Dear Speaker Unpingco:

Enclosed please find Bill No. 541 (COR), "AN ACT TO ADD §§4302(h) AND 4302(i) TO ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER 4 OF TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO COVERAGE FOR CHRONIC ORTHOPEDIC DEFORMITIES AND BLOOD AND BLOOD DERIVATIVES.", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-190.

I have signed this legislation to send a message that adequate health coverage for government employees is very important. I would hope that this legislation is corrected soon by I liheslaturan Guåhan.

Although the intent of this legislation is very laudable, the language appears to be defective. No one can doubt that surgery for chronic orthopedic deformities and that transfusions of blood and blood derivatives are worthy health benefits to be covered by health insurance made available to government of Guam employees.

This bill states: "no health insurance company or provider. . . may deny coverage to the employee or dependents on the basis of chronic orthopedic deformities. . . or on the basis of blood or blood derivatives." This language, if taken true on its face, does not extend any medical benefits. The medical benefits of surgery for orthopedic deformities or transfusions of blood and blood derivatives do not have to be provided, according to this language. Coverage of some sort is mandated to be

provided, whether or not the individual needs surgery for chronic orthopedic deformities or needs transfusions of blood or blood derivatives.

I believe that this legislation should be included in the larger medical package now being considered by Senator Eduardo Cruz along with the medical community and insurance community of Guam, so that the proper language can be drafted. This provision should be coordinated with other provisions also now under consideration.

AN ACT TO ADD §§4302(h) AND 4302(i) TO ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER 4 OF TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO COVERAGE FOR **CHRONIC** ORTHOPEDIC AND DEFORMITIES AND BLOOD BLOOD DERIVATIVES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings. For several years the employees of the government of Guam and their dependents have expressed the desire to include coverage for chronic orthopedic deformities and blood and blood derivatives in their medical health benefits package.

I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that chronic orthopedic deformities are a 6 limiting disability that are increasing steadily on the Island as the population 7 ages. When an individual suffers from chronic orthopedic deformities this 8 limits their daily life activities and in some cases, their ability to work. When 9 the individual is unable to work, this causes an undue financial burden on the 10 11 family. When corrected the individual can continue to lead a normal, active 12 life. Additionally, I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that the benefit for correcting chronic orthopedic deformities far outweighs the cost of the long-term effects 13 that are associated with the individual suffering with this condition. 14

15 I Liheslaturan Guahan further finds that there is an increasing number of 16 persons on Guam that suffer from hemophilia, a bleeding disorder. Presently, 17 the medical health benefits package only covers the administration of the 18 blood byproducts and does not allow coverage for replacement of blood and 19 blood derivatives. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that the individual must be 20 allowed the total benefit to assure the individual receives the most 21 comprehensive medical care needed. Additionally, although there are several 22 services available for family support, there are limitations for financial 23 assistance.

Therefore, *I Liheslaturan Guahan* finds that the government of Guam
 must include chronic orthopedic deformities and blood and blood derivatives

in their health benefit package when negotiating contracts with health
 insurance companies or health care providers.

3 Section 2. Section 4302(h) is hereby added to Article 3, Chapter 4 of
4 Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

5 "(h) No health insurance company or health care provider 6 contracted to provide health care to government of Guam employees 7 may deny coverage to the employee or dependents on the basis of 8 chronic orthopedic deformities. Chronic orthopedic deformities, which 9 may include orthopedic and external prosthetic devices, including, but 10 not limited to, artificial joints and limbs, will be covered and may be 11 subject to maximum limitations per annum."

Section 3. Section 4302(i) is hereby added to Article 3, Chapter 4 of
Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

14 "(i) No health insurance company or health care provider
15 contracted to provide health care to government of Guam employees
16 may deny coverage to the employee or dependents on the basis of blood
17 or blood derivatives. Blood and blood derivatives will be covered and
18 may be subject to maximum limitations per annum."

Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective for the
 Fiscal Year 1999 contract period for health insurance between the government
 of Guam and health insurance companies or health care providers.

