

Dorian heads north after swiping NC

KITTY HAWK, N.C. (Reuters) -Hurricane Dorian briefly made landfall on the Outer Banks of North Carolina on Friday, hitting the beach-fringed barrier islands with powerful winds and battering waves days after reducing parts of the Bahamas to rubble.
The storm made landfall at Ca

The storm made landfall at Cape Hatteras about 9 a.m. with maximum sustained winds of 90 mph, according to the National Hurricane Center. That was far weaker than its slow, deadly tour through the Bahamas earlier in the week that caused at least 43 deaths, according to news media accounts late Friday, and likely many more.

By late afternoon, Dorian was moving away from the mid-Atlantic states and headed toward Canada where it was expected to bring hurricane-force winds to parts of Nova Scotia by Saturday evening, the National Hurricane Center said.

The storm surge inundated the Outer Banks' Ocracoke Island, cutting off power and submerging many homes and buildings, North Carolina Gov. Ray Cooper told reporters.

Floodwaters came halfway up to kitchen countertops and battered fences and boardwalks, according to images on social media. One island resident uploaded a video on social media showing people driving a speedboat down a flooded street.

"We estimate about 800 people remained on the island during the storm and have heard reports from residents who say the flooding there was catastrophic," Cooper said. "We're thankful not to have reports of serious injury or death since the storm arrived."

One resident in need of immediate medical attention was airlifted off

Ocracoke, and helicopters will fly in food and water, the governor added.

The Outer Banks are a picturesque series of narrow islands known for their beaches, lighthouses and natural beauty.

The Kitty Hawk area, on the northern end of the Outer Banks, emerged from the storm with little damage. Many houses near the ocean lost power on Friday, but houses on higher ground continued to have power and cable television.

Storm surge

Stacy and Ryan Marshall said their home, which is not oceanfront, came through unscathed. They drove to the beach on Friday afternoon to view the storm surge. "We got lucky, just lost a couple of boards on the fence," Stacy Marshall said.

South Carolina Gov. Henry McMaster held a news conference with smiling officials, saying that the storm had not been as bad as had been feared and floodwaters had ebbed in coastal areas.

Ryan, Booker temper attacks on Biden

MANCHESTER, N.H. (Tribune Two Democratic News Service) presidential hopefuls walked back their attacks on front-runner Joe Biden as they faced questions Saturday about their previous statements on the former vice president.

Rep. Tim Ryan of Ohio, who this week said he's lost faith in the front-runner's ability to beat Donald Trump, and New Jersey Sen. Cory Booker, who spent weeks criticizing Biden's record on race, both said their goal is to win back the White House.

"I have some concerns with a lot of the candidates," Ryan said at the New Hampshire state Democratic Convention in Manchester. "It was a comment that I made and I'm not backtracking from it; it is a concern you're hearing from a lot of people."

But Ryan, who has languished in the low single digits in polls and failed to qualify for the third debate next week, said to reporters at the event that he isn't concerned about Biden's age, after telling Bloomberg on Thursday that he doesn't have faith that a "declining" Biden can defeat Trump.

When pressed to explain, Ryan cited "a lack of clarity" when Biden articulates his positions. Asked about whether such attacks threaten Democratic unity, Ryan said the party has a common goal.

"There is a very unifying force in this world for Democrats and he is the current occupant of the White House," Ryan said.

In his call for unity in Manchester, Bookerofferedupaveiledswipeagainst rival Bernie Sanders of Vermont.

"We Democrats have to be careful." Booker said in prepared remarks. "I don't care who our nominee is, but we cannot tolerate Democrats who

turn against other Democrats and try to tear us down."

Booker's remarks were seen as directed at Sanders, who refused to wholeheartedly back Hillary Clinton after she won the nomination in 2016.

Booker, who trails the top-tier candidates at 2.5% in a recent average of polls by RealClearPolitics, was asked later by reporters to explain his call for unity after repeatedly faulting Biden on race issues, including calling him "an architect of mass incarcera tion" for working on the 1994 toughon-crime legislation.

"I think pointing out differences is OK," Booker said. "I'm talking about what we've seen in the past election where you had Democrats literally, even after the primary was over, trying to tear down the nominee of our party."

Sanders was widely criticized by Democrats in 2016 for not being sufficiently supportive of Clinton after she won the nomination. While Sanders eventually backed her, aides and allies complained his tone was begrudging and didn't help bring his supporters on board.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

I really am here to ask the 35th Legislature for your support and vote to serve on the Guam Banking and Insurance board. Si Yu'os ma'ase'.

