

BILL NOS. 44(LS) AND 48(LS) APRIL 28, 1993



Bill Nos. 48(LS) and 44(LS) proposes to appropriate a combined total of Two Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,250,000) from the Tourist Attraction Fund (TAF) to the Department of Public Works for the design and construction of an overhead light system along the entire San Vitores Boulevard as well as to install additional streetlights along Camp Watkins Road and Fahrenholt Drive.

Information received from the Traffic and Engineering Section, Department of Public Works revealed that the amount of \$2.25M proposed to be appropriated is inadequate to fund the cost of both projects listed. Although no cost estimate was provided, DPW projects that the San Vitores Boulevard project alone would exceed the total amount being proposed for appropriation in both bills. Also, the bills failed to provide funding for the maintenance, repair, as well as the annual utility costs of the proposed lighting system. This is the same major concern previously raised by the department in the original San Vitores walkway Lighting Project.

The Bureau supports the intent of Bills No. 48(LS) and 44(LS). However, given the concerns listed above, as well as the strong likelihood that the General Fund would ultimately be the fund source to pay for the annual utility costs, the Bureau is concerned about further financial drains upon the already beleaguered General Fund.

Dear Vice-Speaker Aguon:

The Department of Public Works would like to take this opportunity to comment on the referenced bills involving the installation of street lighting in the Tamuning area.

Firstly, we are very supportive of the Chalan San Vitores street lighting project intended to replace the badly damaged low level walkway lighting. This area has the highest concentration of pedestrians on Guam and crossing Chalan San Vitores, especially during hours of darkness, can be extremely hazardous.

We are concerned about the proposed project limits and respectfully suggest that the area extend from the Traffic Circle at Chalan San Antonio to Route 1 (Marine Drive) at the old Australian Cable Station. This would involve eighty-nine (89) new poles and luminaires with wiring underground. The "extension" of San Vitores, actually Cogna Street, to the Nikko Hotel is presently reasonably well illuminated by privately installed fixtures and we feel there is not a need to include this leg.

Because of escalating construction costs we feel the proposed appropriation of one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) may only be sufficient to install lighting for the area defined above. The design of this project has been completed for some time and, if funded, the project could be bid out very quickly.

The Camp Watkins/Farenholt link is presently under design for both reconstruction and street lighting. However, funding for the lighting is not funded. Based on current construction costs we estimate the required eighty poles and luminaires would also be about one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000.00).

A third area in need of improved lighting is Chalan San Antonio from Route 1 (Marine Drive) to the Traffic Circle at Chalan San Vitores old GMH). This commercial strip is seven lanes wide, has heavy volumes of high speed traffic, and frequent night crossings by pedestrians. We strongly urge inclusion of this area for lighting upgrading if funds can be identified. Again, based on current charges, we estimate installation costs of nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000.00).

Dear Mr. Chairman:

Thank you for seeking the Guam Visitors Bureau's position on Bill No. 44. The Bureau urges the prompt passage of this legislation.

Tumon Bay's various attractions are being utilized by many local residents in addition to Guam's visitors. Chalan San Vitores also serves as an alternate route for rush hour traffic. Much of the vehicular and pedestrian traffic occurs during the early evening hours. Combining these two elements with the limited lighting presently in operation has a great potential for accidents.

In an attempt to reduce this potential, the Bureau has been working with the Department of Public Works (DPW) and the Guam Power Authority (GPA) to design and install overhead lighting from the Hotel Nikko Guam to the intersection of Chalan San Vitores and Chalan San Antonio. DPW and GPA have estimated that this project would cost \$1.2 million. Copies of this estimate can be provided to the committee.

Again, the Bureau seeks your immediate support for passage of this bill.

#### Dear Chairman Aguon:

The Guam Hotel & Restaurant Association (GHRA) supports Bill No. 44 and Bill No 48, but to varying degrees. Passage of Bill No. 44 will have the greatest impact on the visitor industry at the least cost. The design and construction of overhead lighting and underground electrical distribution lines along Camp Watkins Road and Fahrenholt Drive, as provided for in Bill No. 48, are less cost effective, in our opinion. The design and construction of adequate overhead lighting and underground electrical distribution lines along Tumon Bay are sorely needed to protect visitors and residents alike.

The Guam Hotel & Restaurant Association has no objection to using the Tourist Attraction Fund for the design and construction of overhead lighting and underground electrical distribution lines along Camp Watkins Road and Fahrenholt Drive as long as there are sufficient funds to do so without jeopardizing the viability of existing ventures such as the Guam Visitors Bureau's marketing program and the Guam Community College's Tourism and Marketing program. One million five hundred thousand dollars (approximately 8% of the annual take) is a lot of money to glean from a fund with decreasing revenues.

In short, our members especially would like to see that GVB's marketing efforts are maintained, if not intensified, to offset the current tourism slow-down.

Dear Senator Aguon:

The continuing series of tourist pedestrian accidents on San Vitores Road has long been of concern to us and requires an immediate response to the problem.

Numerous efforts have been conducted over the years to eliminate pedestrian accidents, yet to this day they still occur. To be sure, with the installation of additional traffic lights, pedestrian crossings, and a reduced speed limit, the frequency of pedestrian accidents appears to have diminished, however, they still exist.

The issue of lighting on San Vitores Road has been debated at levels and the overwhelming response has been that the existing lighting system is both inadequate and for all practical purposes non-existent. If one were to refer to the "2010 HIGHWAY MASTER PLAN TUMON BAY TRAFFIC STUDY", the very first recommendation made in the Executive Summary is to improve lighting. The Tourist Industry Relations Committee of the Guam Visitors Bureau, in conjunction with the Traffic Engineering Division of Department of Public Works, worked tirelessly on this issue for years and submitted a detailed lighting plan to the current administration, only to have it disappear somewhere. The G.V.B. has written numerous letters as have we, to implement the D.P.W. lighting plan for San Vitores Road. appears that perhaps our efforts would have been more effective had we directed our correspondence to this committee.

It is our opinion, that with the advent of a comprehensive lighting system as detailed by the Traffic Engineering Division of D.P.W., a major step will be taken to increase both the safety of residents and visitors alike. We believe that Bills No. 44 & 48 will assist in achieving the desired results and we wholeheartedly endorse this legislation.

The Legislature also recognized 8 that placing all electrical distribution lines underground will increase the 9 safety and reliability of the power system for residents and visitors alike. 10 Therefore, it is the intent of the Legislature to provide funding to the 11 Department of Public Works for the design and construction of overhead 12 light system to replace the existing walkway lights, to install, as needed, 13 additional overhead streetlights along Camp Watkins Road and Fahrenholt 14 Drive and to place all electrical lines underground along these routes. 15

16 Section 2. Appropriation. ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND

- 1 DOLLARS (\$1,500,000) are appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to
- 2 the Department of Public Works for the design and construction of overhead
- 3 light system from the Ypao Road and San Vitores Boulevard intersection to
- 4 the Hotel Nikko, to install additional overhead streetlights along Camp
- 5 Watkins Road and Fahrenholt Drive and to place all electrical distribution
- 6 lines underground along these routes.
