



**AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE
UNIVERSITY OF GUAM RESERVE OFFICERS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

1 **Section 1. Appropriation.** The sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars
2 (\$15,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the University of
3 Guam Reserve Officers Training Corp for the purpose of constructing a Repelling
4 Tower.

5 **Section 2. Project Coordination.** The President of the University of
6 Guam, together with the Instructor for the ROTC Program, shall coordinate the
7 construction of the tower with all cognizant departments and agencies of the
8 government of Guam.

9 **Section 3. Specific Use of Funds.** The appropriated amount shall be
10 specifically used for the construction of the tower, and shall *not* be used for any
11 other project. This amount shall *not* be subject to the *I Maga'lahen Guahan's*
12 transfer authority, and that any remaining balance from this appropriation shall
13 revert back to the General Fund.

14 **Section 4.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, §§4 and 5 of
15 Public Law Number 24-215 are hereby *repealed*.

Committee Report

Bill No. 565(LS)

"An act to appropriate the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) from the General Fund to the University of Guam Reserve Officers Training Corp for the purposes of constructing a rappelling tower."

I. OVERVIEW:

The Committee on Finance and Taxation held a public hearing on Wednesday, June 17, 1998 at 1:30 p.m. in the legislative public hearing room to hear public testimony on *Bill No. 565*. Public Notice was announced and published in the Saturday, June 13, 1998 and Tuesday, June 16, 1998 issues of the Pacific Daily News.

SUMMARY OF TESTIMONIES:

Capt Leon Guerrero , Lt. Mark Villagomez, and James Burke all testified in support of the bill. They emphasized that the loss of the repelling tower after 16 years is needed as it signifies determination and hardship that is used in the everyday training for cadets. They asked lawmakers to look favorably on the bill and submitted written testimony for further review.

Good Afternoon

Thank-you for the opportunity you are giving us, to consider rebuilding the University of Guam Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) rappel tower. As I start I would like to give you a few facts about the ROTC program:

- 1) Department of the Army approved the University of Guam ROTC program in August 24, 1979.
- 2) The first class was held in Fall semester 1980.
- 3) Since then the University of Guam ROTC program has graduated over 220 Second Lieutenants into the United States Army.
- 4) The University of Guam ROTC has received honors and awards such as "The Best in the Nation", "Top 40 in the Nation", "Winners Pacific Rim Ranger Challenge", "Outstanding Performance at Advance Camp" and as a result of achieving the statuses the Guam Legislature honored the cadets and cadre in presenting resolutions.

The Rappel tower is a needed training facility. As you will hear from 2LT Mark Villagomez it is more than a training facility.

Our students build their confidence and over come their fears. The biggest thing is that they do this before they go off island for their evaluation. The rappel towers gives us the opportunity we need to work with the cadets who need the extra time for over coming their fears.

UOG ROTC students are not the only ones who benefit from the tower. Both the Police and Fire Department use the tower, Both the Police and Fire academy use the tower. The National Guard and Army Reserve use the tower.

Once again, thank-you for your time and I hope for the sake of our future leaders that you approve the money for the tower.

The University of Guam Army ROTC program was established in 1979 with the first-graduating class to commission in 1983. The tradition and spirit of the Triton Warrior Battalion has carried itself from cadre to cadre over the years, in result producing quality officers in the United States Army today. The essential factor in which led to the success of those officers came from the specific and pertinent equipment used such as the rappel tower that confides confidence and trust when negotiated. The trust that is given to a fellow classmate lies in their hands as they are the safety person at the bottom of the rappel tower holding onto the end rope. If the safety of the person on rappel is threaten in any way, his or her safety relies greatly on the reaction of the safety person.

The rappel tower can do more than just embed confidence and trust in a cadet, it signifies the importance of team work and competency each and every cadet must successfully fulfill in order to negotiate the rappel tower. The rappel tower is more than just a structure placed on the university grounds, its silent expression standing tall over the University of Guam signifies the determination and hardship that each and every cadet goes through while attending the University. When a cadet passes or sees the rappel tower he or she knows that they have accomplished one of many obstacles in life. One of those obstacles is obtaining the tenacity and will power to over-come the fear that is implanted by nature, and that fear...is the fear of the unexpected.

With the resent devastation of super typhoon Paka, the University of Guam Army ROTC lost its rappel tower that stood tall for nearly 16 years. This rappel tower was made from wood and lasted for an extensive amount of time. This year we ask for your assistance on allocating the needed funding to build a new rappel tower to last for an undetermined amount of years to stand tall over the university and represent leadership excellence among the Triton Warrior Battalion.
