## Bureau of Budget and Management Research Comments on Bill No. 349-35 (COR)

The proposed legislation seeks to de-appropriate Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) from the unexpended funds of the Office of Senator Mary Camacho Torres and to re-appropriate such funds to the Guam Homeland Security/Office of Civil Defense (GHS/OCD) for the sole purpose of purchasing face masks, face shields, and other Personal Protective Equipment for customerfocused services provided by Government of Guam agencies, to include but not be limited to the Guam Department of Labor for the operation of the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance Program, the Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation, and the Guam Department of Land Management.

In addition, the Bill intends to repeal Subsection (a) of § 77810, Chapter 77, Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated (GCA), which de-appropriates an amount not to exceed Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) from the FY 2016 lapsed funds of the Office of Senator Mary Torres of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* and re-appropriated this funding to the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA) to fund the Multi-Purpose Community Stadium Complex Commission to carry out its powers and responsibilities. Pursuant to Section 3, Chapter VI of P.L. 33-185 (FY 2017 Budget Act), the unexpended balance of funds appropriated to *I Liheslaturan Guahan* and the Office of Finance and Budget for FY 2016 shall not lapse and shall continue to be available until fully expended.

It should be noted that the Bill does not specifically state which fiscal year the above-mentioned unexpended funds will be de-appropriated from. However, per *I Liheslatura*, the funding of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) is available from the FY 2016 unexpended funds of the Office of Senator Torres to re-appropriate to the GHS/OCD as this funding was never transferred to GEDA for its use as mandated under § 77810(a) of Chapter 77, Title 12 GCA.
