AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 2101 AND 22305; AND TO ADD §§ 2101.1, 2101.2 AND 2101.3 TO TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AND TO AMEND §§ 2, 3(b) AND 4 OF P.L. NO. 26-135, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE GUAM STATE CLEARINGHOUSE AND VESTING I SEGUNDU NA MAGA'LAHI WITH AUTHORITY OVER THE STATE CLEARINGHOUSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*finds that there is a need to establish a single and centralized clearinghouse
within the government of Guam responsible for overseeing all Federal aid

1 programs, grants, loans, direct Federal development, and other Federal funding sources for Guam. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that, particularly in 2 3 light of the present dire financial situations of the government, it is of critical 4 importance to identify, track and oversee the process of obtaining and 5 receiving sources of Federal funding for Guam, and to ensure that the 6 government of Guam's relationship and rapport with Federal agencies and instrumentalities administering such funding is accorded the highest level of 7 8 importance. Accordingly, it is important that responsibility for these matters is vested at the highest levels of the Executive Branch of government. 9

Section 2. Section 2101 of Chapter 2 of Title 5 of the Guam Code
Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

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"Section 2101. Creation of the Guam State Clearinghouse.

13 There is within the Office of *I Segundu Na Maga'lahi* a bureau of the 14 government of Guam which shall be known as the '*Guam State* 15 *Clearinghouse.*'

16 Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the Guam 17 State Clearinghouse shall have *exclusive* purview at the Guam-level over all 18 Federal aid programs, grants, loans, contracts, contributions, appropriations, 19 advances, direct Federal development and other Federal funding sources for 20 Guam. The Guam State Clearinghouse shall be headed by a Director, who 21 shall be *I Segundu Na Maga'lahi*, who shall determine the positions and 22 staffing pattern of the Guam State Clearinghouse."

23 Section 3. Section 2101.1 is hereby *added* to Chapter 2 of Title 5 of the
24 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Section 2101.1. Duties and Responsibilities of the Guam State Clearinghouse. In addition to the duties and responsibilities of the Guam State Clearinghouse as may be prescribed by *I Segundu Na Maga'lahi*, or by law, the Guam State Clearinghouse shall also have the following duties and responsibilities:

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(a) Administer the initiation, coordination and review process of all activities within Guam involving Federal financial assistance.

(b) Ensure that grant proposals for Federal assistance are in accordance with plans, policies, programs, objectives and procedures of the government of Guam.

12 (c) Ensure that proposed projects for which Federal 13 financial assistance is sought are fiscally and environmentally 14 sound and are in compliance with all applicable Federal laws.

(d) Ensure that the government of Guam complies with all
applicable Federal laws relating to Federal financial assistance and
that there exists sound tracking, management, and financial
accountability for all Federal programs awarded to the
government of Guam.

(e) Perform cost analysis on all Federal aid programs,
grants, loans, contracts, contributions, advances, direct Federal
development, or other Federal funding for the financial impact on
the government of Guam's General Fund or special funds used to
fund the local matching requirement as prescribed by Federal law;

and the financial impact on the government of Guam for the continuation of the Federal program should the Federal funding expire and require the government of Guam to financially assume the program's operation one hundred percent (100%).

With the exception of the Guam Community College 5 (f) and the University of Guam, and notwithstanding any other 6 provision of law to the contrary, no application for any Federal aid 7 8 programs, grants, loans, contracts, contributions, advances, direct 9 Federal development, or other Federal funding shall be submitted or deemed approved on behalf of the government of Guam or any 10 agency, division, office, department or instrumentality thereof, or 11 12 any public corporation, without the final approval of the Director of the Guam State Clearinghouse. 13

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14(g) I Segundu Na Maga'lahi may delegate any of the15foregoing duties and responsibilities to any entity, officer or16employee of the government of Guam."

Section 4. Section 2101.2 is hereby *added* to Chapter 2 of Title 5 of the
Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Section 2101.2. Transition. Sixty (60) days after this Act
shall become law, any and all powers previously held by the Bureau of
Budget and Management Research ('BBMR'), and any other agency,
council, board, office, officer or instrumentality of the government of
Guam, or any public corporation, including, but *not* limited to, the
Department of Administration, the Department of Agriculture, the

Council on the Arts and Humanities, I Dipattamenton I Kaohao Guinahan 1 2 Chamorro, the Department of Public Health and Social Services, the 3 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, the Guam Economic Development and 4 5 Commerce Authority, the Guam Health Coordinating Council, and the 6 Hag'atna Restoration and Development Authority, with regard to the 7 application for, receipt, disbursement, administration, oversight and review of any Federal aid programs, grants, loans, contracts, 8 contributions, advances, direct Federal development, and other Federal 9 funding sources for Guam, shall cease and shall thereupon be assumed 10 by the Guam State Clearinghouse. 11

