Enclosed please find a copy of Substitute Bill No. 351 (COR), "AN ACT TO REPEAL AND RE-ENACT §40113(b)(3) OF CHAPTER 40, DIVISION 4, PART 1 OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO DESIGNATING LOT NO. 64-3, AGANA HEIGHTS, GUAM, AS A COMMUNITY PARK AND TRANSFERRING THE LOT TO THE CONTROL OF THE MAYOR OF AGANA HEIGHTS.", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-133.

This bill allows a park to be created in the area where the old U. S. Naval Hospital incinerator used to be located in Agana Heights. It also places the jurisdiction for the care of this new park and recreation area under the Mayor of Agana Heights.

The bill provides \$50,000 for the remediation and restoration of the area, including removal of chemicals or contaminants which may be present.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM: 1 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. The Guam Legislature 2 finds that the Agana Heights Municipal Planning Council and the Mayor of 3 Agana Heights have long desired to develop Lot Number 64-3, Agana 4 5 Heights, Guam, the site of the former U.S. Naval Hospital incinerator, into a community park. The Guam Legislature further finds that the Department of 6 7 Parks and Recreation, the current custodian of said lot, with the consent of the Governor, have agreed to transfer the property to the custody and care of the 8 Mayor of Agana Heights since 1995. To this date, the transfer has not taken 9 place. Thus, the Agana Heights Municipal Planning Council and the Mayor 10 11 of Agana Heights have sought the assistance of the Guam Legislature to facilitate the transfer of said lot. 12 Section 2. Section 40113(b)(3) of Chapter 40, Division 4, Part 1 of Title 5 13 14 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby repealed and re-enacted to read as 15 follows: "Section 40113(b)(3). The Mayor of Agana Heights shall be 16 17 responsible for the Agana Heights Recreation Area and Lot Number 64-18 3, Agana Heights, Guam, the former site of the U.S. Naval Hospital 19 incinerator, which is hereby designated as a community park;" 20 Section 3. Remediation and Restoration. The Guam Legislature 21 hereby appropriates Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) from the General 22 Fund to the Department of Public Works for the remediation and restoration

- 1 of Lot Number 64-3, Agana Heights, Guam, by the Department of Public
- 2 Works and the Guam Environmental Protection Agency. This shall include
- 3 the removal of all debris, including construction materials, and the removal of

Publicly Heard Monday, October 20, 1997

Bill 351 - An act to repeal and re-enact §40113(b)(3) of Chapter 40 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to designating Lot No. 64-3, Agana Heights, Guam as a community park and transferring the lot to the control of the Mayor of Agana Heights.

#### II. MAIN SPONSORS

#### III. SYNOPSIS

The Agana Heights Municipal Planning Council and the Mayor of Agana Heights has long desired to develop Lot No. 64-3, Agana Heights into a community park. This property was formerly used as an incinerator by the U.S. Naval Hospital.

The current custodian of the land, Department of Parks & Recreation, had agreed since 1995, with the consent of the Governor, to transfer the property to the custody and care of the Mayor of Agana Heights. To date this transfer has not taken place. This bill will place the property in the care of the Mayor's office for the purpose of a community park.

#### IV. TESTIMONY

Mayor Paul McDonald, Mayor of Agana Heights, testified in support of the bill, noting that he has tried several times to secure the property without success. The property is now neglected and unmaintained and has become an illegal dumping site. At one time, Mayor McDonald testified that the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA) claimed it as a staging area for typhoon debris. The Department of Public Works had also utilized the lot for trash and debris. It is now clear that the property is in the Department of Parks & Recreation's inventory. Mayor McDonald also noted that he has tried to convince the Department of Public Works to remove the debris and trash on the property, to no avail.

Chairman Salas suggested that the bill be amended to mandate that GEPA, DPW and any other agencies that had utilized the lot pay for the clean-up and restoration of the lot to its original condition.

Mr. Pete Untalan, Member of the Agana Heights Municipal Planning Council, testified that the goal of the council is to use this property to develop into a community park to serve the youth and adults of Agana Heights and surrounding villages.

