### Bureau of Budget & Management Research Comments on Bill No. 306-35 (COR)

The intent of Bill No. 306-35 is to control the feral pig population and restrict the release of pigs. The Bill amends § 63118 of Article 1, Chapter 63, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated (GCA) by adding "Feral Pigs" as an Unprotected Wild Animal. It further amends § 63122 of Chapter 63, Title 5, GCA by changing the term "License" to "Revocable Permit" to Take Wild Birds and Wild and Feral Animals. The Bill also adds a new § 62104.3(i) to Article 1, Chapter 62, Title 5, GCA making it unlawful to release pigs whether it is a captured feral pig, a pig domesticated as a pet, or livestock. Bill No. 306-35 also amends §§ 11320 and 11321 of Article 3, Chapter 11, Title 9, Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations (G.A.R.R.) by removing both Non-Commercial and Commercial Trapping License Fees and Bag Limits for feral pigs.

Citing §11104 Article 1, Chapter 11, Title 9, G.A.R.R., the hunting license fee on Guam is \$15. Based on comments received from the Guam Department of Agriculture (DOAg), in FY 2019, eighty (80) licenses were purchased without deer tags, which are required per § 11108 to attach to the carcasses of captured deer. The Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources (DAWR) of the DOAg has determined that any licenses purchased without deer tags are for the purpose of hunting feral pigs, which do not require tags. Utilizing the FY19 information, the DOAg estimates the potential fiscal impact, should Bill No. 306-35 be implemented, would be \$1,200 annually (80 licenses x \$15/license = \$1,200) to the Wildlife Conservation Fund. This is based on the conclusion that because the Bill adds feral pigs as an unprotected wild animal, licenses will no longer be required to hunt these animals. The DOAg further notes that the department has currently issued forty-three (43) licenses without deer tags in FY20 totaling \$645 as of March 13, 2020.