12 Not later than sixty (60) days after this Act shall become law, all councils, 13 departments, boards, divisions, offices agencies, or 14 instrumentalities of the government of Guam, and all public 15 corporations, shall submit to *I Segundu Na Maga'lahi* a full and complete listing of all existing Federal aid programs, grants, loans, contracts, 16 contributions, advances, direct Federal development, and any other 17 Federal funding sources over which each respective agency, 18 department, council, board, division, office, public corporation or 19 instrumentality has been involved in overseeing, administering or 20 21 reviewing.

Each such agency, department, division, office, public corporation or instrumentality shall render its full cooperation and assistance to *I Segundu Na Maga'lahi* to facilitate the transfer of authority over such

programs, grants, loans, contracts, contributions, advances, direct
 Federal development and any other Federal funding sources to the
 Guam State Clearinghouse."

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4 Section 5. Section 2101.3 is hereby *added* to Chapter 2 of Title 5 of the
5 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

6 "Section 2101.3. The University of Guam and the Guam 7 Community College shall be exempted from the provisions prescribed 8 in §§ 2101, 2101.1 and 2101.2 of Chapter 2, Division 1 of Title 5 of the 9 Guam Code Annotated. *However*, the Presidents of the University of 10 Guam and the Guam Community College shall separately perform the 11 following duties and responsibilities:

- 12 (i) administer the initiation, coordination and review
 13 process of all activities within the institution
 14 involving Federal financial assistance;
- (ii) ensure that grant proposals for Federal assistance
 are in accordance with plans, policies, programs,
 objectives and procedures of the government of
 Guam;
- 19(iii) ensure that proposed projects for which Federal20financial assistance is sought are fiscally and21environmentally sound and are in compliance with22all applicable Federal laws;
- (iv) ensure that the institution complies with allapplicable Federal laws relating to Federal financial

assistance and that there exists sound tracking, management, and financial accountability for all Federal Programs awarded to the institution;

perform cost analysis on all Federal aid programs, 4 (v)grants, loans, contracts, contributions, advances, 5 direct Federal development, or other Federal 6 7 funding that the institution is applying for, for the 8 financial impact on the institution and the government of Guam's General Fund or special 9 funds used to fund the local matching requirement 10 as prescribed by Federal law; and the financial 11 12 impact on the institution and the government of Guam for the continuation of the Federal program 13 should the Federal funding expire and require the 14 government of Guam to financially assume the 15 program's operation one hundred percent (100%); 16 17 and

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- 18(vi)the Presidents of the University of Guam and the19Guam Community College may delegate any of the20foregoing duties and responsibilities to any officers21or employees of their respective institution."
- Section 6. Section 22305 of Article 3, Chapter 22, Division 2 of Title 5 of
 the Guam Code Annotated is hereby a*mended* to read as follows:

"Section 22305. General Fund Protected. 1 To insure that the General Fund will not be burdened with expenditures for Federal 2 projects, an agency head responsible for administering any Federal 3 funds shall submit to the Director of the Guam State Clearinghouse on 4 the 30th of each month a report on expenditures incurred for Federal 5 programs for the preceding month. Said report shall be certified by the 6 agency head for accuracy and compliance with all applicable laws and 7 8 regulations governing administration of the programs.

9 The form and details of this report shall be prescribed by the 10 Director of the Guam State Clearinghouse. The Director of the Guam 11 State Clearinghouse shall promptly discontinue disbursement of funds 12 for Federal programs for noncompliance by agencies with these 13 reporting and certification requirements."

Section 7. Section 2 of Public Law Number 26-135 is hereby *amended* to
read as follows:

There 16 "Section 2. Creation of Work Group. is hereby created a work group to be known as the 'Advance Direct Collection 17 of Funds to Operate and Implement Federal Programs and Grant 18 Awards Work Group' ('Advance Federal Funding Work Group') 19 under the purview of the Director of the Guam State 20 21 Clearinghouse, which shall meet on a regular basis as necessary to accomplish its task. The Advance Federal Funding Work Group 22 shall consist of the Director of the Guam State Clearinghouse; the 23 Director of the Department of Administration; the Director of the 24

Bureau of Budget and Management Research; the Attorney General of Guam; the Public Auditor of Guam; and the Director of the Department of Public Health and Social Services.

