BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. <u>255-35 (COR)</u>

The proposed legislation intends to allow subscribers of the Government of Guam Health Insurance two (2) options in terms of providers by amending pertinent sections of the Guam Code Annotated (GCA).

Section 1 of the proposed legislation amends § 4301(a) of Article 3, Chapter 4, Title 4, GCA relative to insurance companies the Governor may enter into contracts with by replacing "one or more" with "the top (2)". Further, Section 1 also repeals the provision of this subsection that emphasizes securing the most economical and beneficial healthcare insurance proposal plan.

Section 2 of the proposed legislation intends to amend § 4302(c)(9) of Article 3, Chapter 4, Title 4, GCA. However, the Bureau notes that the legislation incorrectly reflects such intent by citing § 4302(c)(2). The intended amendment to § 4302(c)(9) in Section 2 of the proposed legislation states that the negotiating team shall present "the best two" proposals, based on the most economical and beneficial healthcare insurance proposals, to the Governor for consideration and to the Legislature for final approval. This section also repeals the provision that defines the most economical and beneficial healthcare insurance proposal. Finally, it repeals the provision requiring that only the single most economical and beneficial healthcare insurance proposal plan be forwarded to the Governor.

According to DOA, due to the fact that medical costs and cost inflation are generally projected by medical providers and that health insurance carriers use medical cost data to determine estimated health insurance premiums, it is not possible to determine the exact fiscal impact of having two (2) or more carriers bidding for the Government of Guam health insurance contract as compared to an exclusive bid. However, per DOA, based on the exclusive and nonexclusive bids received by the health insurance negotiating committee for the FY 2020 health insurance contract, the non-exclusive bids were 10-11% higher than the exclusive bids, possibly due to the risk of uncertainty as to the number of subscribers that will choose one plan over the other.
