Bureau of Budget and Management Research Comments on Bill No. <u>258-35 (COR)</u>

Bill 258 intends to amend Section 1 and add a new Section 18 to Part II of Chapter III of Public Law No. 35-36 relative to the general appropriations to the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) for Fiscal Year 2020.

The amendment will increase the current appropriation level of the Environmental Health Fund (EHF) for Fiscal Year 2020 from \$1,307,674 to \$1,500,000 to DPHSS for the Division of Environmental Health (DEH) and making the appropriate adjustments to Section 1 to revise the appropriation language and total appropriation to DPHSS from \$56,387,212 to \$56,579,538. The amendment results in an appropriation increase of \$192,326 from the EHF to provide additional support to the DPHSS, DEH for Fiscal Year 2020.

Although the EHF does reflect a higher actual revenue collection in FY2019, the average is estimated to be \$1,367,558 based on the actual revenue collections for the past 3 fiscal years, from FY2017 to FY2019. Be advised that based on the Bureau's Special Fund tracking as of the month ending December 31, 2019, the EHF is currently noting a positive track of \$1,322,570 for FY2020. This is an increase of \$14,896 or 1.14% above the current FY2020 appropriation of \$1,307,674. However, this amount is well below the proposed appropriation increase of \$192,326 as contained in Bill 258 for the EHF.

Bill 258 will also add a new Section 18 which will provide an authorization for DPHSS to expend up to the level of revenues collected for Fiscal Year 2020 in the EHF, Health Professional Licensing Office Revolving Fund, Office of Vital Statistics Revolving Fund, and Sanitary Inspection Revolving Fund, and the unexpended carryover in revolving funds for the purposes authorized by statute for the funds. However, it should be noted that the proposed Section 18 is not necessary as the intended purpose is currently authorized by P.L. 35-36. Section 11 (I), relative to Funding Source, of Part II - General Administrative Provisions of Chapter XIII, provides such authorization to DPHSS for the noted EHF as well as the other special funds cited in Bill 258.

It is the position of the Bureau that there is no need to provide for an appropriation increase under the EHF as proposed in Bill 258 as the current provision in P.L. 35-36 will authorize the additional expenditure of \$192,326 should the EHF revenues collected exceed the current FY2020 appropriation level in that amount.
