### Notes:

1/: The proposed legislation intends to add §72110 to Chapter 72, Title 10 Guam Code Annotated relative to establishing and implementing a Rip Current and Hiking Safety Awareness Program and Outreach Plan ("Plan") to educate swimmers, hikers, visitors, and the general public on the hazards of rip currents and hiking on Guam. The Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) shall be responsible for developing and effectuating the Plan and may be authorized to utilize pamphlets, brochures, posters, advertisements in mass media, and any other appropriate media to bolster general public awareness. §72110(b) of the proposed legislation states that DPR shall develop the plan no later than ninety (90) days from enactment.

The Bureau anticipates the costs associated with administering the Plan to be absorbed by the operating budget of the DPR. However, absent additional information from the department as well as the Plan not being established to date, the Bureau is unable to determine an approximate fiscal impact at this time.
