we- we get that answered. Thank you very much. So we’ll now move on to Bill 125. Bill 125 is relative to the establishment of a visiting physician temporary permit and I like to call those who wish to testify to please come forward Mr. Mendoza, thank you I know you were testifying for this Bill so we- we have it on record now, Si Yu’os Ma’ase for that. We have Matthew Taimanglo, Arleen Pangelinan, if you wish to testify, you can please come forward, Mariah Flores, Kiana.. can’t read the last name so Kiana, RJ Pangelinan, Joanne Santos, Martin Mendoza, Bernie Mendoza. Okay Mr. Leon Guerrero as well. So before I accept the testimonies, just a little brief synopsis of what Bill 125 is about. So Bill 125 establishes a visiting physician permit within the Guam board of medical examiners and what this does is it allows for a visiting physician mainly from a foreign hospital or foreign country whether it be the Philippines we sent our patients to Taiwan to Japan as well, is allow a visiting physician as a specialist you know more specifically to be able to come to Guam on a humanitarian basis again in an outreach or a public health throughout the hospital and be able to- to see patients here just like Mr. Mendoza talked about earlier and the requirement here is that a Guam local licensed physician must sign off and- and practically be the sponsor of this physician from our island so that’s- that’s the first safeguard, is that we can you know you’re not just going to have any doctor from the Philippines come to Guam and apply and say I want to take advantage of this. A Guam local doctor must- must know who this physician is and be willing to sign off and be responsible for this physician to come to Guam. The other conditions is that this visiting physician is not paid directly or indirectly it’s not compensated it’s on- on a humanitarian basis. Also the Bill proposes that the time frame that this visiting physician be allowed to do to see any patients here is kept within 10 working days. So, the permit is only good for 10 working days and also another condition is that the application for this visiting physician permit must be submitted to the Guam board of medical examiners 30 days prior to this physician seeing a patient here or being at a outreach or at Public Health or at the hospital. So the board of medical examiners would have to review the application and have 30 days to make a decision whether they would approve or disapprove this- this application. So I’ll go ahead now and take testimony, Mr. L.G. or Mr. Mendoza, I’m sorry, you already did yours, so just if you can just state your name.



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Aiden Jade Hunt: “Good afternoon Senators, hello, my name is Aiden Jade Hunt, I am here with a lupus awareness group and my family. I am for the Bill 125-34 which will allow foreign physicians to see patients like me on a humanitarian basis and without compensation. It basically means, that foreign doctors will be allowed to see patients on Guam at medical mission outreaches at public health or even at the hospital. My mom and I had made sure I came today to explain how I feel. Not everyone can understand how difficult it is to keep going off-island for medical care because our island acts medical resources. I was 9 years old no longer walking, drastic weight loss, hair loss, mouth sores, rash all over my face and body, severe anemia and pain throughout my body. I spent three weeks on the hospital bed teammates being treated for pneumonia, another two and half weeks at GRMC, just trying to figure out what was wrong with me. I was seen by all sorts of specialists, a nephrologist who said not getting my kidney was failing, a cardiologist who said I had enlargement in my heart, a hematologist and an oncologist who said I may have lymphoma, but couldn’t wait for test results to confirm because I had to leave island immediately. All these specialists, I’m thankful for and I was able to see, all except the one I needed a Rheumatologist. I am 10 years old today with active systemic lupus erythematosus commonly known as lupus, an autoimmune disease in which the body immune system mistakenly attacks its very own healthy tissues and organs and many parts of the body. My sickness requires me to travel to seek medical care every six months for the next five years or until my lupus is dormant. I am a patient at Children's Hospital Los Angeles in California. I love my team of doctors there I love the care I received but the long hours in the plane to get there, I cannot even express how much I hate it. All the hard work for fundraisers, the support from the community to help with managing uncovered medical expenses for me are all very appreciated, but it doesn't add up to the burden it leaves on my parents. Every six months my parents have to spend thousands of dollars for a checkup. They have to request for unpaid leave from work, sign and plan for prearranged absences for me to miss so many days of school, and let's not forget the hardest part of having to find a caretaker for my two brothers. All I’m asking today is to hear our voices, especially those who will never have the opportunity to travel off-island to seek medical attention, help us receive if not all, then some of the medical care we need in the comfort of our home, our island. Help us travel less and use those thousands of dollars toward uncovered medications or uncovered medical expenses we will still need need. Please don't wait for something to happen to someone you know to finally decide, act on it, act on it now. Let the physicians who want to help the people of our island come and let them help us. Thank you.”

Senator Rodriguez: “Thank you very much for that excellent testimony. Thank you, Mr. Leon Guerrero...”



