BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 259-35 (COR)

The proposed legislation intends to initiate the recall election of the mayor of the village of Yona as well as amend pertinent section of the Guam Code Annotated to include the results of a recall election as an event causing vacancy in the municipal offices of mayor and vice mayor. Further, the proposed legislation intends to appropriate \$22,850 from the unappropriated General Fund balance as of the end of Fiscal Year 2019 to conduct the recall election.

Per a public hearing on Bill No. 246-35(LS), the Guam Election Commission (GEC) Executive Director testified that a recall election would cost approximately \$22,850. However, the GEC Executive Director further noted that should the recall vote result in the vacancy of the Mayor position in Yona, a subsequent special election would need to occur. The special election is also estimated at \$22,850.

As reflected in the September 2019 Consolidated Revenue & Expenditure Report (CRER), total gross General Fund (GF) revenue collections in FY 2019 was approximately \$798,066,773, or \$22,437,805 over the adopted GF level of \$775,628,968 in P.L. 34-116. However, it is important to note that the FY 2018 Government of Guam Audit reflects a cumulative deficit of \$83,448,863. Due to the cumulative General Fund shortfall of \$83,448,863, the Bureau does not recommend any appropriation of revenues collected in excess of the adopted FY 2019 General Fund levels contained in P.L. 34-116 as it is *not* fiscally prudent. Appropriating from such a source will hinder the Government of Guam's ability to reduce the cumulative General Fund deficit.

The Bureau also notes that the referenced Guam Code Annotated (GCA) citation contained in the proposed legislation should be amended to reflect §13106 of Chapter 13, Title 3, GCA (relative to events causing vacancies in the municipal offices of Mayor and Vice Mayor) as opposed to §1013.1 of Chapter 10, Title 1, Guam Code Annotated (relative to the Liberation Day Carnival).