Art Ilagan, Former Director, Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation: Good morning Senators my name is Art Ilagan. I was the former director of Rev and Tax and I was the former Insurance and Banking commissioner at Rev and Tax. I am here also as a friend of Mike. I've known Mike since he was a little kid. I've known him through both his grandparents, Mr. Pete Sgro, he was a very successful businessperson and also Mr. Frank Taitano who I became very close to as we got older, of course passed away. I know Mike is being nominated for a position that's not a banker, insurance person, an attorney. He's being nominated as a private citizen, person from the business sector that he will fulfill. I think there are like nine positions and one of them is a private person that he will fulfill. Mike is of course from the private sector. I knew him from both his parents, Tony and Ann Sgro. Ann and I, even Tony were Cathedral Grade students when we were younger. I also know Mike to be an athlete.

I see in his face when he played basketball, he had that fierce intense ball player that wanted to win. He was also a classmate of my son, so I got to know him more because of my son Joe, who was also a basketball player. Mike and his class, 2006, have won seven championships of the Father Duenas Alumni Association which tied with the class of 81'. I believe they are going to be the championship holders of the most alumni class that won the tournament at Father Duenas. It takes a lot to win seven games, I see that in their players, I saw that in Mike. I think Mike would bring his qualities to help with the regulation of the insurance and banking board. Mike is a very successful manager of the fitness center, Paradise Fitness, which I go to and hopefully the government and the new insurance companies would continue with a very successful GovGuam plan for GovGuam employees, to make sure that we are fit and not sickly in living our lives. The gym has been very helpful for me. I've had, I've gained weight, I've lost weight but going to the gym the last three years has kind of made me maintain my health. I think without the gym I would be probably way overweight. I have a lot of problems with sugar and weight and fat and all that stuff. I hope the Legislature proceeds and confirms Mike's nomination. Thank you.

Nathan Taimanglo: Thank you, Senator Flores and other members of the Legislature present. My name is Nathan Taimanglo, I currently serve as the Executive Vice President and Chief Human Resources Officer of Docomo Pacific. I'm here to submit my testimony in support of Mike. I've

known Mike pretty much my whole life. On a personal level he's no doubt had my back for much of growing up. I've also worked with him on a professional level for the last few years. The very fact that he came back to Guam, he wanted to come back and contribute back to the island is really a testimony to his willingness to be home and to support the island that raised him. He's also raising a family, a new family now and no doubt he has and possesses that's temperament, the knowledge, the know-how to really contribute to the Banking and Insurance Board. I remember a few months back Mike was asking me questions around which board do you think he can contribute to. I was like you know take your pick. I think it's really just a matter of you, who wanted to step in and serve. No doubt he would be a contributing member to the board. Even just this morning we were talking about, he actually read through all the minutes of the board from the past sessions that were that were online. He's done his homework and he's ready and willing to step up. I think just from a personal perspective he also possesses the integrity needed to have that sort of focus with a board of course that does really important work for Guam. In closing, I think with all that said, I think Mike also is one of the most driven people I know. Art spoke earlier about the seven championships that our class has won. Mike was a key part of that. He's pretty much one of the centers of that. He's quite humble and in terms of my respect for him he's no doubt one of the few people I trust. I think it speaks volumes of his character and I look forward to your confirmation of him. Thank you.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you, Mr. Taimanglo. I just want to go back to some of the duties of the board members and Commissioner. This is for the public to hear. The powers and duties of the board and Commissioner include:

- To regulate its own procedures and practices in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act.
- To implement by regulation not inconsistent with law any provision of this title and to define any term not defined in this title as may be reasonably necessary or appropriate for the Administration of this title and other laws of Guam relating to banking and insurance.
- To affirm reverse or stay the enforcement of any order or ruling of the Commissioner.
- To establish such rules and regulations in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act as may be necessary for the operation and management of banks.
- The board may recommend a removal of a director, trustee, officer and or employee of a national or state bank.
- The members of the board shall have access to any record of the division with reference to banking and insurance matters.
- It can also examine any person under oath in connection with any subject relating to a duty imposed upon or a power invested in the Commissioner or the board.
- These powers shall be enforced by the Superior Court of Guam.
- The board shall continuously review the provisions of this title and other laws regulating banking and insurance in Guam and may from time to time make recommendations for changes therein to *I Maga'laga* and *I Liheslatura* in the commissioner's annual report.

