Comment on Legislative Bill No. 164-35 (COR)

Section 1 of this proposed legislation seeks to add a new § 181004 to Article 10, Chapter 18, Division 2, Title 22, Guam Code Annotated. Under this Article 10 titled "Health Insurance Coverage; Screenings", this new subsection defines the process and importance of Lung Cancer Screening; the different methods of lung cancer detection; the benefits of detection and early treatment; the harms of detection and early intervention and treatment; and explains the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) assessment.

The Bureau notes that the proposed bill's intent is to formally adopt the recommendations of the USPSTF for lung cancer screening. Additionally, the Bureau further notes the proposed legislation's intent to having every policy of health insurance issued or renewed to a resident of Guam on or after January 1, 2020 and the Medically Indigent Program to provide coverage for annual lung cancer screening with low-dose computed tomography (LDCT) in adults with the conditions defined in § 181004(b) of the proposed bill. However, absent any additional information in reference to subjecting additional coverage for health insurance companies to anticipate upon the enacting of this proposed bill, the Bureau is unable to determine an approximate financial impact at this time.
