Dear Legislative Secretary Brown:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 404 (COR), "AN ACT TO ADD §§62104.1 – 62104.6, TO REPEAL §§63126 AND 63126.1; TO REPEAL AND REENACT §§63101(e), 63121, 63122, 63127(h), 63127(i) AND 63127(j), AND TO AMEND ARTICLE 4 OF CHAPTER 61 OF TITLE 5, ALL OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO LIVESTOCK STANDARDS AND DOMESTICATION OF ANIMALS ON GUAM," which I have signed into law as Public Law No. 25-186.

This legislation updates the law relative to the treatment of domesticated animals. It allows certain animals found in the wild to be domesticated, such as Guam deer, pigs, and carabao. It provides standards for the care of domesticated animals, namely proper provision of food and liquid, freedom of movement, safe transportation, protection from the environment, and so forth.

This legislation also amends the branding laws of Guam, to update them and provide for a "Livestock Fund" to administer the requirements of the law.

Section 61407. Denial of Registration. The Department shall deny the registration of any brand which is identical to any brand previously registered, or which is easily altered from the brand of another. No brand shall be registered which is formed by representation of any letter, number or figure which has been previously registered, or which is a solid brand, or which is described as being on either side of an animal, or composed of single letters or figures, or of more than three (3) letters or figures. The location of the brand on the animal shall be considered as part of the brand, and no brand shall be registered which does *not* describe such location.

Section 61408. Procedure *After* **Denial.** Upon denial of any application for registration of brand, the application shall be returned to the applicant, together with a statement of the reason(s) for rejection. Another application may then be filed for a different brand.

Section 61409. Use of Brand.

- (a) No person shall apply any brand to any livestock or other animal without the permission of the owner of the brand.
- (b) No person shall apply any brand to any livestock or other animal *not* owned by that person without the permission of the owner of such animal.
- (c) No person shall apply a brand to any livestock or other animal *unless* Guam Veterinarian, or his authorized agent is present.

Section 61410. Transfer of Brand. A registered brand may be transferred to another person by application of the owner of the brand and the proposed transferee, and surrender of the original certificate of brand registration to the Department. The Department shall thereupon issue a new certificate of brand registration upon payment of a fee of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars.

Section 61411. Transfer/Sale of Livestock. Any person who purchases or acquires livestock must brand such animals *no later than* thirty (30) calendar days after acquisition. Previously branded animals *not* intended for slaughter within thirty (30) calendar days of acquisition must be reregistered with the Department. An affidavit of livestock transfer indicating the transaction will be issued to the buyer. All brands must be registered with the Department.

Section 61412. Chief Brand Inspector. The Director of Agriculture shall designate one (1) or more employees of the Department to serve as Chief Brand Inspector and Deputy Brand Inspector, respectively, who will enforce the laws and regulations pertaining to branding of livestock and undertake any other related duties assigned by the Director. Nothing herein shall be construed, however, to limit the authority and responsibility of the Guam Police Department in regard to criminal enforcement.

Section 61413. Assistance by Department. The Department shall disseminate information to interested persons relative to branding requirements and procedure, and may assist owners in the branding of

(b) 'Brand' means any permanent tag, mark, sign, or symbol placed upon or implanted in livestock for the purpose of identifying the owner thereof.

Section 61402. Name. This Article may be cited as the 'Branding Law of 2000.'

Section 61403. Branding Mandatory. No person shall own any livestock which does *not* carry the registered brand of such owner as required by this Article.

Section 61404. Time Limit for Branding. All livestock shall be branded within ninety (90) calendar days of the date of birth, or one (1) month after acquisition, whichever is later.

Section 61405. Brand to be Registered. No person shall use any brand which has not been registered with the Department of Agriculture.

Section 61406. Registration. Application for registration of brands shall be made on a form furnished by the Department. *If* said application is approved, the Department shall forthwith issue to the applicant a certificate of brand registration upon payment of a fee of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars. Brands registered with the Department *prior to* the Year 2000 must be re-registered with the Department to be valid. Upon receipt of the certificate of brand registration, the applicant is responsible for making the applicant's own brand, or having one made for that person.

Section 61407. Denial of Registration. The Department shall deny the registration of any brand which is identical to any brand previously registered, or which is easily altered from the brand of another. No brand shall be registered which is formed by representation of any letter, number or figure which has been previously registered, or which is a solid brand, or which is described as being on either side of an animal, or composed of single letters or figures, or of more than three (3) letters or figures. The location of the brand on the animal shall be considered as part of the brand, and no brand shall be registered which does *not* describe such location.

Section 61408. Procedure After Denial. Upon denial of any application for registration of brand, the application shall be returned to the applicant, together with a statement of the reason(s) for rejection. Another application may then be filed for a different brand.

Section 61409. Use of Brand.

- (a) No person shall apply any brand to any livestock or other animal without the permission of the owner of the brand.
- (b) No person shall apply any brand to any livestock or other animal *not* owned by that person without the permission of the owner of such animal.
- (c) No person shall apply a brand to any livestock or other animal *unless* Guam Veterinarian, or his authorized agent is present.

