Transmitted herewith is Bill No. 29 (EC), "AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TRANSFER OF THE FORMER GUAM MASS TRANSIT AUTHORITY PROPERTY AND BUILDING TO THE OFFICE OF THE HAGÅTÑA MAYOR, FOR THE RELOCATION OF THE HAGÅTÑA MAYOR'S OFFICE, THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A YOUTH RECREATIONAL CENTER, AND FOR OTHER COMMUNITY NEEDS AND ACTIVITIES," now designated as Public Law 28-08.

The property transfer contained in the legislation is one of the component steps necessary in achieving a revitalized and redeveloped Hagatna. Currently, the property is a blighted area and constitutes a serious and growing menace to the people of Guam. The enactment of Bill No. 29 not only challenges the Mayor, our Senators, but more importantly, the members of the Hagatna Restoration and Redevelopment Authority. 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan
 finds that the Mayor of Hagåtña, the Honorable John A. Cruz, has requested

4 that the government of Guam consider the possible transfer of the former

5 Guam Mass Transit Authority property and building located in *Hagåtña* to the

1 Office of the Mayor of *Hagåtña* for official use and to set up a community 2 youth center for the benefit of the residents of *Hagåtña* and the island of 3 Guam. The Mayor has identified that the property and structure would be 4 sufficient to accommodate the needs of his office, and it would enable his 5 office and his people to better serve his community.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the present building is being 6 temporarily utilized by personnel from the Transportation Division of the 7 8 Although this may cause some slight Department of Administration. inconvenience for the Department of Administration to identify and relocate 9 their personnel, perhaps to their primary building, it may be in the best 10 interest of the island community to grant the future use of the facility and 11 property to the Hagåtña Mayor; a direct benefit to the people and residents 12 within the village of Hagåtña. 13

Therefore, this provision would grant the transfer of the former Guam
Mass Transit Authority property and building to the Office of the *Hagåtña*Mayor, for the community's use and benefit.

17 Property Transfer. The real property described as Lot Section 2. Number 87-4-R3, located in the municipality of Sinajana, Guam, with an area 18 of approximately 3,162 +- square meters and owned by the government of 19 Guam, is hereby transferred to the Office of the Hagåtña Mayor, Government 20 21 of Guam. The property shall be used for the relocation of the Hagåtña Mayor's Office, the establishment of a Youth Recreational Center, and for other public 22 and community uses so identified by the Hagåtña Municipal Planning 23 Council. The Hagåtña Mayor shall be responsible for the maintenance and 24 upkeep of the property and any improvements therein. Should the property 25

no longer be used by the Office of the *Hagåtña* Mayor for the previously
 identified purposes, said property and Title shall be transferred to the
 Department of Administration for further disposition.

Pertinent government of Guam agencies and offices affected by the provisions contained herein shall work collectively with the *Hagåtña* Mayor in the timely and appropriate implementation of the provisions herein. The transfer of said property shall become effective *no later than* one hundred twenty (120) days from the enactment of this Act.

9 Section 3. The existing Office of the Mayor of *Hagåtña* is hereby
10 transferred to the Guam Capitol District established pursuant to Title 21
11 Guam Code Annotated §79601 and to the control of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.

12 Section 4. Severability. *If* any provision of this Act or its application 13 to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the invalidity shall *not* affect 14 other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without 15 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act 16 are severable. COMMITTEE REPORT ON BILL NO. 29 (EC)

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TRANSFER OF THE FORMER GUAM MASS TRANSIT AUTHORITY PROPERTY AND BUILDING TO THE OFFICE OF THE HAGATNA MAYOR, FOR THE RELOCATION OF THE HAGATNA MAYOR'S OFFICE, THE POSSIBLE ESTABLISHMENT OF A YOUTH RECREATIONAL CENTER, AND FOR OTHER COMMUNITY NEEDS AND ACTIVITIES.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters held a public hearing at 9 a.m. on February 11, 2005 in the Public Hearing Room, I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Public notice advertisement was given in the February 7, 2005, edition of the Pacific Daily News (PDN), posted in the Government Meetings Section in the February 10 and 11, 2005 editions of the PDN, and Public Notice Ads in the February 4 and 9, 2005 editions of the Marianas Variety, Guam Issue. A live broadcast of the public hearing appeared on Channel 61 that day (February 11, 2005).