Mr. Joseph M. Borja, Administrative Director of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission, provided testimony confirming that the proposed property in Agana Heights is not part of the CLTC inventory.

#### V. COMMITTEE FINDINGS

The committee finds that the Mayor's and Agana Heights Municipal Planning Council's goal to develop the property into a community park for the benefit of the public is an example of how the government should serve its people. It is clear that the property in question is not being used in any meaningful manner under the responsibility of the Department of Parks & Recreation and that various agencies have used this property as a dumping site without any effort to maintain or restore the area. The committee agreed that some funding would be necessary to ensure clean-up the area by DPW and GEPA.

The committee feels that these agencies should pay for the clean-up of this property to restore it to a clean, original condition.

#### VI. COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Therefore, the committee recommends **TO DO PASS** Bill 351, as substituted by committee, to mandate the clean-up of Lot No. 64-3, Agana Heights, by the Department of Public Works and the Guam Environmental Protection Agency, and to authorize the appropriation of \$50,000 for the clean-up.

Bill No. 351 (COR) will transfer the property and custodial responsibility of Lot No. 64-3, Agana Heights, Guam, the site of the former U.S. Naval Hospital incinerator from the Department of Parks and Recreation to the Mayor of Agana Heights.

If enacted, Bill 351 will impact on the funds the Municipality of Agana Heights receives from General Fund appropriations for its MPC operations and community development. The Bill will add another area of maintenance responsibility for the Mayor of Agana Heights.

The Agana Heights Municipal Planning Council (MPC) and the Mayor of Agana Heights intends to develop the site into a community-based park. According to the Agana Heights Mayor, there will be a cost impact attributed to the environmental cleanup and removal of debris and garbage presently at the site.

The Agana Heights MPC is appropriated \$35,926 under its MPC budget and \$16,876 under its Community Development Fund (CDF) budget that can be used to provide for the minor maintenance of the site until the environmental cleanup and removal of debris and garbage is completed.

This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into by and between the DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION and the MAYOR OF AGAMA HEIGHTS, concerning the day-to-day operation of the Incinerator site Park, and to become effective upon the signature of all parties concerned.

#### PREFACE

The authority to maintain the Incinerator Site Park having been vested by a Quitclaim Deed filed for public record on August 4, 1983, bearing document number 340078, copy attached, between the United States of America, acting by and through the Secretary of the Interior, acting by and through the Director, National Park Service, under and pursuant to the power and authority contained in the provisions of the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949.

#### TERMS

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to 5 G.C.A. SS 40113(c) (1993) the Department of Parks and Recreation hereby relinquishes by contract

its responsibility for the Incinerator Site and all its rights thereto, including (but not necessarily limited to) the right to use, control, and schedule activities thereon, and contracts with the Mayor of Agana Heights to carry out in its stead all the responsibilities vested in the Department of Parks and Recreation by virtue of the aforesaid statute, which includes the use, control, management, development, and general minor maintenance of the Incenerator Site. The Mayor of Agana Heights will exclusively carry out all the general minor repair and maintenance work set out in the aforesaid statute, Which includes, but is not necessarily limited to, "cleaning, painting, plumbing, trash collection, landscape maintenance, upkeep of drainage facilities, planting of trees, plants and flowers, maintenance of street lights and replacement of streel lights." The Mayor of Agana Heights will also be exclusively responsible for all use of, control over, and scheduling of activities at the Incinerator Site. Furthermore, the Mayor of Agana Heights will carryout its own statutory responsibilities assigned under Guam Government Code SS 26010; as amended by P.L. 18-15:20, namely: "all necessary repairs, maintenance, renovation, and capital of improvements."

Furtheremore, the Mayor of Agana Heights hereby assumes all those obligations of Grantee as stipulated in the Quitclaim Deed, filed for public record on August 4, 1983, hearing Instrument Number 340078.

