Dear Mr. Speaker:

I am pleased to transmit herewith Bill No. 729, which I have this date signed into law as Public Law 19-28.

This bill brings the child support laws of the Territory of Guam into compliance with federal guidelines, ensuring that a person paying child support does not find him or herself faced with massive retroactive payments, while at the same time, protecting the rights of the parent receiving child support payments.

Further, this bill allows the Superior Court of Guam to set up separate funds for jury and appointed counsel fees.

It is vital that the machinery of child support be kept in fine tune. The facts of life are unavoidable. Divorce happens. Single-parent households exist. But if the single parent, having to raise children on his or her own, is not receiving support payments because the machinery has broken down, the tragedy is compounded.

This is a quality piece of legislation and one of great import to many people. I am pleased, therefore, to be able to sign Bill No. 729 into law as Public Law 19-28.

AN ACT TO AMEND \$2820 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED TO CHANGE THE EFFECTIVE DATE FOR RETROACTIVE MODIFICATION OF SUPPORT ORDERS, AND TO ADD NEW SECTIONS 680.9a AND 680.9b TO THE CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE TO ESTABLISH JURY AND APPOINTED COUNSEL TRUST FUNDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. 10 GCA §2820 is amended to read:

"\$2820. Vacation or Modification Orders. An order for child support is a final judgement as to any installment or payment of money which has accrued up to the time the hearing has been had on motion of either party to set aside, alter, or modify the order. The provisions of any order respecting maintenance or support may be modified only as to installments accruing subsequent to the hearing on the motion for modification and only upon a showing of a substantial and material change of circumstances. Furthermore, any order directing the payment of money for support or maintenance of the spouse or minor child or children shall not be suspended nor the execution of the order stayed pending an appeal. The Superior Court of Guam shall have the authority to modify any order, award,

stipulation or agreement as to child support (whether or not merged or integrated into a decree of divorce or separation) upon a showing of substantial and material change of circumstances. Inability to provide support or need for increased support because of unreasonable obligations voluntarily incurred shall not constitute a showing of substantial and material change of circumstances."

Section 2. A new Section 680.9a is hereby added to the Code of Civil Procedure to read:

"\$680.9a. Jury Trust Fund. There is hereby established a Jury Trust Fund (the "Fund") to carry out the provisions of Sections 680.4 and 680.9 of this Code. The Fund shall be replenished annually by appropriation of the Legislature paid directly to the Fund. All expenses related to jury services shall be accounted for in the Fund which shall be maintained separate and apart from other funds of the Superior Court."

Section 3. A new Section 680.9b is hereby added to the Code of Civil Procedure to read:

"\$680.9b. Appointed Counsel Trust Fund. There is hereby established an Appointed Counsel Trust Fund (the "Fund") under the Superior Court of Guam. The Fund shall be maintained and accounted for separately from other funds of the Superior Court. The Fund shall be replenished annually by appropriation of the Legislature. All fees and expenses related to the legal defense of indigent persons conducted pursuant to the Judicial Council Rules for the Appointment of Counsel of Indigent Defendants shall be paid out of the Fund."

AN ACT TO AMEND 10 GCA \$2820 TO CHANGE THE EFFECTIVE DATE FOR RETROACTIVE MODIFICATION OF SUPPORT ORDERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. 10 GCA §2820 is amended to read:

"§2820. Vacation or Modification Orders. An order for child support is a final judgement as to any installment or payment of money which has accrued up to the time [either party makes a motion] the hearing has been had on motion of either party to set aside, later, or modify the order. The provisions of any order respecting maintenance or support may be modified only as to installments accruing subsequent to the hearing on the motion for modification and only upon a showing of a substantial and material change of circumstances. Furthermore, any order directing the payment of money for support or maintenance of the spouse or minor child or children shall not be suspended nor the execution of the order stayed pending an appeal. The Superior Court of Guam shall have the authority to modify any order, award, stipulation or agreement as to child support (whether or not merged or integrated into a decree of divorce or separation) upon a showing of substantial and material change of circumstances. Inability to provide support or need for increased support because of unreasonable obligations voluntarily incurred shall not constitute a showing of substantial and material change of circumstances.
