Buenas yan Hafa Adai! I am submitting this written testimony in regard to Bill 216-35, "an act to add a new (5) to (m) of Chapter V, in Public Law 35-36, relative to establishing the rate of stipend for Guam Police Department Civilian Volunteer Police Reservists."

Public Law 35-36, enacted on September 4, 2019, "An act making appropriations for the operations of the Executive, Legislative, and Judicial branches of the Government of Guam for fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, making other appropriations, and establishing miscellaneous and administrative provisions," did not include an increase in the stipend allocated for the police reservists. Previous to the FY2020 Budget Act, funding support for Reservists during FY2019 by Public Law 34-115, appropriated \$100,000.00 for the sole purpose of paying allowances to the members of the Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve.

The Guam Police Department projected an increase to CVPR stipends, from \$250.00 to \$500.00, and included this projection in the Executive Budget Request for Fiscal Year 2020, which we defended on June 14, 2019. Currently the FY2020 Budget Act allows for GPD to allocate \$129,000.00 which will fund twenty three (23) reservists for the remainder

of FY2020, from November 2019 through September 2020. A recent assessment of the GPD Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve Program provides that twenty (20) reservists report for duty enough to receive a stipend on a monthly basis. GPD's projections to fund the increase from \$250.00 to \$500.00 will expend \$110,000.00 for the remaining eleven (11) months of FY2020 should Bill 216 pass into law and in compliance with Section 3, become effective upon enactment.

GPD expects an increased interest by qualified candidates to join the CVPR Program as well as increased activity by those reservists currently sworn which will impact the FY2020 allocated funding. Funding that was appropriated to GPD by Public Law 34-115 for CVPR allowances in FY2019 retains \$70,250.00 in unexpended funds. Continuing the expenditure of these funds will support the increased stipends proposed by this Bill.

Therefore, on behalf of the Guam Police Department we are in support of this bill and respectfully request for the recommendation mentioned herein, be considered and included in Bill 216-35.

Ladies and gentlemen on the bill listen your finest an intent blessed one finds that the Guam business to the civilian volunteer places your program that augments the work of the men and women in blue who survive and community daily, providing support whenever a call for help is made and since inception of this Reserve Program to provide thousands of service hours and Volunteer protection of life and property by preventing crime enforcing laws of intent order for all citizens let's say the *Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that administrative oversight of occurred when language in fiscal year 2020 budgets relative to establish the rate of stipend for Guam Police Department civilian volunteer police reservists was not included therefore, his intent of this legislature was to ensure that he, civilian ones are a comfort time and effort they exerted ensuring the safety and security of our island where commensurate stipend for their contribution adding the new section 5 m of Chapter 5 and Public Law 35-36 would read the Guam Police Department's Civilian Volunteer Reservists Stipend. Guam Police Department shall calm sea eastbound reserving the civilian boundary Reserve Program, who filled the requirement for such monthly duty the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for that month effective October 1st 2020.

Ladies and gentlemen this were discussed in our budget hearing and like I stated earlier it was a administrative oversight and this is just to add that. There being nobody from The Guam Police Department. I did speak to the chief and he actually had advised me of that

oversight and that's why this bill was introduced. They have the funding they're willing to pay it's just ahead, he was surprised it wasn't included in the budget but they are aware that was the intent of how the funding was provided if I have any Senators, my colleagues here would like to comment on the bill and then move on. We'll start with ladies first Senator Telo.

Senator Telo Taitague: Thank You Mr. chair and you know, thank you for this Bill Mr. Chair but I'm very disappointed that we don't have anyone here from GPD to testify in favor of this bill and I have to question whether it's really needed at all at this time, since they're not here today and in the event and the question is to you Mr. Chair, the author of the bill is there a written testimony at least they provided?

Chairman Joe S. San Agustin: Yes, there is you should have had in your packet it was from the chief.

Senator Telo Taitague: Okay, then that being said Mr. Chair with that written testimony yes, I see it, it is from the Chief and he does say that they do have them yep three reservists and therefore on the police part. We are in support of this bill and respectfully request a recommendation mention here and be considered so it looks like there are some amendments that also be included based on their testimony so I thank you for the opportunity to make a comment on this for the listening audience with regards to this that we do have testimony they are in support but they also recommends made some recommendations in their testimony. Thank you, Mr. Chair for the opportunity.

Chairman Joe S. San Agustin: Thank you Senator, Senator Will.

Senator William M. Castro: A Mr. Chairman, thank you so much for the opportunity forgive me if I'm not clear, I'm uh under the weather but I want to take advantage of this opportunity since there's no one really here in the audience Mr. Chairman, so just some questions points of clarification for you. First of all, I support the measure so thank you for taking this up. My question for you, Mr. Chairman is there already statutory language that has been changed in the Guam Code so I'm assuming you're already changed we had already changed it in the Budget Act from 250 to 500?

Chairman Joe S. San Agustin: It would, we hadn't changed we just administrative oversight we didn't put the number of 500 per month that was the missing.

Senator William M. Castro: Got you.

Chairman Joe S. San Agustin: On the budget.

Senator William M. Castro: Okay so that's one, thank you second, and maybe this would mitigate any need for further debate on the floor so that I can rally behind you in full support of the measure so I'll take this opportunity again. Do we have, would you Mr. Chairman have an idea what the impact is of the civilian volunteer police reserve? The impact most of them

have actually asked why their stipend hasn't gone up and we've had entertained that we will address that issue.