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Mr. Leon Guerrero: “I especially wanted to testify on this Bill right here for two reasons. I'm testifying in my own capacity as a citizen, my sister Kirana Leon Guerrero, who is the executive director for the Ayuda Foundation and her organization provides support for medical missions throughout the South Pacific and in that instance doctors from all over the world come together and go into communities and perform heroic medical work and so much of it is ordinary routine medical work that is easy to get in places like Guam but very difficult to get in places outside of Guam and it changes lives. I personally am a beneficiary of a medical mission during the Korean War, there was a group of doctors that went around to American military bases and performed surgery on military personnel and their dependents. I have a cleft lip and back in the 50s that was a very debilitating disfigurement and my cleft lip was so bad that it was almost a cleft palate, back in the 50s children with cleft palates had a very low survival rate. The doctors at the base couldn't do anything about it, but they heard about a medical mission that was going around from base to base and these were plastic surgeons from New York and Europe that had developed an innovative plastic surgery, in a very innovative plastic surgery for cleft lip and cleft palates and as part of their service to the country they were going around to military bases and performing these surgeries free of charge to personnel independent of military personnel. I have one of the best cleft lip operations I have seen anywhere and as a result of the type of activity that this Bill seeks to sponsor and we're talking about when the 12 years I lived in Hawaii I was in the Jaycees and we were affiliated with Tully Moore, I don't know if you've ever heard of it but it's a medical mission it's a giant square rigger that sails around Hawaii in the South Pacific performing this type of emergency medical care at underserved islands like Kauai, Maui, Molokai, and islands in the South Pacific so the intent of this Bill as I understand it is to allow doctors to come to Guam for short periods of time to perform medical work within the community for the benefit of the community and I think this Bill needs to be passed.”

Senator Rodriguez: “Thank you very much Mr. Leon Guerrero. Any of the senators have any questions? Vice Speaker did you have any questions? Senator Morrison? Anyone else wish to testify on Bill 125? Yes- yes, Senator please, I'd like to recognize former Senator Lou Leon Guerrero. Thank you Senator.”

Senator Leon Guerrero: “Oh I was not used to this kind of high-tech when I was a Senator. I haven't really seen all of the Bills that have been presented here, but I did look at Bill 125 and certainly for the purpose of this it is applicable to allow temporary visiting physicians. One suggestion is to make sure that the supervising physician is also the same specialty as the visiting physician, meaning you don't really want to have a pediatrician supervising and obstetrician or a family practice, supervising an obstetrician it'd be great if they can match it with the specialty. On the issue the route the rheumatology and their all other specialties that we need here we need a gastroenterologist, we need a rheumatologist we need, a we have several endocrinologist, but not



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enough I think this doesn't work for that solution because these kinds of care has to be on a continuous kind of care. It would probably be a greater impact if we figured out some way that we can allow a visiting rheumatologist, give them a permanent license so that they can come every three months or every two months and not necessarily have to renew their license every year I know that they have that we are doing that now as the community with the cardiologists that come here they come every three months they set up they practice they partner with a physician and patients who see this cardiologists have continuous ongoing care and then they also go back to their - to the place where the cardiologist is practicing. So for those kinds of diseases and those kinds of need I think there should be more of a permanent solution, I don't think this temporary visiting physician is going to address that because the purposes for this temporary physicians are more for one-time kinds of situations, emergency disasters issues like medical mission kinds of things but I think for more for a better long-term solution we need to look at ways that we can provide for those physicians, that can maybe come in - every two months every three months and even greater if we can entice them to come and practice here on an ongoing basis. Maybe the government could look at some kinds of ways that we can entice them maybe we can provide them with their clinic site we can provide them with their staff, we can you know there's lots of things that we could do to entice a Rheumatologist to come and practice here. Make the licensing process a little bit faster and much more expedient I think that would also help, so, I just wanted to suggest those things to you Senator, I appreciate your attention, I appreciate your desire of course the help our people of Guam and maybe these suggestions can even give a greater permanent solution for to kind of close the gap of the lack of specialties in our island.”

Senator Rodriguez: “Absolutely thank you very much Senator for your testimony, actually Bill 124 which would if passed would get Guam it to be become a member of the compact licensure and so what this does is that that for any of the states where we have specialists like rheumatologist or any other specialist if they're part of this compact and they're able to- to come to Guam and the fast-tracking of the licensing is done because we are members of this compact and that's that we're going to get U.S. specialists to come to Guam but you're right for the meantime we know that hundreds of thousands of our people go to the Philippines for example and the Lupus group for- for one they have specialists there that they see that's referred by our Guam doctors refers them to this one specialist and so if we could just like the gentleman, the young gentleman talked about have this physician come here on a medical mission and if that means one less trip for- for him and his family in that year is really going to be a big impact, so thank you very much again senator.”