PUBLIC NOTICE:

Pursuant to the requirements of Public Law 24-109, notice of the Public Hearing on Bill No. 541 was sent to all media on Monday, April 6, 1998 and a reminder memorandum was sent on Friday April 10, 1998. Additionally, a public hearing notice was published in the Pacific Daily News on Tuesday, April 7, 1998 and on Sunday, April 12, 1998.

PUBLIC HEARING:

The Committee on Finance and Taxation conducted a public hearing on Monday, April 13, 1998 at 10:00 AM in the Vice Speaker's Conference Room to hear testimonies on Bill No. 541.

MEMBERS PRESENT:

The hearing was called to order by the Chairperson of the Committee on Finance and Taxation, Vice Speaker Anthony C. Blaz. Committee members present were:

Speaker Antonio Unpingco Senator Mark Charfauros Senator William B.S.M. Flores Senator Tom Ada Other Senators present were: Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr.

PROVIDING PUBLIC TESTIMONY ON THE BILL:

Patrick M. Wolff James W. Gillian, GMHP Stacy M. Yatar, PacifiCare

BACKGROUND:

Patrick Wolff, in his written testimony, supported the bill. He added that Bill 541 should go out on its own rather than be incorporated into Bill 598 (Guam Health Benefits Act). He urged the Committee to report out Bill 541 citing a number of benefits that the bill will offer. His testimony is attached for review.

James Gillian, GMHP, offered written testimony stating that the bill may not be necessary since Bill 598 also addresses this mandate.

Stacy Yatar, PacifiCare, testified in support of the bill. However, she offered the committee amendments to the current bill:

• First sentence of New sections (h) and (l) state that "No health insurance company or health care provider contracted to provide health care to Government of Guam employees may deny coverage to the employee or dependants on the basis of 'chronic orthopedic deformities or blood

or blood derivatives.' PacifiCare believes that reference to health insurance companies is unnecessary. She proposed that the new language read: "<u>The Government of Guam shall provide</u> its employees, retirees and their dependants with a health benefit package that includes coverage for" chronic orthopedic deformities or blood or blood derivatives.

FINDINGS:

Bill 541 (COR) will mandate that employees of the Government of Guam and their dependants be included for coverage for chronic deformities and blood or blood derivatives in their medical health benefits package. The Guam Legislature finds that chronic orthopedic deformities are increasing steadily on island. Although current medical health benefit packages only covers the administration of blood byproducts and does not allow coverage for the replacement of blood and blood derivatives. Therefore, it is the intent of the Guam Legislature to include coverage for chronic orthopedic deformities in the government of Guam health benefit package. The Committee on Finance & Taxation recommends that Bill 541 stand on its own rather than being incorporated

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

The Committee, having conducted a sufficient hearing, does hereby recommend to the Legislature <u>to do pass</u> Bill 541 "AN ACT TO ADD SECTIONS (H) AND (I) TO §4302, ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATING TO COVERAGE FOR CHRONIC ORTHOPEDIC DEFORMITIES AND BLOOD AND BLOOD DERIVATIVES."

Dear Committee Members:

Today I appeared before senators Blaz(Chair), Ada(Bill co-sponsor), Aguon, Flores, and Unpingco(Speaker), and testified in favor of Bill 541, extending GovGuam insurance coverage to chronic orthopedic deformities. I promised to follow up with this letter summarizing my views on this Bill, which should go forward on its own strong merits rather than relying on this issue's possible inclusion in the Bill 598(Guam Health Benefits Act).

1)Osteoarthritis of a joint is a degenerative condition with no known cause or cure. It is not caused by drinking or smoking or any other vice, nor is it hindered or helped by exercise or good/bad eating habits. The pain and immobility just get worse and worse, no matter what you do, until one's only recourse is joint replacement surgery.

2) Such operative procedure is costly(approximately \$40,000) such that 95% of effected patients cannot self pay for it. The only hope is insurance. My own osteoarthritis(left hip), diagnosed in 1991 by Dr. Jan Bollinger and corroborated by Dr. Charles Engh(Anderson Clinic, Arlington, Virginia)during summer 1992, has forced me to search these past six(6) years for any/all avenues for insurance..all for naught. There is presently no viable insurance option available to be here.