Having said this, being a member on the board, that's nominated, that is outside the banking and insurance industry, do you feel that there's anything in your capacity that would limit you from carrying out these duties?

Mr. Sgro: No, Senator Perez, thanks for the question. There definitely isn't anything at the moment.

Chairperson Perez: When you say at the moment, what is, can you explain that?

Mr. Sgro: As of right now, after reviewing like the minutes... it's to my understanding after reading the law and thank you for taking the time last week to sit down with us and explain that I believe we meet quarterly and the existing Chairwoman and Commissioner, I believe is Ms. Shimizu. There's nine members that are going to be appointed. I'll make time to make sure I'm available and willing and able to contribute in any way possible.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you. In regard to, in the case that there is a member that has been called to question in the banking and insurance industry, what are some of... Have you been in any situation where you had to make a call in that regards, if there's a conflict or a question regarding their capability or in violation of any of the laws?

Mr. Sgro: To answer your question, as far as taking conflicts, I don't take conflicts lightly. My integrity and evaluating the situation at hand and being a manager, you always have to make complex decisions. Making sure we have a clear overview of the situation and define all the terms within what's happening. I think that's very crucial in making the decision. I don't know if I answered the question or if I understood the question correctly.

Chairperson Perez: Can you just expound on that.

Mr. Sgro: What was the question again? Sorry I just want to make sure.

Chairperson Perez: When you're dealing with let's say a member in the banking and insurance industry and there's a question as regards to their conduct or whether they violated any laws or procedures. Have you been in situations that are similar to this where you had to make such a determination on their continuation as a member or a practicing member within the industry?

Mr. Sgro: I've never experienced that firsthand in the private sector dealing in the service industry, in the fitness industry, but if I were supposed to encounter this issue and problem, I would not take it lightly. I would definitely voice my concern with the team prior to making any rational decision moving forward.

Chairperson Perez: How would you base your determination?

Mr. Sgro: Well, first I would make sure I have all the facts in front of me and make sure we have all the resources at hand to make that decision together collectively.

Chairperson Perez: Being not part of the industry, what advantages do you think that holds or disadvantages?

Mr. Sgro: I really think it just gives a different set of eyes. Being born and raised on Guam but working in the private sector, I really realized that the government does play a crucial role in our

economy. Things take time when it comes to the government. That's something that I hope to contribute to make things more efficient and enhance and enforce those laws and making sure it's clear in our transparency and communicating those terms to the people.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you, and regards to conflict of interest. How do you determine a conflict of interest, if it exists?

Mr. Sgro: Right now, I don't believe there is any conflict of interest in my case as I'm non industry. As of right now there is no conflict of interest for me but moving forward if there was one, I'll definitely recur myself from that situation.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you. I would like to, at this time, recognize Senator Castro and Senator Kelly Marsh Taitano, who has joined me here today.

Mr. Sgro: Good morning, Senator Castro and Senator.

Chairperson Perez: I would like to open the floor to my colleagues for questions. Senator Telo Taitague.

Senator Taitague: Thank you, Madam Chair for the opportunity to speak. Michael, I too like Art have known you since you were very young. The first thing I wanted to say, I think Nathan hit it on the nose, when he mentioned you coming back home to contribute to the island. Someone in your capacity could easily live in the States and have a good time back there and put all your knowledge and everything to that community back there in the States like Hawaii. Hawaii is a beautiful place to live and I know you enjoyed it back there, going to school there in Hawaii. I really want to thank you for coming back. It's important that we keep this young youth knowledge here on this island. We're losing so much of it.

First, I want to thank you for doing that and second I want to thank you for stepping up to the plate, contributing your time to our community to serve on this board. Again, you're an athlete, there's so many things you can do after work and have a good time with, but I really appreciate you, it's a reflection. Your parents are, I know your parents. They're the same kind of people who contribute to the community and do what they can to help our island. Michael, even though you don't have the experience in banking I think it's what's needed on a board, a different perspective. Not somebody who's jaded by banking systems and the status quo. What you're going to bring to this table is new ideas, fresh ideas, a different eyes on banking. I'm sure you're going to study as much as you can, the process but at the same time bringing some good ideas to the industry. The only thing I have is, actually my colleague asked if you're going to be able to meet all the meetings and you did answer that but in the event that you are not can you promise us that if you can't make the meetings that you will let the Chairman know so that they can fill this vacancy as soon as possible.

