Bureau of Budget & Management Research Comments on Bill No. <u>285-35 (COR)</u>

The intent of Bill No. 285-35 is to amend several subsections within the Guam Code Annotated (GCA) relative to authorizing volunteers to enforce animal abuse laws. The first amendment is to § 77302(a) of Article 3, Chapter 77, Title 10 GCA which authorizes volunteers to issue summons, notices to appear, citations and notices of violation for offenses committed under the provisions of the §§ 70.10 (Cruelty to Animals). The second amendment is to add a new § 34126 to Article 1, Chapter 34, Title 10 GCA to authorize Peace officers and others authorized by law to issue summons, notices to appear, citations and notices of violations of the Animal Cruelty Laws. With the existing volunteers already in place performing similar duties, the issuance of summons and notices for violations of the Animal Cruelty Laws would be in addition to the violations of law they are currently authorized to issue. The potential fiscal impact of these amendments may be the increase in fines for these additional violations.

The third amendment is to add a new § 60205 to Article 2, Chapter 60, Title 5, GCA authorizing the Director of the Department of Agriculture (DOAg) to recruit volunteers for the Protecting Animal Welfare and Safety (PAWS) program to assist the DOAg in the enforcement of Animal Cruelty Laws. The potential fiscal impact is compensation (i.e. stipends) for volunteers of the PAWS program. Due to several unknown variables regarding : 1) the potential number of PAWS volunteers that may participate in the program, 2) the compensation (i.e. stipend) authorized, if any, for a PAWS volunteer, and 3) the program requirements to access such stipend, the Bureau is unable to determine an approximate financial impact at this time.

However, expenditure data from the Guam Police Department's Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve (CVPR) program may help illustrate the financial impact of the PAWS volunteer program:

- FY 2018: \$36,000; 10-15 CVPRs / month (\$250 stipend per month)
- FY 2019: \$29,750; 8-12 CVPRs / month (\$250 stipend per month)
- FY 2020: \$24,000; 10-12 CVPRs (October through January) (\$500 per month)

It should be noted that the stipends cited for the CVPR may differ from the volunteers for the PAWS program depending on the requirements and training involved.
