Notes:

The proposed legislation intends to amend pertinent sections of Title 3 of the Guam Code Annofated (3 GCA) relative to independent candidates seeking to run for a partisan elected office. Further, the proposed legislation seeks to create a level playing field for independent candidates by being treated in the same manner as other candidates who so choose to affiliate themselves with a recognized political party.

While the proposed legislation does not directly pose a fiscal impact to the Government of Guam due to the administrative nature of the sections, an indirect impact may be expected should a runoff election occur due to the proposed changes to the Guam election laws. Per the GEC, the probability of one gubernatorial team obtaining the majority vote (50% + 1) is lessened should there be three (3) nominations allowed into the General Election. In such an event where not one team garners 50% + 1, the teams with the top two (2) highest votes will enter into a runoff election, which the GEC estimates to be \$300,000.