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The Director of the Guam State Clearinghouse shall serve as the Chairperson of the Advance Federal Funding Work Group. The Directors of the Department of Administration and the Bureau of Budget and Management Research shall serve as deputy co-chairs of the Advance Federal Funding Work Group."

9 Section 8. Section 3(b) of Public Law Number 26-135 is hereby *amended*10 to read as follows:

"(b) The development of a comprehensive plan and all aspects of
the study shall be concluded *prior* to April 1, 2003. The Chairperson of
the Advance Federal Funding Work Group shall transmit to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a detailed report of the Advance Federal Funding
Work Group's findings and recommendations, *no later than* thirty (30)
days after April 1, 2003."

Section 9. Section 4 of Public Law Number 26-135 is hereby *amended* to
read as follows:

19 "Section 4. Work Group Ceased. The Advance Federal
20 Funding Work Group shall be dissolved *immediately* on June 30,
21 2003."

22 Section 10. Severability. *If* any provision of this Law or its 23 application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to 24 law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this

1 Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application,

2 and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.

I Guåhan Liheslaturan finds that there is a need to establish a single and centralized clearinghouse 3 within the government of Guam responsible for overseeing all federal aid 4 programs, grants, loans, direct federal development, and other federal 5 funding sources for Guam. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that, particularly in 6 light of the present dire financial situations of the government, it is of critical 7 importance to identify, track and oversee the process of obtaining and 8 receiving sources of federal funding for Guam, and to ensure that the 9 government of Guam's relationship and rapport, with federal agencies and 10 instrumentalities administering such funding is accorded the highest level of 11 importance. Accordingly, it is important that responsibility for these matters 12 are vested at the highest levels of the executive branch of government. 13

Section 2. Section 2101 of Chapter 2, Division 1, Title 5 of the Guam 1 Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows: 2 3 "§2101. Program Responsibilities of Lieutenant-Governor. The 4 Office of Lieutenant Governor shall have program responsibilities 5 including, but not limited to, the following: 6 (a) The Office of the Lieutenant Governor shall be designated as 7 the clearinghouse for all federal aid programs for Guam. As such, the 8 Lieutenant Governor shall be the liaison between the Executive Branch 9 of the government of Guam and the federal Regional Council and 10 federal agencies. All federal program commitments, state plans and 11 applications must have the initial review of the Bureau of Budget and 12 Management Research prior to their submission to the Lieutenant 13 Governor for final action. The Lieutenant Governor shall submit to the Speaker of the Legislature a list of all federally-aided programs or 14 15 projects covered in the clearinghouse review process. The Lieutenant 16 Governor shall keep the Speaker of the Legislature informed of the 17 nature of clearinghouse procedures. 18 (b) The Lieutenant Governor shall forward copies of all

19 clearinghouse comments on proposed federally assisted programs and
 20 projects, together with descriptions of proposed programs and projects,
 21 to the Speaker of the Legislature for purposes of information only and
 22 review. The Legislature may reject, by resolution, prior to grant award,
 23 a department or agency's participation in a federally assisted program
 24 or project upon determining that such program or project would be

adverse to the public interest, or that insufficient funds exist for local matching contribution.

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3 (c) The Lieutenant Governor shall notify in writing all federal
agencies located within the territory of Guam, including the armed
forces, that plans for direct federal development within the territory
shall be submitted to the clearinghouse and to the Territory's elected
officials for review and comment prior to implementation, as required
by Presidential Executive Order 12372.

9 (d) The Lieutenant Governor shall submit to the Legislature any 10 proposed capital improvement projects to be presented to the Federal 11 Government for direct congressional appropriation. The Legislature 12 shall reserve the right to approve or reject such proposals, and to 13 establish priorities for funding purposes.

Creation of Guam State Clearinghouse. There is within the 14 Office of the Lieutenant Governor a bureau of the government of Guam 15 which shall be known as the Guam State Clearinghouse. 16 Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the 17 Guam State Clearinghouse shall have exclusive purview at the territorial 18 level over all federal aid programs, grants, loans, contracts, 19 contributions, appropriations, advances, direct federal development, 20 and other federal funding sources for Guam. The Guam State 21 22 Clearinghouse shall be headed by a Director who shall be the Lieutenant Governor. The Lieutenant Governor shall determine the 23 positions and staffing pattern of the Guam State Clearinghouse." 24

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE GUAM STATE CLEARINGHOUSE AND VESTING THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR WITH AUTHORITY OVER THE STATE CLEARINGHOUSE.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan 3 finds that there is a need to establish a single and centralized clearinghouse 4 within the government of Guam responsible for overseeing all federal aid 5 programs, grants, loans, direct federal development, and other federal 6 funding sources for Guam. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that, particularly in 7 light of the present dire financial situations of the government, it is of critical 8 importance to identify, track and oversee the process of obtaining and 9 receiving sources of federal funding for Guam, and to ensure that the government of Guam's relationship and rapport, with federal agencies and 10 11 instrumentalities administering such funding is accorded the highest level of 12 importance. Accordingly, it is important that responsibility for these matters 13 are vested at the highest levels of the executive branch of government.

