## AN ACT TO AMEND §4402 OF TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO AMENDING THE VOTE REQUIREMENTS BY THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

**Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** It is the finding of this Legislature that the current regulation that the Civil Service Commission requires a quorum of four (4) commissioners to conduct board meetings and a vote of four (4) commissioners for any action often results in a requirement of an unrealistically high percentage of votes for any action taken by the Commission to pass.

7 The intent of this legislation is to give the Civil Service Commission the 8 flexibility to make rulings based on those commissioners who had the 9 opportunity to hear the case presented. In order to do this, this Legislature 10 recognizes the need to give those commissioners present at a hearing the 11 authority to make decisions regarding those cases.

Section 2. Section 4402 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated ishereby amended to read:

14 "Section 4402. Quorum. The quorum of the Commission shall be
15 four (4) members. The vote of a simple majority of the Commission
16 members present shall be required for any action of the Commission.
17 The Commission may adopt rules to govern its procedures."

Enclosed please find Bill No. 266 (COR), "AN ACT TO AMEND §4402 OF TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO AMENDING THE VOTE REQUIREMENTS BY THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION", which I have vetoed.

This bill is unnecessary tampering with the merit system. There is currently a full compliment of persons serving on the Civil Service Commission. There are 7 members. Reducing the number of votes necessary to make decisions will only encourage members to miss meetings and will place the fate of public employees in the hands of only 3 people.

I believe that the merit system must be protected, and that changes to the system which disadvantage employees should not be instituted.

## <u>BILL NO. 266</u>

"An Act to Amend §4402, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Amending the Vote Requirements by the Civil Service Commission"

## I. PUBLIC HEARING

The Committee on Power, Foreign Affairs & General Government Services (CPFA&GGS) held a public hearing on Friday June 20, 1997, at 9:00 a.m. to hear testimony on Bill No. 266, "An Act to Amend §4402, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Amending the Vote Requirements by the Civil Service Commission".

The hearing was called to order by Senator Felix P. Camacho, Chairman of CPFA&GGS. Members present included Senators Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Edwardo Cruz, Francisco P. Camacho, Vicente Pangelinan, Tom Ada and Senator Lou Leon Guerrero, as guest.

Present to testify were Ms. Maria Sudo, Acting Executive Director of the CSC, Mr. Richard Untalan, Chairman of the CSC, and Mr. Luis Baza, CSC staff.

## II. BACKGROUND

The Guam Civil Service Commission, as an advocate of the merit system for classified employees within the Government of Guam, is charged with ruling on employee related adverse action initiatives. The CSC finds while four members are required to set a quorum, not all same four members appear to hear each case from start to finish and take action on the matter beforehand. One or more members may elect to abstain from voting in such cases and impede its timely resolution.

## III. TESTIMONY

Ms. Maria Sudo, Acting Executive Director of the Guam Civil Service Commission, who has offered written testimony states her testimony defends the need to change the law to require a majority vote of members present to take action on matters before the commission instead of the current rule of four. This bill facilitates the voting process and is beneficial to the appellant in adverse action cases.

Mr. Richard Untalan and Mr. Luis Baza were present to assist Ms. Sudo in her presentation. In a follow up call to CSC, Mr. Baza maintains that the Chairman establishes whether a quorum exists <u>prior</u> to hearing a case. As an example, if four members attended a meeting and one member excused himself due to a conflict of interest a quorum would no longer exist.

Senator Felix P. Camacho, Chairman, stated he introduced this bill to facilitate the voting process of the Commission. The Senator also says the simple majority guarantees three votes are required before any action is taken by the CSC with only four members present.

Senator Tom Ada objected to the simple majority concept on the bill and asked whether it would be best to require at least three votes for action to be taken by the Commission. Senator Ada suggested language be inserted that governs the vote requirement when a quorum of four exists and a member is absent at the time for voting.

Senator Pangelinan wanted to know how many cases could be cited that the CSC could show it benefited the appellant if this bill was passed years ago. The CSC states that there have been no problems securing four votes no matter how many members were present at meetings.

**BBMR** granted a June 18, 1997, waiver of fiscal note because Bill No. 266 is administrative in nature.

#### **IV. FINDINGS**

The Committee finds that Bill No. 266 can be reported out without changes.

#### V. RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Power, Foreign Affairs & General Government Services hereby reports out Bill No. 266 with the recommendation TO DO PASS.

Dear Senator Camacho:

The Civil Service Commission thanks you for the opportunity to provide written testimony on Bill No. 266.

The Commission supports the change of requiring a majority vote of the quorum for any action of the Commission instead of the rule of four. [The Rule of Four (4) is beneficial to the Appellant in adverse action cases and to Management in grievances and EEO cases.] The majority vote of the quorum will better serve the decision-making process by making it easier to obtain votes. This is especially true in adverse action appeals, grievances, and other adjudication cases. Depending on the nature of the proceeding, it is difficult for either party to secure favorable decisions with the requirement of four (4) concurring votes. The majority vote of the quorum will facilitate voting. Therefore, the Commission supports the amendment of 4 GCA §4402.

The Civil Service Commission supports any endeavor that better serves the Government of Guam and its employees. Our office appreciates the opportunity to present comments before your committee.
