Dear Speaker Unpingco:

Enclosed please find a copy of Bill No. 299 (COR), "AN ACT TO AMEND §§2 AND 3 OF P.L. 24-36, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING LEGISLATIVE APPROVAL OF ANY PLAN TO PRIVATIZE THE GUAM TELEPHONE AUTHORITY ('GTA')", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-64.

This legislation deletes the requirement of Public Law No. 24-36 that the Guam Legislature have 7 legislative days in addition to 90 calendar days to review a privatization plan for Guam Telephone Authority (GTA). The 7 legislative days are very indefinite in nature, unlike calendar day, and including legislative days in any time limit would disrupt any possible negotiation relative to privatization of GTA.

I am pleased to sign this legislation into law.

AN ACT TO AMEND §§2 AND 3 OF P.L. NO. 24-36, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING LEGISLATIVE APPROVAL OF ANY PLAN TO PRIVATIZE THE GUAM TELEPHONE AUTHORITY ("GTA").

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law Number 24-36 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. Approval of Privatization Plan of Action. The Task Force shall submit to the Guam Legislature a specific Plan of Action for the privatization of GTA, which shall include the terms of reference, or parameters of any sale agreement. The Guam Legislature shall have up to ninety (90) calendar days after receipt by the Legislative Secretary to review and amend the plan as appropriate, and approve or disapprove the plan."

Section 2. Section 3 of Public Law Number 24-36 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 3. Approval of Privatization Contract. In the event the approved privatization plan calls for a sale of the assets of GTA, the GTA Board is authorized to begin non-binding negotiations with qualified potential investors. The GTA Board shall submit the final agreement to the Guam Legislature which, shall have up to ninety (90) calendar days after receipt by the Legislative Secretary to approve or disapprove the agreement."


COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION
