Bureau of Budget & Management Research Comments on Bill No. <u>369-35 (COR)</u>

The proposed legislation intends to add a new Article 10 to Chapter 33 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated (GCA), relative to authorizing the performance of Notarial Acts by a Remote Online Notary Public and to add a new Article 11 to Chapter 33 of Title 5, GCA relative to authorizing the recording of an electronic record. The Bill further amends §33512 of Chapter 33, Title 5, GCA relative to criminal prosecution of a notary office; and adds a new Chapter 3 to Title 31, Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations, relative to implementing rules for Remote Online Notarization (RON).

Referencing information from the National Notary Association website, RON is where a signer personally appears before the Notary at the time of the notarization using audio-visual technology over the internet instead of being physically present in the same room. RON is also called webcam notarization, online notarization or virtual notarization.

The Bill basically implements RON on Guam, establishes the rules for RON and amends penalties for failure to perform the notarizations as mandated by law.

To perform RON services, one must be a commissioned Notary meeting the qualifications for becoming a traditional Notary. In addition to this, a course of instruction to perform electronic notarial acts, approved by the Attorney General (AG), must be completed and an examination must be passed based on the course. Notaries who perform RON services are required to have access to a computer, webcam, microphone and secure connection to the internet which must all be identified to the AG and must conform to the Rules for RON. The Bill also requires Notaries who perform RON must secure electronic journals, electronic signatures, and electronic seals. The costs for the additional requirements to perform RON is the responsibility of the Notary.

The fiscal impact of this Bill is dependent on the extent to which the additional regulations and requirements established by RON translates into increased training and responsibilities of existing OAG personnel. Any additional Notarial fees generated from performing RON services, as with traditional Notarial services, shall be deposited into the Notary Public Revolving Fund for use by the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) for the purpose of the administration of the notary program, including personnel costs for training, notary educational programs, conferences and any administrative and equipment costs, subject to appropriation by the Guam Legislature.

A request for fiscal comment was sent to the OAG relative to the subject bill with an extension granted for the response, however, none have been received to date. Absent additional information from the OAG and due to the unknown variable regarding the number of RONs that may arise, the Bureau is unable to determine an appropriate financial impact at this time.
