1/ Legislative Bill No. 177-35 (COR) seeks to repeal Section 5 of Public Law No. 33-186 and Article 6, Chapter 8, Title 4, of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to the Guam Retirement Security Plan (GRSP). The Legislation, if passed, would repeal Public Law No. 33-186 which would uncodify Article 6, Chapter 8, Title 4, from the Guam Code Annotated retroactively to January 1, 2018. Although the intent of the Bill appears administrative in nature, the Bureau notes that P.L. 34-116 appropriated \$500,000 to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund (GGRF) for the GRSP. However, GGRF passed a Resolution No. 2017-05 which stated, in part, that absent a continuing fund source, it could not effectuate the GRSP and would not be utilizing the appropriation made for the GRSP. Because the funds were not being utilized, P.L. 35-7 and P.L. 35-2 de-appropriated \$498,536 from the GRSP and re-appropriated \$298,536 to the Guam Election Commission and \$200,000 to the Guam Police Department, respectively. Thus, the current revised appropriation for the GRSP is \$1,464. If the measure were to pass, the \$1,464 in available funds could be re-appropriated.