- Section 2. Section 2101 of Chapter 2, Division 1, Title 5 of the Guam
 Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:
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"§2101. -Program Responsibilities of Lieutenant Governor. The Office of Lieutenant Governor shall have program responsibilities including, but not limited to, the following:

6 (a) The Office of the Lieutenant Governor shall be designated as 7 the clearinghouse for all federal aid programs for Guam. As such, the 8 Lieutenant Governor shall be the liaison between the Executive Branch 9 of the government of Guam and the federal Regional Council and 10 federal agencies. All federal program commitments, state plans and 11 applications must have the initial review of the Bureau of Budget and 12 Management Research prior to their submission to the Lieutenant 13 Governor for final action. The Lieutenant Governor shall submit to the 14 Speaker of the Legislature a list of all federally-aided programs or 15 projects covered in the clearinghouse review process. The Lieutenant 16 Governor shall keep the Speaker of the Legislature informed of the 17 nature of clearinghouse procedures.

(b) The Lieutenant Governor shall forward copies of all
 clearinghouse comments on proposed federally assisted programs and
 projects, together with descriptions of proposed programs and projects,
 to the Speaker of the Legislature for purposes of information only and
 review. The Legislature may reject, by resolution, prior to grant award,
 a department or agency's participation in a federally assisted program
 or project upon determining that such program or project would be

adverse to the public interest, or that insufficient funds exist for local matching contribution.

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(c) The Lieutenant Governor shall notify in writing all federal
 agencies located within the territory of Guam, including the armed
 forces, that plans for direct federal development within the territory
 shall be submitted to the clearinghouse and to the Territory's elected
 officials for review and comment prior to implementation, as required
 by Presidential Executive Order 12372.

9 (d) The Lieutenant Governor shall submit to the Legislature any
 10 proposed capital improvement projects to be presented to the Federal
 11 Government for direct congressional appropriation. The Legislature
 12 shall reserve the right to approve or reject such proposals, and to
 13 establish priorities for funding purposes.

14 **Creation of Guam State Clearinghouse.** There is within the 15 Office of the Lieutenant Governor a bureau of the government of Guam which shall be known as the Guam State Clearinghouse. 16 17 Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the 18 Guam State Clearinghouse shall have exclusive purview at the territorial 19 level over all federal aid programs, grants, loans, contracts, 20 contributions, appropriations, advances, direct federal development, 21 and other federal funding sources for Guam. The Guam State 22 Clearinghouse shall be headed by a Director who shall be the 23 Lieutenant_Governor. The Lieutenant Governor shall determine the 24 positions and staffing pattern of the Guam State Clearinghouse."

Section 3. Section 2101.1 is hereby *added* to Chapter 2, Division I of
 Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

 development, or other federal funding for the financial impact on

the government of Guam's General Fund or special funds used to fund the local matching requirement as prescribed by federal law; and the financial impact on the government of Guam for the continuation of the federal program should the federal funding expire and require the government of Guam to financially assume the program's operation one hundred percent (100%).

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7 With the exception of the Guam Community College (f)8 and the University of Guam, and notwithstanding any other 9 provision of law to the contrary, no application for any federal aid 10 programs, grants, loans, contracts, contributions, advances, direct 11 federal development, or other federal funding shall be submitted 12 or deemed approved on behalf of the government of Guam or any 13 agency, division, office, department, or instrumentality thereof, or 14 any public corporation, without the final approval of the Director 15 of the Guam State Clearinghouse.

16 (g) The Lieutenant Governor may delegate any of the
17 foregoing duties and responsibilities to any entity, officer of
18 employee of the government of Guam."

Section 4. Section 2101.2 is hereby *added* to Chapter 2, Division I of
Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

Section 2101.2. Transition. Sixty (60) days after this Act
shall become law, any and all powers previously held by the Bureau of
Budget and Management Research ("BBMR") and any other agency,