Senators present at the public hearing were:

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals appearing before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill are as follows: Jacqueline Taitano, Hagatna Mayor's Office (Read written testimony on behalf of Mayor)- In Favor The Honorable John A. Cruz, Hagatna Mayor (Oral testimony on questions, provided written testimony) Joseph Manibusan, Deputy Director, Dept. of Administration (read written testimony on behalf of Director of DOA, Lourdes M. Perez) – In Favor

Thomas A. Elliot, Administrative Director, Chamorro Land Trust Commission (read written testimony) – In Opposition

Ms. Jacqueline C. Taitano, employee with the Hagatna Mayor's Office accompanied Hagatna Mayor John A. Cruz to the public hearing and read his testimony before the committee in favor of Bill 29.

Mayor John A. Cruz, Hagatna Mayor, provided written testimony, in favor of Bill 29. He is explicit of his desire to relocate to the GMTA building for the beneficial use of the community and to locate his office to a more feasible and accessible facility for operations and storage of government equipment and transportation vehicles. In his testimony, Mayor Cruz, further states that the utilization of the facility will also be used for sports and recreational activities to keep the youth of the community engaged and that his intent is "to establish youth programs and to implement after-school and summer activities to keep our youth involved".

Mr. Joseph Manibusan, Deputy Director of Department of Administration (DOA), read written testimony on behalf of the DOA Director, Ms. Lourdes M. Perez, in favor of Bill 29. In his testimony, Mr. Manibusan stated that the written testimony does not reflect the position of the Executive Branch, rather it is the position of the Department. He stated that he had discussed the Bill in length with the Director, although is unaware if the Governor has been briefed in this matter. Mr. Manibusan stated that the Department of Administration does not mind if the Hagatna Mayor's Office is relocated to the former GMTA building, but stated that the government should find a suitable location for its mass transit customers and the personnel who work at the transit station and office at the former GMTA building.

Ms. Lourdes M. Perez, Director of Department of Administration, provided written testimony in favor of Bill 29. In her written testimony, she states that "While it's the Government's prerogative to transfer this property (former GMTA Building) and the improvements thereon to another entity, and granted we are not fully utilizing the building, and should it be the desire of the Legislature to give this property to another entity, we request some space in the building be reserved for use by Public Transit personnel and customers".

Mr. Thomas A. Elliot, Administrative Director for the Chamorro Land Trust Commission provided written testimony in opposition to Bill 29. The crux of Mr. Elliott's testimony was that he felt some disparity when GMTA was abolished, stating that "Public Law 20-221 authorized for the former Vehicle Inspection Station (GovGuam) to GMTA with the condition that the property revert back to the government of Guam if GMTA no longer needs it". In his testimony he states he objects to the transfer of the property because the property should have been reverted to the custodial rights of the Chamorro Land Trust. He retracted in his oral testimony of what is stated in his written testimony that the Hagatna Mayor's Office should have to pay for the lease on the property under Chamorro Land Trust mandates.

Questions;

Speaker Forbes in questioning Mr. Manibusan on the utilization of the former GMTA building asked if the government is under utilizing the building with the knowledge that there are three DOA transportation employees detailed to the transportation office in the building. Mr. Manibusan responded by stating DOA is willing to share the building with the Hagatna Mayor's Office and willing to take only what they are occupying. He further responded to Speaker Forbes that DOA would be willing to transfer their offices in the GMTA building to another suitable and accessible location if the Department was required to find a place that is accessible to persons with disabilities and with ample parking.