Senator Leon Guerrero: “I think the key here is continuity, I think that's the operating key is the continuity, how can we assure continuity of-of those physicians to continue caring for our- for our communities.”



SENATOR DENNIS G. RODRIGUEZ, JR.

Senator Rodriguez: “Thank you very much anyone has questions, if not thank you thank you very much. Is there anyone else that wish to testify and Bill 125 I know I the names that I read earlier by the way they all check marked in favor, so thank you thank you very much for that if not we'll go ahead and call, John did you have testimony for 125? Mr. Carlos? Oh yes please, go ahead we'll take your testimony.”

John Carlos: “Thank You Mr. Chairman Senators, thank you very much for entertaining my testimony even though I'm a bit late, I apologize. We always have a problem with health insurance and the biggest problem of all is in the delivery of health care and so as you can see from my written testimony, there was a summit that was held and its entitled Making Health Care Market Work Competition Policy for Health Care. After that summit there was various participant in that summit one of those participants is a former commissioner named insurance commissioner named Teresa Miller, Commission Insurance Commissioner for Philadelphia now she is the Secretary of Health for, promoted Secretary of Health in-in Philadelphia where there's bodies professors and economic analysts and practicing physicians there was several findings and I quote from the finding, “The U.S. healthcare system does not work as well as it could or should prices are high and rising they certainly are rising there are serious quality consulate II problems and many characterize the system was rigid and unresponsive lacking dynamism innovation a lack of competition is a major contributor to this dysfunction to emphasize just the lack of competition.” Let me give you an anecdote when I started working for construction company doing project for Pacific Star Hotel the cost of a desktop computer which says a memory 512 K cost at that time \$12,500 now you have a laptop computer with 256 random memory any storage memory or one terabyte but the price now you can get that for \$500 so it's the innovation and the competition that went driving the price of electronic devices from 1985 to present that brought down the prices there's a lack of competition and there's a lack of innovation in the healthcare and so one of the solutions that was proposed was it says, “ In order to promote competition states should adapt process to promote entry by new competitors and remove barriers to entry one of the specific recommendation which states should adapt provider licensure reciprocity across states.” and this is what your Bill- Bill number 124-34 provides by way of solution the licensure of other providers from other compact member states it is my hope that not only this committee but the whole legislature will- will approve this bill and upon approval we hope that practitioners there are members of the compact states should be able to be licensed with relatively ease of burden and provide practices for their specialties in Guam, with competition we hope not to lower the prices but more to stabilize because we're all in the same boat. If the prices of providing for health care that stabilized every year every cost of health insurance will go up. So for that reason and as indicated in my written testimony I'm in favor of this Bill.”



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Senator Rodriguez: “Thank you very much Mr. Carlos...Any questions for Mr. Carlos? If not thank you, thank you very much. I would also like to recognize also former senator Mike Limtiaco, thank you Senator for being here. Do you have any testimony for these bills? If not okay we'll get to that. We do have Julia Alicia Roberto, did you wish to testify? Written testimony? Okay great, thank you. So the committee will continue to keep the record open on these Bills as I said earlier we would schedule another, hearing we will make that announcement and when that hearing will take place until then we'll continue to accept written testimony which could be emailed or dropped off here at the Guam Congress building, okay thank you very much we'll take a five or three minute recess just so we can prepare for we can prepare for the next two Bills.”

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*
3 acknowledges that the military nursing community has a long and proud
4 continuing history on Guam beginning in August of 1899 with the arrival of
5 the Medical Officer of the USS Yosemite, Surgeon Philip Leach, and
6 Assistant Surgeons Mark V. Stone and Alfred G. Grunwell. Because of a
7 shortage of medical staff, these medical officers began teaching local women
8 to be health care workers. This training effort started in 1901 and in various
9 forms and fashions continues to this day. It is an interesting historical note
10 that the first nursing students had to be single, and between the ages of
11 eighteen to twenty-five. They worked eight hours a day, were paid \$9.92 a

1 month. They had to leave school if they married. They lived at the hospital
2 in student quarters, and were allowed to go home one day a week. From
3 those meager beginnings Guam now boasts having a top notch nursing
4 school at the University of Guam and shares knowledge with naval
5 personnel on equal footing through continuing education courses. This
6 legacy of military nursing personnel working in the Guam community is
7 marked with many significant events that built the camaraderie we
8 experience today.

