Footnotes:

1/ The proposed legislation intends to increase the number of days within which the public health authority shall file a petition pursuant to § 19605(b) for a court order authorizing the continued isolation or quarantine of the isolated or quarantined individual or groups of individuals after issuing the directive from ten (10) to thirty (30) days. Additionally, the increase from ten (10) to thirty (30) days will be the timeframe allowance where the public health authority may apply to continue the hearing date on a petition filed pursuant to this section. Furthermore, the addition of § 19605(a)(5) will authorize the public health authority to issue a 30-day island-wide quarantine and isolation directive upon confirmation of a pandemic outbreak, provided that said directive is transmitted to the Governor and the Speaker of the Legislature.

Although the amendments appear administrative in nature, the potential fiscal impact relative to government costs is the administrative leave and overtime cost (where applicable) authorized for its employees due to the temporary mass or island-wide quarantine.