Senator Klitzkie was concerned with who had legitimate property rights over the former GMTA building. He asked Mr. Elliot, that if he felt CLTC had the rights to the property, since GMTA had been abolished, has the commission taken any action to revert the property to the trust? Mr. Elliot responded no and which Senator Klitzkie suggested that the commission adopt a resolution to resolve the reversionary rights of the CLTC. Senator Klitzkie in differing whether the property is government of Guam real property stated that the bill orders the Governor to give the property to the Hagatna Mayor's Office, since the Governor has overall charge of government of Guam real property, in the event that Mr. Elliot is wrong of his claim. He asked Mr. Manibusan and Mayor John Cruz if they had talked with the Governor about transferring the property and both had responded no. Senator Klitzkie had suggested that if Mr. Elliot is wrong, then the Governor can execute the transfer by executive order.

Senator Lou Leon Guerrero expressed some concerns over why the CLTC saw it fit to charge DOA or the Hagatna Mayor's Office for rent, and which Mr. Elliot commented that they were mandated to do so for businesses that generates revenue for profit. Senator Leon Guerrero pointed out that neither DOA or the Hagatna Mayor's Office are considered commercial businesses and do not generate revenue to collect a profit.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters finds that the intent of Bill No. 29 to provide for the relocation of the Hagatna Mayor's Office, the establishment of a youth service recreation facility and for other community functions and events is crucial for the growth of the community. The current building, formerly used by the Civil Service Commission and Red Cross, and which is located next to the Agana Cathedral Basilica, causes inconvenience to the general public in light of its location and

proximity to a congested area in the Capital. The committee finds that the relocation of the Hagatna Mayor's Office to a more suitable location within the Capital will be beneficial to the residents in the community and the People of Guam. As the restoration project of Hagatna closes in, the committee is mindful that the need of the community of Hagatna must be met to accommodate the inconveniences of ongoing restoration and construction. The Hagatna Mayor's Office has the intention of establishing a youth recreational facility, temporary quarters for the homeless, and to utilize the open space and other areas around the building for its community needs and purposes. The beneficial use of the former GMTA building, centralized in Hagatna, will maximize its existence in the community and stand out as a center that the community can call their own. The committee further finds that the relocation of the few DOA transportation personnel that work at the former GMTA building while pose minimal setbacks. The intent of the bill outweighs the slight inconveniences this may cause DOA.



Dear Speaker:

As Mayor of the village of Hagatna, I am submitting written testimony in support of Bill No. 29, which would transfer the former Guam Mass Transit Authority property and building to the office of the Hagatna Mayor, for the relocation of the Hagatna Mayor's Office, the establishment of a youth recreational center, and for other community needs and activities.

For many years the residents of Hagatna, especially our youth have had to go elsewhere to utilize facilities or participate in sports/recreational activities and other programs. In Hagatna, my intent is to establish youth programs and to implement after-school and summer activities to keep our youth involved.

The structure is ideal for other public and community uses such as meetings, trainings and functions so identified by the Hagatna Municipal Planning Council.

The current building that houses the Hagatna Mayor's Office lacks storage space. I have much needed equipment that can assist in cleaning up the streets or equipment that has a direct benefit to the people and residents within the village of Hagatna. Available space in the former Mass Transit Authority building would allow said equipment to be stored in one location versus the various locations they are currently stored. Official vehicles and other large equipment can be securely stored in the fenced-in parking lot at the site.

The roof of my current office is made of aluminum material. There is a tree (protected by Department of Agriculture and Department of Parks & Recreation) which is growing in such manner that it threatens the structural integrity of the concrete walls as well as the roof and has caused considerable damage already. During heavy rain or major typhoons, the roof leaks and water damage occurs. Even more importantly, I am greatly concerned about the safety of my staff, visitors and constituents.

Dear Speaker Forbes,

The property identified in Bill 29, which is Lot 87-4-R3, located in the municipality of Sinajana, Guam, was deeded to the Guam Mass Transit Authority by the GOVERNMENT OF GUAM on or about February 1991, under the signatures of Governor Joseph F. Ada, Lt. Governor Frank F. Blas, and Attorney Genreal Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, pursuant to PL20-221 Section 100. The Guam Mass Transit Authority (GMTA) was abolished pursuant to PL26-76, and all powers, duties, responsibilities, and jurisdiction was transferred to the Department of Administration.

