Cleaning up our roadsides during election season is definitely an idea whose time has come.

There are at least ten good reasons for passing Bill 138, to wit:

1. Our highways will be safer. A traffic fatality in Yigo several years ago arguably had a political signs dimension.
2. Political signs are eyesores and constitute visual pollution.
3. Political signs tend to mask or the natural beauty of our island from our tourists. (Most tourists don't come here to see roadside displays of our political “laundry.”)
4. Visual pollution is not attractive even if “beautified” with pictures of candidates.
5. Passage of this bill has a popular democracy dimension. It increases the chances for election of challengers.¹ It's often difficult for a challenger to round up a sign erection crew. (*Quaere*: Is it easier for an incumbent to round up a sign erection crew?)
6. “Vote for me” signs in the roadway are not an effective route to election or reelection. At the hearing on this bill held on August 10 a self-identified political savant² instructed that no evidence suggests that highway signs are the cause of the election of anyone (not so for the converse, however!)

7. If nobody can do it; nobody has to. Political parties and candidates won't have to allocate any resources for highway signs. Under the current law there is a sort of "reverse chicken" mentality concerning highway signs—"I don't want to forswear highway signs when everyone else is putting them up. What if I lose!"
8. If this bill becomes law benefit it establishes a "Political Signs Non-Proliferation Zone," to benefit of everyone.
9. A candidate freed from the expense of highway signs could use means of campaigning more message oriented than the hackneyed "Vote for me" slogan adorning a sign composed of the picture and names of the candidate.
10. The Director of Public Works is relieved of a duty the performance of which although costly provides no long term benefit for the people.

Nothing is more powerful than an idea whose time has come.

In closing—I am 1,000% in favor of this bill.

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 138-34 (COR), as substituted by the Committee was returned to the Committee on Environment, Land, Agriculture and Procurement Reform for the requirement of a secondary public hearing. The Committee convened a public hearing on September 7, 2017 at 9:00am at *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets and published in the Guam Daily Post, a newspaper of general circulation, on August 30, 2017 (5-Day Notice) and again on September 5, 2017 (48-Hour Notice), fulfilling the Open Government Law requirement.

The public hearing was called-to-order at 9:00am.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada: Stated that this was a secondary hearing because substantial changes made to the bill. Called those who have signed up to testify and allowed for the sponsor to speak on the bill.

Senator Morrison: Senator Morrison thanked Chairman Ada for scheduling a second public hearing on Bill No. 138, as substituted. Senator Morrison explained that the revised version is simple – it proposes to prohibit political signs on public property. Moreover, the bill doesn't impact the placement of political signs on private property. Although it has been suggested that a repeal of the entire chapter would be adequate to prohibit political signs on government property, as another public law (P.L. 32-199) already authorizes private landowners to place political signs on their property, Senator Morrison believes it's necessary to maintain certain provisions of Section 61542 to include the definition of political signs; restrictions on posting of political signs; and, maintenance of political signs.

Thanked former Senator Robert Klitzkie for offering verbal and written testimony during the initial public hearing on Bill 138. He thanked Senator Klitzkie for his continued push to restrict campaign signs on public property – emphasizing the safety dimension of political signs, recalling an accident in Yigo a few years ago where a person was killed possibly due to another driver's visibility being obstructed by political signs as their vehicle exited an intersection.

Prohibiting signs on public property and public rights-of-way is a common policy across at least 29 other U.S. jurisdictions including the state of Hawaii, a similarly-situated jurisdiction with limited real estate and an economy supported by a strong visitor industry. Senator Morrison argued that while some may claim that the issue of political signs isn't a priority, he would suggest that aside from this being a matter of public safety, excessive and poorly maintained political signs have the potential to adversely affect Guam's image as a clean destination of choice.

Senator Morrison shared that he believes the measure, as substituted, is a serious step forward in our efforts to protect Guamanians whenever they're on our roadways and shoulders – while supporting the safety of road maintenance personnel and their equipment. He also informed the committee that a copy of Substitute Bill 138 was provided to the Legislative Legal Counsel for further review, and looks forward to working with everyone involved to strengthen the measure moving forward.