Section 61410. Transfer of Brand. A registered brand may be transferred to another person by application of the owner of the brand and the proposed transferee, and surrender of the original certificate of brand registration to the Department. The Department shall thereupon issue a new certificate of brand registration upon payment of a fee of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars.

Section 61411. Transfer/Sale of Livestock. Any person who purchases or acquires livestock must brand such animals *no later than* thirty (30) calendar days after acquisition. Previously branded animals *not* intended for slaughter within thirty (30) calendar days of acquisition must be reregistered with the Department. An affidavit of livestock transfer indicating the transaction will be issued to the buyer. All brands must be registered with the Department.

Section 61412. Chief Brand Inspector. The Director of Agriculture shall designate one (1) or more employees of the Department to serve as Chief Brand Inspector and Deputy Brand Inspector, respectively, who will enforce the laws and regulations pertaining to branding of livestock and undertake any other related duties assigned by the Director. Nothing herein shall be construed, however, to limit the authority and responsibility of the Guam Police Department in regard to criminal enforcement.

Section 61413. Assistance by Department. The Department shall disseminate information to interested persons relative to branding requirements and procedure, and may assist owners in the branding of

their livestock and charge a reasonable fee thereof as prescribed by regulations.

Section 61414. Regulations. Regulations implementing this Article shall be formulated, approved and issued in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act to carry out the purposes of this Article.

Section 61415. Penalty. Any person violating any Section of this Article is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punishable by a fine of *not less than* Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment of *not more than* ninety (90) days, or by both fine and imprisonment.

Section 61416. Livestock Fund. (a) There is hereby established a fund to be known as the 'Livestock Fund,' which shall be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam, and independent records and accounts shall be maintained in connection herewith. All license fees collected under this Article shall be deposited into said Fund.

(b) The Livestock Fund shall be used exclusively for the purpose of the administration of this Article. Said Fund shall be examined and reported upon by the Director of Administration as required by law."

Committee Report July 18, 2000

The Committee on Land, Agriculture, Military Affairs & the Arts held a public hearing on July 18, 2000 at the Public Hearing Room in the Legislative Building. The hearing was called to order at 9:00 a.m., by the Chairman, Senator Marcel G. Camacho.

Present for the hearing were Senators Lawrence Kasperbauer and Senator Ben Pangelinan.

BIII NO. 404 (COR): AN ACT TO REPEAL §63126 AND 63126.1 OF TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AND TO ADD NEW §§62104.1, 62104.2, 62104.3, 62104.4, 62104.5, AND 62104.6 OF TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO DOMESTICATION OF DEER AS LIVESTOCK AND STANDARDS OF CARE FOR LIVESTOCK.

Testimony Submitted by:

Dana T. Lujan Dr. Steve Nusbaum Oral/Written Oral

Summary of Testimonies:

The Chairman deferred to Senator Kasperbauer, the author of the Bill, for a brief summary.

Senator Kasperbauer stated that the Legislature passed a bill into law, that would allow for the domestication of deer along with other animals defined as livestock. The legislation called for the Department of Agriculture to develop the rules and regulations for the care of the deer that would be raised as livestock. Also, in the process of interacting with the Department of Agriculture personnel, it was felt that there is no longer any need to have the previous requirements for raising deer as pets. The provisions in the law that provide for caring for the deer as livestock more than adequately covers the raising of deer as pets.

The Chairman recognized Dana Lujan and Dr. Steve Nusbaum from the Division of Aquatic & Wildlife Resources for the Department of Agriculture.

Dana Lujan stated that in working with Senator Kasperbauer's office and consulting with Dr. Nusbaum and the Chief Conservation Officer, they came up with some changes, deletions, and additions to the bill that they felt were necessary. He submitted a list of their recommendations for a substitute bill.

Dana highlighted the main changes to the bill. 1) Changing domestication of <u>deer</u> as livestock to <u>game</u>. This would cover all wild animals and birds and any future species that may be feral and get back into the wild. He noted that there is a definition of game in the statue that exists today. 2) Including the word <u>feral</u> because there are a lot of people who are unclear of the difference between wild and feral. Wild is something that's been in a wild state and feral is something that was previously domesticated and then returned to its wild state. 3) Adding regulating the trapping and capture of game for the purposes of domestication. This would authorize the department to promulgate regulations concerning the trapping of game. Dana stated that they fully support the bill.

Dr. Steve Nusbaum stated that his reason for supporting the bill is from a different perspective. That being incorporating standards of care for livestock. He noted that as the government veterinarian, he receives a fair number of calls involving animal negligence. Animals are not being cared for properly as far as simple husbandry practices and veterinary care. He noted that if this bill is passed it would give them the ability to go out and talk to the people with more force than they've had in the past. Dr. Nusbaum then commented on his concern regarding the method that would be used to capture deer. He has witnessed all types of inhumane things that have gone wrong in the past. He noted that box traps would be one option which is fairly humane, but other ways such as snare, netting, and the practice of shooting the doe and the fawn before it has been weaned disturbs him. He doesn't have the answers at this point, but stated he will be able to go out and by observing will come up with some suggestions for the future that he thinks will be helpful for all concerned.