The Department of Administration (DOA) offers the following comments and concerns relative to this bill:

- 1. DOA currently does not utilize the entire building and property. However, some office space is needed for DOA at this location because accessibility is very convenient for public transit customers. The office space needed is what is currently being utilized.
- 2. Customers come to the Public Transit office practically daily for assistance, including those with physical disabilities to renew their Para-Transit IDs. The current location is convenient because it is away from high traffic areas, easily accessible, and has ample parking. There are also disabled customers who are transported to the office on public transit

vehicles, the current location has ample space for the buses to maneuver.

P.L. 20-221 (Section 100.b) and the Grant Deed document, stipulates that "Should GUAM MASS TRANSIT AUTHORITY (GMTA) be dissolved or should GMTA no longer need the property conveyed and transferred; the property shall revert to the GOVERNMENT OF GUAM, inclusive of all improvements made thereon". While it is the Government's prerogative to transfer this property and the improvements thereon to another entity, and granted we are currently not fully utilizing the building, and should it be the desire of the Legislature to give this property to another entity, we request that some space in the building be reserved for use by Public Transit personnel and customers.

TESTIMONY

In Opposition to Bill No. 29 Transfer of Former GMTA Bldg to Hagatna Mayors Office

Dear Mr. Speaker and Committee Members:

Bill No. 29 proposes to transfer Lot 87-4-R3 in the Municipality if Sinajana, from the Guam Mass Transit Authority (GMTA) to the Hagatna Mayor's office. GMTA initially inherited this property through a prior land transfer by virtue of Section 100 of Public Law No. 20-221. P.L. 20-221 authorized the transfer of the former "Vehicle Inspection Station" to GMTA with the condition that the property revert back to Government of Guam if GMTA no longer needs it. The Grant Deed dated February 27th 1991 conveyed title to GMTA pursuant to P.L. 20-221, and contained the same caveat requiring the property be returned to the Government of Guam.

In light of this law, Dear Senators, I must object to the transfer from GMTA to the Hagatna Mayor's office. I believe this action is contrary to Chapter 75 of Title 21 GCA. The Chamorro Land Trust Commission is the custodian of all government lands not otherwise reserved or dedicated to a public use by law and are designated as available lands according to Section 75104 of 21 GCA.

This property has commercial potential. The CLTC proposes that, upon return to CLTC inventory, the property will be leased to the Hagatna Mayor in accordance with all applicable rules or statutes relative to time and cost.

I thank you for the opportunity to present this testimony.

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that the Mayor of Hagatna, the 3 Honorable John A. Cruz, has requested that the government of Guam 4 consider the possible transfer of the former Guam Mass Transit Authority 5 property and building located in Hagatna to the Office of the Mayor of 6 Hagatna for official use and to set up a community youth center for the 7 benefit of the residents of Hagatna and the island of Guam. The Mayor has 8 identified that the property and structure would be sufficient to 9 accommodate the needs of his office, and it would enable his office and his 10 11 people to better serve his community.

I Liheslaturan Guahan further finds that the present building is being 1 temporarily utilized by personnel from the Transportation Division of the 2 Department of Administration. Although this may cause some slight 3 inconvenience for the Department of Administration to identify and 4 relocate their personnel, perhaps to their primary building, it may be in the 5 best interest of the island community to grant the future use of the facility 6 and property to the Hagatna Mayor; a direct benefit to the people and 7 residents within the village of Hagatna. 8

9 Therefore, this provision would grant the transfer of the former 10 Guam Mass Transit Authority property and building to the Office of the 11 Hagatna Mayor, for the community's use and benefit.

Section 2. Property Transfer.

The real property described as Lot Number 87-4-R3, located in the 13 14 municipality of Sinajana, Guam, with an area of approximately 3,162 +-15 square meters, owned by the government of Guam is hereby transferred to the Office of the Hagatna Mayor, Government of Guam. The Hagatna 16 Mayor shall be responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the property 17 and any improvements therein. Should the property no longer be used by 18 the aforementioned party for the identified purposes, said property and 19 title shall be transferred to the Department of Administration for further 20 21 disposition.

Pertinent government of Guam agencies and offices affected by theprovisions contained herein shall work collectively with the Hagatna

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Section 4. Severability Clause.
