Enclosed please find a copy of Substitute Bill No. 158 LS), "AN ACT TO REPEAL AND RE-ENACT §3122 OF CHAPTER 3, AND §80102, §80103, §80104, §80106, §80108, §80109, §80111, §80113, §80116, §80117, §80118 AND §80119 OF CHAPTER 80, OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE OPERATIONS OF THE GUAM PUBLIC LIBRARY.", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-41.

This legislation modernizes our statutes relative to the Guam Public Library System. When the library was first opened in 1949, there was only 1 library building in Agana. Since that time, the Guam Public Library has grown to 6 libraries. It is no longer 2 Quonset huts near the Azotea in the Plaza de España, nor even 1 concrete building on Martyr Street. We are entering an era of integrative technology encompassing the use of computers and the Internet as well as printed and bound books. To reflect these ever-changing times, our library will now be known as the "Guam Public Library System", and the Agana Branch of that system will be known as the "Nieves M. Flores Memorial Library".

AN ACT TO REPEAL AND RE-ENACT §3122 OF CHAPTER 3, AND §80102, §80103, §80104, §80106, §80108, §80109, §80111, §80113, §80116, §80117, §80118 AND §80119 OF CHAPTER 80, OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE OPERATIONS OF THE GUAM PUBLIC LIBRARY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

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Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. It is the finding of the 2 Guam Legislature that the Guam Public Library, which opened its doors on 3 January 31, 1949, was officially named the Nieves M. Flores Memorial Library 4 in June of that year. The Library was housed in two (2) quonset huts in 5 Agana near the Azotea, and was opened twenty (20) hours each week. It was 6 staffed by a head librarian and two (2) part-time helpers. 7 Legislature also finds that during the first decade the Library had a steady 8 growth and the staff and collection increased proportionally. The Guam 9 Legislature further finds that the Library was transferred out of the 10 Department of Education in 1954 and established as a separate government 11 agency, governed by a five (5) member board, appointed by the Governor and 12 confirmed by the Guam Legislature. By the end of the 1950's, the Library 13 doubled the number of books and the staff increased threefold. However, it 14 was still a very small Library with limited services. In the years that followed, 15 there was tremendous growth in the Library's collection and staff, and 16 17 expansion in the number of villages served and in the number and types of services offered to the public. It is the intent of the Guam Legislature to 18 update the present statute to address the changes and expansion in the Guam 19 20 Public Library that have occurred over the last four (4) decades."

Section 2. Section 3122 of Chapter 3 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated is repealed and re-enacted to read:

"Section 3122. Guam Public Library System. (a) There is within the government of Guam a Guam Public Library System, herein referred to as the *Library System*, which shall be a separate agency of the government of Guam. The title of all Library System's property is and shall continue to be in the government of Guam. All references made to

the term "Library" in this Section, and Sections within Chapter 80 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, shall mean the Library System.

- (b) The Library System shall be under the general cognizance of the Guam Public Library Board, hereinafter referred to as the *Board*, which shall have the authority, power and responsibility for the administration and operation of the Guam Public Library System.
- (c) The Board shall appoint a Director who shall perform such executive functions in connection with the operation of the Library System as may be designated by the Board, and who shall serve as executive secretary of the Board without additional compensation. The Director shall, with the concurrence of the Board, appoint a Deputy Director who shall be in the unclassified service and who shall be a librarian, as defined by the Library System's minimum knowledge, abilities and skills qualifications for a librarian position."

Section 3. Section 80102, §80103, §80104, §80106, §80108, §80109, §80111, §80113, §80116, §80117, §80118 and §80119 of Chapter 80 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated are repealed and re-enacted to read:

"Section 80102. Name. The Agana Branch Library within the Guam Public Library System shall have the name "Nieves M. Flores Memorial Library."

Section 80103. Use. All the libraries in the Library System shall be available for use by all persons in Guam in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Board. However, the Board shall have the authority to impose fines for lost books, late return of books or other misuses of the library resources. The Board shall also have the authority to establish fees for other services provided by the library pursuant to the provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Law.

Section 80104. Collection of Locally Authored Books and Materials. The Library System is hereby authorized to actively solicit or purchase, if necessary, books and written matter authored by local residents which contain information of significant historical and cultural value to the people of Guam. The Library System shall insure that all materials so acquired will benefit the people of Guam and the Library System's Guam collection. The Board shall establish and promulgate rules and regulations pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law for the implementation of this Section. The Library System is authorized to request funds for the implementation of the provisions of this Section to be included in the Library System's annual budget request submitted to the Governor for submission to the Guam Legislature.

Section 80106. Library Board Members. The Board shall be composed of seven (7) members, of which one (1) member shall be a secondary student, in compliance with Public Law No. 22-160, Section 7, to be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Guam Legislature.

Section 80108. Library Board Chairperson. The Board shall annually elect at the first meeting of each fiscal year, a chairperson from among its members.

Section 80109. Board Meetings. Meetings of the Board shall be open to the public and held at a regular time and place each month. Special meetings may be called by the Chairperson, and, at his discretion, shall be open or closed.

Section 80111. Acts of the Board. The concurrence of four (4) members of the Board shall be necessary for the validity of its official actions, including the election of the Chairperson.

Section 80113. Report to the Governor. The Board shall make an annual report to the Governor with respect to its activities, financial status, the condition of the Library System, and recommendations as to future operations.

Section 80116. Selection of Employees. Employees of the Library System, except for the Director and Deputy Director, shall be appointed, paid and hold their positions pursuant to the provisions of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, and other personnel laws, and their remuneration shall be established in accordance with the provisions of said Title 4 and such other personnel laws. The salary of the Director and Deputy Director shall be established by the Civil Service Commission.

Section 80117. Gifts to the Library System. The Board shall have authority to accept on behalf of, and in the name of, the government of Guam from any government or agency thereof, or any person, advisory services, grants-in-aids, gifts, donations of money and other property for the benefit of the Library System, or the Guam Archives; provided, that any grants-in-aid, gifts, donations or other form of assistance involving an obligation on the part of the Library System or the Guam Archives or the government of Guam shall require the approval of the Governor.

Section 80118. Custody of Funds. Funds received by the Library System pursuant to §§80103 and 80117 of this Chapter shall be for the

exclusive use of the library system and shall be kept in the custody of the Treasurer of Guam and disbursed under authority of the Board.

Section 80119. Rules and Regulations. The Board shall prepare rules and regulations for the government of the Library System in pursuance to the provisions of this Chapter, including, if deemed desirable, provisions for the following: registration fees, deposits by borrowers, fines for failure to return borrowings on time, charges for damaged or destroyed borrowings, pursuant to the provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Law."