#### Hafa Adai!

This office is in receipt of your memorandum dated September 20, 1995, in which you requested approval of an Memorandum of Understanding between the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) and the Mayor of Agana Hoights which would transfer the old Incinerator Site from the control of DPR and place it in the control of the Mayor of Agana Heights. It is not possible to accomplish this by MOU but the same result may be reached by other means.

In 1983 the property known as the U.S. Naval Hospital Incinerator was transferred to the government of Guam. In 1988, pursuant to the authority granted in 21 G.C.A. §77108, the Incinerator Site (among others) was forwarded to and approved by the Guam Legislature as an addition to the Territorial Park System. In that amendment the word "Park" was defined to be those areas under the control of the Department of Parks and Recreation and included, as a Territorial Recreational Facility, the Incinerator Site.

The procedure for the inclusion of government of Guam land within the Territorial Park System is defined at 21 G.C.A. 77108 et seq. In general, the department was to inventory government land, determine the land to be included in the Territorial Park System, forward the list to several places, including the Guam Legislature where, after public hearing the inclusion may be approved. The last sentence of that section provides that "[t]he list shall be added to or deleted from the aforementioned process as deemed necessary". This would imply that to delete land from the Territorial Park System it would be necessary to submit an amendment to the Guam Legislature for approval. This would, however, merely serve to transfer that land back into the general inventory of land owned by the government of Guam and would not accomplish the intent of the MOU which is to keep the land as Territorial Park System land but under the control of the Agana Heights Mayor.

There is, however, an alternative which would keep the incinerator Site in the Territorial Park System but would allow it to be placed under the control of the Agana Heights Mayor. This would involve reclassifying the land from a Territorial Recreation Facility to a Community Recreation

Facility. This would be done by amending the list submitted to the Legislature in 1986 to change the classification of the Incinerator Site. The effect of this amendment would be to allow the site to fall under 21 G.C.A. §77112 which provides

The control, management, development and general minor maintenance of areas classified as community parks and community recreational facilities shall be vested in the Commissioner of the municipality or village in which such area is located, in accordance with the provisions of 5 G.C.A. Government Operations, §40113. (Emphasis added).

Section 40113 is the section which defines the responsibilities of the village mayors over the recreation areas located within their respective villages. This would accomplish the intent of the MOU without placing the recreational area into the general inventory of government lands which might conceivably result in it being lost as a recreational site.

In response to your memo of October 15, 1997 regarding a public hearing for bills 313, 351 and 358, please note the following comments:

#### 1. Bill 313:

Presently, GWA has a total of two (2) production deep wells (D-12 & D-13) situated on Chamoru Land Trust Commission lot No. 10120-R16. Each of these wells uses approximately 2500 square feet for the well head, the control room, the chlorination and fluoridation room, and the generator building. Additional space for the maneuvering of equipment and vehicles is presently available for both wells.

The lot is located directly above the Tumon water aquifer, Guam's largest aquifer and is included in the GEPA Guam Groundwater Management Zone. Consequently, property lots in this zone that are smaller than 20,000 square feet must be hooked up to a sewer collection system and are not allowed the use of on-site wastewater disposal systems (septic tanks with leaching fields). Lot 10120-R16 does not have a sewer collection system and will be subject to these restrictions.

GWA requests that these stated concerns are duly considered and included during the Department of Land Management's assessment of the portion of lot 10120-R16 that will be exchanged to satisfy Bill 313.





#### 2. Bill 351:

Presently, GWA has a total of one (1) production deep well (A-32) situated on lot No. 64-3. Approximately 2500 square feet for the well head, the control room, the chlorination and fluoridation room, and the generator building are needed to accommodate the existing well. Additional space for the maneuvering of equipment and vehicles is presently available for deep well A-32.

The lot is located directly above the Ordot water aquifer and is included in the GEPA Guam Groundwater Management Zone.

#### 3. Bill 358:

GWA's supports the exchange and only requests that the concerns stated earlier are again given due consideration and included in the Department of Land Management's assessment and selection of the portion of lot 10120-R16 to be exchanged.