The Chairman asked for clarification on section 7 which adds subsection I to set a fee for any licensed issued; however, in no event shall such fee exceed the sum of \$500. In what case would you charge a \$500 license fee and has it ever gotten that high?

Dana explained that the reason this was underlined as a change was because the lettering was shifted, however nothing was changed, it is already existing in the law. This allows us to charge up to \$500, but doubt that amount would every be charged.

Dana noted that he has been talking to AAFB officials regarding trapping. There are areas where the animal populations are skyrocketing out of control. This bill will allow for trapping which would help alleviate some of the problems.

There being no other testimony, the Chairman stated that Bill No. 404 (COR) has been publicly heard.

Committee Findings and Recommendation: The Committee finds that the standards covering the domestication of deer as a pet and as livestock are identical. Bill 404 will incorporate both pet and livestock under a more defined and detailed standard of care for livestock. The Committee also incorporated the testimony of Dr. Steve Nusbaum's, relative to the trapping or capturing of wild animals. In the process of updating the law it was clear to the Committee that Guam's Branding law should also be amended to be consistent with the new standard for livestock.

The Committee on Land, Agriculture, Military Affairs and the Arts to which was referred Bill No. 404 (COR) wishes to report back its **recommendation** to **do pass** Bill No. 404 (COR) as substituted by the Committee.

"§62104.1 Domestication of Guam deer, wild and feral pigs, and feral Asiatic water buffalo (carabao) as livestock. Residents of Guam are authorized to raise Guam deer, wild and feral pigs, and feral Asiatic water buffalo (carabao) as livestock. Nothing herein shall prevent residents of Guam from raising Guam deer, wild and feral pigs, and feral Asiatic water buffalo (carabao) as pets, however, all laws, rules and regulations that apply to raising game as livestock shall apply to raising Guam deer, wild and feral pigs, and feral Asiatic water buffalo (carabao) as pets.

- §62104.3. Standards of care for livestock. The following general standards of care apply to the keeping of all livestock and poultry:

Animals shall be housed or kept and provided with food, water, and care, in a manner which, having regard to their species and to their degree of development, adaptation, and domestication, is appropriate to their physiological and ethological needs in accordance with established experience and scientific knowledge.
- (b) Specific elements of care. In addition to Subsection (a), the lighting, temperature, humidity, air circulation, ventilation, and other environmental conditions, such as gas concentration or noise intensity, shall conform to the animals physiological and ethological needs in accordance with established experience and scientific knowledge.



Public Law 25-30 regarding the domestication of deer as livestock has created many problems concerning keeping deer as pets, acquisition of deer, livestock care and conflicting laws and/or regulations. Section 63126 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated authorizes residents to keep deer as pets; however, there is no prohibition against people making pets out of their livestock. Therefore, the retention of §63126 is somewhat redundant and will create an unnecessary burden on the Department as well as the public.

Since the enactment of 25-30, the Department has received numerous inquiries regarding the acquisition of deer for the purposes of livestock. Section 63121 of 5 GCA makes it unlawful for any person to take, buy, sell, transport or possess any wild animal. An amendment to this section is needed to allow residents to obtain deer in the wild for the purposes of domestication. In addition, the amendment of §63127 5 GCA to authorize the Department to promulgate regulations for the trapping of wild animals is required.

Public Law 25-30 lacked regulations concerning the standards of care for livestock. Regulations in this regard are needed to safeguard the welfare of all livestock and reduce the potential for animal abuse. Animal welfare regulations have been lacking in Guam Law for much too long.

Discussions with the Territorial Veterinarian and Chief Conservation Officer have led to the rational that the Territory of Guam should authorize the domestication of all wild and feral animals unless prohibited by Territorial and Federal laws and statutes. The Department will regulate what species can be trapped and the appropriate methods for trapping. This would allow the public to trap and domesticate feral Asiatic water buffalo (carabao) and feral pigs. The Department occasionally receives requests concerning the capture of feral carabao for the purposes of domestication. In addition, residents continue to trap and keep feral pigs without the proper permits. These animals, as well as deer, heavily contribute to the habitat degradation occurring in Guam's native forests. A reduction in population levels is needed to abate further destruction. Although public hunting is the primary tool used to manage such populations, trapping for the purposes of domestication will allow residents to utilize these resources for livestock. Authorizing the domestication of such animals will benefit the public, as well as the Department because of the habitat degradation issues attributed to these animals. Therefore, the domestication of "game" is warranted.

Bill No. 404 will resolve the conflicts created when 25-30 was enacted. The passage of this bill will indeed assist the Department in clarifying issues regarding the domestication of deer and other wild animals.

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