9 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further acknowledges that the Health
10 Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) deems Guam as a Health
11 Professional Shortage Area (HPSA). There are concurrent efforts to explore
12 relief of our medical shortages that run parallel to the nursing effort
13 presented.

14 It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, in recognizing the
15 valuable contributions made by our military health care system and the
16 recognized need to increase our primary care provider base, to establish an
17 expedited Military Limited Volunteer License within the Guam Board of
18 Nurse Examiners. This license is to make available, at no cost, to a nurse
19 who is authorized as a nurse to treat personnel enlisted in a branch of the
20 United States armed forces or veterans, and is limited to the practice of
21 nursing for no compensation in clinics and outreach events that serve
22 indigent populations.

23 **Section 2.** A new § 12322 (e), is added to Chapter 12, Part 1,
24 Article 3, of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:
25 **"§ 12322. Temporary Licenses/Certifications.**

26 The Guam Board of Nurse Examiners:

1 (a) may issue a temporary permit to a graduate of an accredited
2 U.S., foreign or Guam professional nursing education program, upon
3 application, payment of the required fee, and after verifying the
4 applicant's official transcript and certificate of education; provided,
5 however, that such applicant has received the Board's authorization to
6 sit for the first licensing examination immediately following such
7 applicant's graduation. Such a permittee shall be identified as a
8 'graduate nurse' ('G.N.') and may practice nursing only under the
9 direct supervision of a registered nurse. Only such a permittee shall be
10 authorized to use the title 'graduate nurse.' All temporary permits
11 issued pursuant to this Subparagraph shall terminate when the Board
12 has received the permittee's scores from the licensing examination
13 immediately succeeding such permittee's graduation from nursing
14 school; and

15 "(b) shall adopt such regulations as are necessary to protect the
16 public and limit the practice of persons issued temporary
17 licenses/certification.

18 (c) May issue a nurse (RN, APRN, LPN) or nursing assistant
19 applicant a three (3) month temporary license/certification upon
20 submission of a notarized application, payment of the required fee and
21 evidence of:

22 (1) a current U.S. license as a registered nurse or
23 practical nurse; or

24 (2) a current National or State Board Certification as an
25 advanced practice registered nurse; or

26 (3) a current State Board Certification as a nursing
27 assistant

1 (d) May use their discretion to extend the temporary
2 license/certification, but the extension shall not exceed six (6) months.

3 (e) May issue a Military Limited Volunteer License to a nurse
4 (RN, APRN, LPN) applicant who:

5 (1) is licensed and in good standing as a nurse in another
6 state;

7 (2) maintains their credentials within the military
8 credentialing system and authorizes the Guam based Military
9 Credentialing Office to provide to the Guam Board of Nurse
10 Examiners the required verification documents and
11 Commander's approval;

12 (3) agrees to be subject to board rules and regulations,
13 including those regarding disciplinary action, license
14 registration and renewal, and continuing medical education.

15 (4) a nurse who practices nursing on Guam under a
16 license issued under this Section may only practice at a clinic or
17 outreach event that primarily treats indigent populations and the
18 nurse does not receive direct or indirect compensation or
19 payment of anything of monetary value in exchange for the
20 medical services rendered by the nurse to the indigent patients
21 at the clinic or outreach event.

22 (5) A military limited volunteer license shall be issued
23 for a period of two (2) years at no charge to the applicant and
24 may be renewed and maintained according to registration
25 requirements as prescribed by the Board.

26 (6) The license shall be in effect upon receipt of the
27 application packet by the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners

1 subject to final review. This presumptive eligibility for
2 licensure is contingent upon the appropriate Military
3 Commander's permission allowing the nurse to practice in the
4 community and the appropriate collaborative sharing of
5 information between the military credentialing office and the
6 Guam Board of Nurse Examiners."
7

8 **Section 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its
9 application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary
10 to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this
11 Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application,
12 and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.


13 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act shall become immediately
14 effective upon enactment.

The Bureau requests that Bill No. 130-34 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

The proposed legislation seeks to add a new § 12805 with respect to the licensing of military Nursing Professionals stationed on Guam to treat indigent patients on a voluntary basis. Such license would be issued at no charge to the applicant for the period of three months to two years, depending on whether or not the license is a temporary license or a certificate, or a Military Limited Volunteer License. The issuance of these licenses are contingent upon the attainment of the applicant's nursing license in Guam or the applicant's good standing as a licensed nursing professional in another states. The applicant is also required to maintain his or her credentials within the Military Credentialing Office.

This proposed addition has been reviewed by the Bureau of Budget and Management Research (BBMR). BBMR has concluded that such addition would have no fiscal impact on DPHSS' FY 2017 appropriation level and further concluded such addition is administrative in nature.


