

As Chair of the Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners (GBAHE), I have been tasked to come before you and distinguished members of your Committee, today, to render support for **Bill 257**. The Subject Bill was discussed at the GBAHE's meeting of February 7, 2020 and the Board voted its full support to rectify the current situation.

Under the current statue of 10 GCA, Chapter 12, Article 18, Speech-Language Pathology (SLP) Assistant Licensure Application are required to show a "Supervisory" Form attested and signed by his/her SLP Supervisor before a license can be issued.

This Subject Bill will give authority to the GBAHE to issue a license to SLP Assistant applicant in the absence of a Supervisor's Form. However, the new licensee cannot provide services to a patient or client until he/she has submitted to the GBAHE the required Supervisory Form. The SLP Supervisors are in fact responsible for overseeing the work performance of the SLP Assistants.

I'd like to now acknowledge the presence of my colleagues, beginning with the Legislative Secretary Senator Amanda Shelton, Senator Louise Muña and Senator Telo Taitague. Thank you, colleagues, for being here today. So I'd asked those who have signed up to testify on Bill 257-35, the first bill, to please have a seat at the table, Sibyl Crisostomo and Dr. Mamie Balajadia.

And this bill was introduced by myself so I'm going to briefly introduce it. In 1998, the Allied Health Practice Act became Public Law 24-329. 19 years later, in 2017, Public Law 34-48 amended Article 18 of the Allied Health Practice Act with the intent to enact amendments, revisions and additions developed by the Marianas Alliance of Speech-Language Hearing Professionals to update and better assist the children and adults of Guam with speech, language and hearing difficulties.

Bill 257-35 was introduced at the request of Sibyl Crisostomo, Speech-Language Pathologist representative on the Guam Board of Allied Health, to address a gap in public law 34-48, which involved recent Speech-Language Pathology graduates at the Bachelor's and Master's Level being denied licensure due to the lack of a signed Supervisor Form required to be submitted within three working days of application or renewal pursuant to Public Law 34-48 and only available to those already employed.

So, the current law, as it is written, acts as a barrier for new graduates who are unemployed. Graduates are unable to gain employment because of the lack of licensure and are unable to obtain licensure because of the lack of supervisor to sign the Supervisor Form required by Public Law 34-48. So, the bill addressed seeks to

address this gap and to ensure that all Speech-Language Pathology Assistant graduates are given the opportunity to obtain licensure and employment through a brief window that would allow them to turn in supervisor forms after gaining employment.

I humbly ask for the support of my colleagues to ensure this necessary care for children and adults of Guam with speech, language and hearing difficulties is readily available in our community. And with that I will call on Sybil Crisostomo. Please...just press that button whenever you're going to speak. Thank you very much.

#### Sibyl Crisostomo:

Thank you very much, Senator Terlaje. And I wanted to thank you very much for rewording this and...so succinctly. It's right on the button and it really takes care of the problem, the Catch-22. So, we are in full support of the wording of it and thank you again.

#### Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you. May I ask...could you just give us a little bit about your background?

#### Sibyl Crisostomo:

How far back do you want me to go?

#### Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

We just want to know your professional—you're the one who brought this to my attention so maybe just for the record, your professional background.

I came to Guam in 1976 as a...I came to do my CFY year in speech pathology. And I finished that and I've been here ever since and I've worked almost every agency and right now, I'm working at GRMC as a Swallow Specialist under the Speech-Language Pathology License. I have a specialty in swallowing.

#### Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Thank you very much. And Dr. Balajadia. Oh, please press the....

Is it Dr. Crisostomo?

#### Sibyl Crisostomo:

No, I have my Master's.

#### Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Okay, all right. So, Ms. Crisostomo, you can turn your microphone off. And Dr. Balajadia?

#### Dr. Mamie Balajadia:

Thank you Senator Terlaje, Senator Shelton, Senator Muña and Senator Taitague. I have prepared for you, in front of you the testimony on this subject bill. So, I am Mamie Balajadia. Currently, I am the chair of the Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners. I represent Clinical Psychology on the Board.

Thank you very much Dr. Balajadia and Chairperson of the Guam Board of Allied Health.

We also received a written testimony prior to the hearing from Andre Pierre' Artero, Speech-Language Pathologist at the Guam Department of Education, Division of Special Education.

And so, he's pointed out a couple of notes: it should be noted that the SLA's should not be considered licensed but should be deemed as registered. They did not earn the credentials. Number two, I can see that the dilemma where an applicant can't get a job without the GBAHE registration but can't get registered without a supervisor.