Mr. Sgro: Yes, of course, Senator.

Senator Taitague: Have you attended any of the meetings right now currently at the with the banking board?

Mr. Sgro: No, I haven't, I believe they meet quarterly. The last meeting according to the minutes was in April.

Senator Taitague: You have read the minutes?

Mr. Sgro: Yeah, I reviewed the minutes right when I was appointed to the board. I wanted to make sure I did my research and I know what I'm getting myself into.

Senator Taitague: My last question, Michael to you is why this board? I'm pretty sure you can probably if you'd like to go on any other board to be on but why do you want to be on this board?

Mr. Sgro: Like Nate mentioned and I mentioned it to Senator Perez, being in the service industry for this long I've always had a passion to just serve people and help people. To serve on any board to be honest, I could bring a lot of fresh ideas like you mentioned but as far as banking and insurance go, every business works with banks and insurances but this specific board after reading the minutes and understanding what their role is for the office and the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance I'm very excited because we play a crucial role for the economy. I just want to make things more efficient and making them more detail-oriented to move forward.

Senator Taitague: Well, I wish you the best of luck and you have my full support. Thank you.

Senator Moylan: Thank you, Madam Chairman. Mr. Sgro, congratulations on your nomination. I'm looking forward to seeing great things coming from you and as expressed by your two folks that came to testify on your behalf, Mr. Ilagan and Mr. Taimanglo, obviously your character is excellent and you're a driven man. That's a good thing. I'm most impressed by your business background and your entrepreneurship. I think it's important that our committee members do have that background to bring to the table and the fresh eyes and the excitement I believe that you have. I'm looking forward, very forward to seeing your name on our next upcoming session so we can complete the nomination and you can get to work for the people of Guam. Congratulations, sir.

Senator Castro: Thank you, Madam Chair. Thank you for accepting the nomination Mr. Sgro. I have a chance to look through your resume, your obviously an educated young man, you're an experienced manager and just what I thought your basketball skills are superior. I saw you at the FD alumni. I'm very pleased to know that you've been appointed. I'm impressed with the fact that the appointing authority saw it fit to get someone who's lay individual or I think if I heard you correctly who said that you're not from the industry. I think that's a unique perspective as the prior speaker brought out. You're also flanked by two people I highly respect, someone in the HR field and someone who's a finance and taxation expert. With them flanking you and offering testimony in support of the nomination, my confidence rests with you. Congratulations and thank you again, Mr. Sgro.

Senator Marsh (Taitano): *Manana si yu'os*. My reflections or my comments are similar to those that have been expressed. I wasn't here to hear all the testimony, but it was able to read through some of the written testimony that was provided. As was mentioned before me, to hear those that have a lengthy relationship with that industry having them supporting you in this position, understanding what you would be able to bring as somebody who is representing the private

industry, that means a lot and that carries a lot of weight. That's very important for us to be able to hear and for us to be able to consider. Some of the things that they were mentioning is that you have a good instinct, you've really developed a lot of skills in running the fitness gyms that you have. That really speaks well to your ability to learn quickly and learn what's needed and bring all of that to the table in the boards. As was mentioned that means a lot to us and we agree that they spell out you being qualified and good asset for the board. Si Yu'os ma'åse'.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you, Mr. Sgro for accepting this executive nomination. I do look forward to seeing the new perspective that you bring to the Banking Commission and insurance Commission. I think it's important knowing that you were appointed in view that you are not part of the industry, I think that's an important role, you play an important role to kind of anchor the commission in the community. I think it's important to see that with your background in in sports and the excellence that you achieved there, I think some of the skills that you've learned on the field can be applied in the boardroom. I'm also look forward to seeing that the laws that you, that we have in place and with your fresh perspective that perhaps are ways that we can make it more efficient as well as upholding the laws. I think that's what's really critical as a board member is making those determinations where there's conflict of interest and applying it and recusing yourself if necessary. It is a great responsibility and so again thank you for accepting this nomination. Thank you so much. Thank you for everybody who have come here and today providing testimony on Mr. Sgro's behalf. Si Yu'os ma'āse'.

Chairperson Perez then adjourned the confirmation hearing for Mr. Michael A. Sgro.