3)I have lived/worked and raised 3 sons on Guam the past 22 years, consider Guam my home, and have no intention of leaving, yet my only hope of insurance coverage(apart from this Bill 541) is to relocate my family to the mainland USA, where coverage for hip replacement is commonplace. It is a waste of human resources when Guam loses contributing citizens due to such health insurance deficits.

4) Chronic orthopedic deformities have the same effect as other impairments/disabilities in that they render their victims handicapped and unable to contribute in the same ways to our community. This Bill would allow persons so effected to regain their capacity to provide quality service to our Island and support their families. You need not fear abuse; noone would agree to joint replacement surgery unless absolutely necessary simply because no prosthesis is nearly as good as the one given us at birth. Most anyone would elect a less invasive treatment but none is available anywhere. So we have no real choice, but how can we hope to cover the expenses apart from Bill 5417

Dear Patrick,

Thanks for your continued interest in health insurance through AR&FA. I called our agent to check on your questions, and he tells me that although there is nothing in writing that states this, there is no waiting period upon taking up residency in a specific state, and there is no proof of residency needed when you apply. If you were to make a claim and they discovered in the process of researching the claim that you didn't actually live where you said you did, it would invalidate your coverage. However, they don't need to verify it in advance.

I also asked him if our coverage is available in all 50 states, since you didn't say to which state you might be moving. He says that it is available in all states except Idaho, Kentucky, Oregon, North Dakota, New Hampshire, Vermont, and New Jersey. So as long as you're not moving to one of those states, you'll be eligible to apply. As with everyone, acceptance and coverage will be determined by medical/health factors.

I don't know if you have an application, so I'm enclosing one. Good luck on your move! Sincerely,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony this morning on Bill 541, AN ACT TO ADD SECTIONS (h) AND (i) TO S4302, ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER 4, TITLE 4 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATING TO COVERAGE FOR CHRONIC ORTHOPEDIC DEFORMITIES AND BLOOD AND BLOOD DERIVATIVES. PacifiCare Asia Pacific supports Bill 541, with some suggested changes to language.

For many years, PacifiCare has made recommendations to representatives of the Government of Guam's Department of Administration to include coverage for chronic orthopedic deformities in the health benefits package for Government of Guam employees and retirees. Utilization rates and other data extracted from our records continue to show that Government of Guam employees, retirees and their dependents have very high rates of experience with chronic orthopedic deformities.

Because we understand the costs associated with treatment for chronic orthopedic deformities, we believe that providing such coverage would relieve the financial burden borne by many government employees, retirees and their families. Though the new benefit would require an adjustment in the current premium, it would not be as devastating as the out-of-pocket payments being made today without coverage. In addition, providing coverage would ensure that all those requiring such treatment would receive it without hesitation unlike today where many opt not to get full treatment because of the high cost. Full treatment, for many, may mean the difference between simply living life and living a full, active and productive life.

PacifiCare would like to see the Committee make some changes to the current language used in Bill 541. Presently, the first sentence of new Sections (h) and (i) state that "No health insurance company or health care provider contracted to provide health care to Government of Guam employees may deny coverage to the employee or dependents on the basis of" chronic orthopedic deformities or blood or blood derivatives. Because "the Legislature finds that the Government of Guam **must include** chronic orthopedic deformities and blood and blood derivatives in their health benefits package," we believe that reference to health insurance companies is unnecessary. Vice Speaker Anthony C. Blaz, page 2.

Instead, we propose that the new language read "<u>The Government of Guam shall provide its</u> employees, retirees and their dependents with a health benefit package that includes coverage for" chronic orthopedic deformities or blood or blood derivatives.

For the past 25 years, PacifiCare has prided itself on being a good corporate citizen through our community contributions and active participation in shaping good health care programs and legislation. So, the growing trend to "blame" health insurance companies, or "HMOs," for the existing problems in our island's health care industry has become somewhat disturbing and very disheartening. By including "health insurance companies" and "deny" in the same sentence, it once again looks as though we are the source of the problem. We hope this can be changed in Bill 541 and in future references to "HMOs."

Again, thank you for this opportunity. PacifiCare views such legislation as a step in the right direction. We hope the Committee takes our above suggestion into consideration and that Bill 541 is quickly passed and signed into law.