Please make note that the supervising SLP should have to work at the same agency division as the applicant. And the third one is with regard to GDOE and SLA supervision. SLA is...what is SLA?

#### Sibyl Crisostomo:

Speech-Language Pathology Assistant, either bachelor or master level, which is the one we're talking about here.

#### Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

All right. With regard to GDOE and SLA supervision, GDOE does not have a supervisor position. They do not assign supervisors. They do not compensate for supervision. Those of us who do supervise our co-workers are doing so because if we do not then they can't work.

Needless to say, it can be risky to our licensure should the SLA do something irregular or unprofessional. It is already a point of contention with some employees and a stress on workplace harmony. Thank you for your time and...

#### Sibyl Crisostomo:

May I comment?

#### Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

Yes, please.

#### Sibyl Crisostomo:

Before the law was changed, licensing bachelor/master levels Speech-Language Pathology Assistants, they always to be supervised. It was in the law prior to that that they had to have a supervisory form and somebody' supervising them. The supervisor, it was a voluntary thing.

The job cannot require them to supervise and it says that in the law. So, the law of change just made the licensure part for the SLA's intact and just gave them a license to do that; plus, again, they needed the supervisory form. So, I'm a little confused about Andre's statement and...they always had to have a supervisor and now they're licensed and still need to have a supervisor.

#### Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:

All right. Yeah. In my reading, he does acknowledge that but just pointing out that GDOE is not recognizing them formerly as supervisors and maybe just giving us a hint that we should address that.

Oh, then that's a departmental thing, not a law thing. Yes, I understand now what he is saying.

All right. Okay, so questions from my colleagues. Senator Taitague?

Thank you, Madam Chair. Good evening, everyone. Thank you so much for being here and I just have a question. You know, this Speech-Language Pathology...do they provide this kind of schooling at any of our facilities here at UOG or GCC for this type of career?

#### Sibyl Crisostomo:

We've had two programs that CEDDERS- UOG and Santa Jose have done a conglomeration for the master level program and ones already done. And we gained many master level speech pathologists.

And now, a second program through San Jose for the epics—that they call it the epics students and they are acquiring all their education for their master's program and then they have to pass their test and then they have to do their clinical fellowship year.

And the advantage of this is, they're being trained on island. And the advantage of it before was they stayed on island and they were hired on island through these students, which was really nice. It's a good program.

#### Senator Telo Taitague:

Okay, I see. And how hard is it to fill positions for this type of...

#### Sibyl Crisostomo:

If we didn't have that—well, we're gonna have 16 students if they graduate from this new program—if we didn't have that, we have to recruit people from off island. Some people aren't as adventuresome as I was in 1976 to come to Guam as they are now.

So, it's hard it's hard—even, you know, physical therapists, occupational therapists— it's hard to attract people to come out here to work.

#### Senator Telo Taitague:

So, we have about 16 right now in the program?

#### Sibyl Crisostomo:

Yes, and hopefully, they can all graduate and all be fully independent speechlanguage pathologists.

#### Senator Telo Taitague:

Okay, well, thank you. I see you're so excited about this position and it really gives good heart to me knowing that—you know, it sounds like you're a great pioneer for this too, as well, to get this program on Guam so it'd be avail to other people who are interested in the field.

And we're so thankful to San Jose and CEDDERS for setting it all up again.

Well, they can be hired at a hospital. So, we have two hospitals now. They could start their own private practice. They can be hired by DOE Special Ed. They could be hired at a clinic. You know, so I would think they would have positions available.

Wonderful and then, of course, from there we can keep growing the program.

#### Sibyl Crisostomo:

Yes.

Okay.

Yes, I don't know if they're gonna start another one but at least we get 16 more.

Thank you, both, very much. So, just for the record, the BBMR Fiscal Impact Note provides that the provision in the proposed legislation is administrative in nature, imposes no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.

All right, and it's passed legal muster from our legal review pretty much. So, hopefully with the support of my colleagues this bill can be passed. We can get them working, these graduates.

- Some concerns were raised by a Guam Department of Education Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP), Andre Artero, relative to the status of Speech-Language Pathology Assistants (SLAs) while in the process of waiting for applications, providing that a supervising SLP should be employed at the same agency and division as the applicant and pointing out that GDOE does not have SLP supervisor positions.
- Bill 257-35 was amended to adopt stylistic suggestions from the Guam Legislature's Legal Bureau.