Former Senator Robert Klitzkie: Thanked the committee for the opportunity to share his thoughts on the substitute measure. He provided written testimony to the committee summarizing 10 reasons why he believes Bill 138, as substituted, should be passed by the legislature. Among his arguments include the potential for Guam's highways to be safer; political signs are eyesores and constitute visual pollution; political signs tend to mask the natural beauty of our island from our tourists; visual pollution is not attractive even if "beautified" with pictures of candidates; and, the passage of Bill 138 has a popular democracy dimension in that it increases the chances for election of challengers. Senator Klitzkie anticipates that a candidate freed from the expenses of highway signs could use his or her campaign resources for more message oriented activities. He also expects the Director of Public Works to be relieved of a duty the performance of which, although costly, provides no long-term benefit for the people.

Senator Morrison: Thanked Senator Klitzkie for continuing to push the legislature for many years to address the issue of political signs on public property. He also informed the committee that GVB's road maintenance contractor was able to verify the financial impact poorly regulated political signs have had on its operations during past election cycles.

Vice-Speaker Terlaje: Argued that the opposite may be true as campaigns are advantageous to new candidates when compared to incumbents. She also commented that campaign advertising can become very prohibitive for some candidates – as she's unsure about the extent to which social media can help candidates with name recognition and messaging. Vice-Speaker Terlaje briefly shared her concerns and difficulty in understanding how the legislature is able to move forward with the prohibition of campaign signs on public property – while entertaining another measure aimed at permitting commercial billboards.

Senator Klitzkie: Shared that when he first ran for public office he was told that he didn't have a chance coming from a very small family among other challenges. Despite putting up only a couple of small campaign signs (which was the hardest thing he did in his campaign), he came in 10th place during his first run for the Guam Legislature. Senator Klitzkie also pointed out that none of his signs ever included a picture of himself – reiterating his belief that candidates don't get elected based on political signs. To the Vice-Speaker's concern with respect to other legislation affecting commercial signage, Senator Klitzkie argued that aside from his objections to certain proposals affecting commercial signage, he believes there's a distinction between commercial and political signs as he's unaware of any campaign billboards in the past having blinking lights or similar features.

Before concluding this public hearing, Chairman Ada recommended that perhaps the measure should make clear that roadside waiving by candidates and political organizations wouldn't be affected.

The second public hearing on Substitute Bill No. 138-34 (COR), As Substituted by the Committee was subsequently adjourned.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. § 61542 of Chapter 61, Division 2, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended*, to read:

“§ 61542. Regulation of Political Signs.

~~Candidates for public office or other persons having an interest in an election~~ Private property owners may place political signs which advocate voting for or against candidates, or other matters to be considered by the electorate, ~~on government property~~ in accordance with 21GCA, § 61541(a)(5), § 61541 (b)(3), and § 61541(c)(3), and the following provisions:

(a) Definitions.

~~(1) —Candidate means a person seeking public office.~~

~~(12)~~ Government property means any tangible or real property held by the government of Guam.

1 ~~(3) Organization means any political organization or~~
2 ~~political action group advocating an issue in a special or general~~

Comments:

Enactment of Bill No. 138-34 (COR), as substituted by the Committee on Environment, Land, Agriculture, and Procurement Reform, entails a potential reduction in revenues to the Guam Highway Fund through the repeal of Permit Fees/Deposit for the posting of campaign signs. It is noted that governors, mayors, attorney generals, and public auditors serve a four-year term, and senators and Guam delegates serve a two-year term, not including positions for other public offices, included every election year. And information from the Guam Election Commission reflects that the number of candidates registered in the past two (2) elections are as follows: 120 for the 2016 (senatorial/ mayoral/ public auditor/ other), and 60 for 2014 (gubernatorial/ senatorial/ attorney general/ other). Assuming such numbers, respectively, for the upcoming two (2) elections, and that all such candidates apply at the Department of Public Works (DPW) to post campaign signs, then revenue to the Guam Highway Fund (GHF) is projected as follows: \$48,000 for 2018 (gubernatorial/ senatorial/ attorney general/ other), and \$96,000 for 2020 (senatorial/ mayoral/ public auditor/ other). DPW information reflects that the current deposit amounts for the posting of campaign signs have been for the most part refunded, as a result of compliance with regulations on the removal of the signs, making such impact minimal. However, assuming 5% of qualified candidates do *not* comply then the negative impact in revenue to the Guam Highway Fund is as follows:

Additionally, should there be political signs erected on public easements, the DPW will routinely take down such signs, the cost for which is factored into the annual operating budget for the department.