Chairman Joe S. San Agustin: Many of them are currently also reservists at other agencies and they're getting paid 500 and they want to actually do more duty with the police department but because of the stipend it became a money issue.

Senator William M. Castro: And again Mr. Chairman, we can probably take this up in another time since the oversight chairs here but to clarify my question would be and again I support the concept as I support a concept of a community base and be Supplemental Fire Department force but my question is with this in the books the civilian volunteer police reserve. My question is what has been the impact of such a program for example eczema and you're being a former police officer as well Mr. Chairman. Do we see more of these types of uniformed persons in the streets during let's say seasonal events? Do they respond more effectively? After certain times so that we can provide the necessary rest for full-time police officers and again I'm just questioning for my benefit and maybe the listening audience you might already know this with this type of supplemental police force. What has been the impact upon the community?

Chairman Joe S. San Agustin: Well just a reminder for all my colleagues and for the people of Guam, that are listening, the civilian the civilian force, the civilian bond ship reserves have been augmenting the Guam Police Department since the 70s. The numbers have increased they have their play role major roles in our community and they're part of the community and that's one of the beauties because even Senator Moylan has been trying to push for the Community Police pretty much like a like an augment to the police department at the community level. Well this is an augment from the community level and they have been providing a major impact to the police department.

Senator William M. Castro: Thank you Mr. Chair and then again, I like to take it up at another time so I can learn more about that just to kind of bring me up to speed. I know my staff has drafted legislation that I don't want to go into but it gives greater control at the municipal level for community-based policing also I hope with the same vigor Mr. Chairman that you and my colleagues and the oversight chair would embrace community policing by way of technology and these distributed forms of technology. I know I've had multiple conversations with the administration as well as with members of my colleagues here on the need to address community policing from an innovative perspective that makes good use of affordable technology specifically as coordinated through the Fusion Center and the Department of Homeland Security so with that said Mr. Chairman thank you so much and I will follow up and make appointment with your team and Senator "Pedro" Terlaje, thank you.

Chairman Joe S. San Agustin: I like to also recognizes my colleagues that have joined us Senator "Pedro" Terlaje and Senator Therese M. Terlaje, Senator Terlaje, Senator do you have any Senator "Pedro" Terlaje, do you have any comments for this bill, not this time Senator Moylan, do you have any? No comments and Senator Therese Terlaje do you have any comments?

Senator Therese M. Terlaje: I just said I guess according to the Guam Police Department's written testimony because they're not here right now they've said that they are currently compensating them at \$500 they said they project it for 2020.

Chairman Joe S. San Agustin: Only because the administrative oversight. We didn't put the dollar amount 500 and that's what the chief brought up so they've been paying them 250 which they've been wanting to pay them. The five on it all right it is budgeted.

Senator Therese M. Terlaje: They budgeted it and they just want it a technical amendment to the law.

Chairman Joe S. San Agustin: That's correct.

Senator Therese M. Terlaje: Okay, thank you mister chair.

Chairman Joe S. San Agustin: Okay there being no other questions this will conclude the hearing on Bill 216-35 (COR). The Committee will continue to receive testimonies for the next few days. 1/Legislative Bill No. 216-35 (COR) seeks to add a new (5) to (m) of Chapter V of Public Law 35-36, relative to establishing stipend rates for the Guam Police Departments (GPD) Civilian Volunteer Police Reservists (CVPR). The legislation, if passed, will authorize the GPD to compensate each volunteer serving in the CVPR program who fulfills the requirements for each month's duty the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) for that month. GPD has indicated that it budgeted for the program and that an assessment will be made to ensure adequate funding is available within appropriated funding levels. GPD also stated that there may be an increased interest by qualified candidates to join the CVPR program. It should be noted, §66104.1 of Chapter 66, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, authorizes a stipend of \$250 per month for each CVPR's. The current legislation would increase the stipend amount by 100% (from \$250 to \$500). Analyst notes, that GPD budgeted a total of \$120,000 for the CVPR program. The budgeted amount would cover the \$500 stipend for a total of twenty (20) CVPR each month for fiscal year 2020. Although it is not anticipated there will be an additional cost impact if the proposed legislation were to be passed, with the increase to the stipends, there may be a fiscal impact due to the increase of interest by qualified candidates.

Pursuant to the Standing Rules of the 35th Guam Legislature, the Committee on Appropriations and/or the Office of Finance and Budget (OFB) shall determine in writing if the funding source cited in Appropriation or Authorization for Appropriations bills are sufficient.

The Office has received Bill No. 216-35 (COR), AN ACT TO ADD A NEW (5) TO (m) OF CHAPTER V, IN PUBLIC LAW 35-36, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE RATE OF STIPEND FOR GUAM POLICE DEPARTMENT CIVILIAN VOLUNTEER POLICE RESERVISTS.

The proposed Bill seeks to establish the stipends for the Guam Police Department Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve (CVPR) Stipends at \$500.00 for fulfilling the requirements for each month's duty in FY 2020. While there is an existing law, § 66104.1, Chapter 66, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated, which specifies that members of the Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve who contributes a minimum of forty-two hours or more per month shall receive \$250 per month, the intent of this Bill is to augment the amount to \$500.

As part of GPD's FY 2020 Budget request, \$120,000 was requested for CVPR stipends. Based on the \$500 per month requirement proposed by Bill 216-35 (COR), GPD can compensate up to 20 members of the CVPR each month in FY 2020.
