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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. Public Law 17-54 created a protective zone surrounding the perimeter of the Department of Corrections (DOC) in *Mangilao* and further authorized *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* to conduct land exchanges on an area for area basis with the affected land owners. This zone affects properties contained within the five hundred foot (500') radius surrounding the DOC including Lot Number 5400-R6 owned by Teodoro Q. and Dolores C. Llanes.

9 The effort to implement and enforce a five hundred foot (500') radius 10 protective zone is mandated by local law to protect surrounding property 11 owners while enhancing security at DOC. The protective zone allows DOC to 12 use force in thwarting escapes which meets the requirements of the U.S. 13 Department of Justice.

Landowners whose properties have been adversely affected by the protective zone, and who should have been granted an exchange with government of Guam land, have been left in an uncertain situation for over twenty (20) years. The landowners have been unable to improve their properties or to build homes.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that, through no fault of their own, these
property owners faced condemnation of their land by default. It is the intent of
I Liheslaturan Guåhan to come to fair and equitable resolution of this twenty
(20) year old continuing problem through a land exchange on a value for value
basis.

1 Section 2. Authorization. I Maga'lahen Guåhan is authorized to 2 exchange on a value for value basis government owned land located within the 3 Subdivision of Tract 11405, Dededo, more particularly described as: Tract 11405, Municipality of Dededo, containing a cumulative 4 area of +283,233 square meters, described within drawing 5 6 reference map number 301-FY99 and I4-99T652 recorded at 7 the Department of Land Management as Document Number 8 618339. 9 with privately owned property more particularly described as: 10 LOT NUMBER 5400-R6, Lichan Sabana, Municipality of 11 Mangilao, Estate No. 15101, Suburban, containing an area of 12 +10,185.76 square meters, belonging to Teodoro Q. Llanes and Dolores C. Llanes, with reference map filed at the Department 13 14 of Land Management as Document Number 90578. Section 3. Facilitation of Land Exchange. (a) The Director of the 15 16 Department of Land Management shall facilitate for I Maga'lahen Guåhan the exchange of land provided for in Section 2 upon the completion of two (2) 17 18 appraisals on all lands concerned prepared by two (2) different licensed real 19 estate appraisers, one of whom shall be selected by the Department of Land 20 Management and the other by the private landowner. The average of the two 21 (2) appraisals shall be used as the value for the transfer. Appraisals shall 22 correspondingly be paid for by each property owner. The land exchange shall be accomplished within one hundred eighty (180) days from the enactment 23 24 hereof.

(b) The Director of the Department of Land Management is hereby authorized to expend up to Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000) from the sums appropriated in Item (8) of Section 6, Part II of Chapter V, Public Law 28-68, *"General Appropriations Act of Fiscal Year 2006"* to pay for appraisals conducted on government-owned property in accordance with Subsection (a).

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6 Section 4. No Prohibition Against Building. Nothing contained in this 7 Act shall be construed to prevent or prohibit the party receiving exchange 8 government land from improving such land or from building, erecting or 9 constructing structures approved in accordance with the building and zoning 10 codes of Guam.

COMMITTEE REPORT ON

An Act Authorizing I Maga'lahen Guåhan To Exchange A Portion Of Government Land Within Lot Number 10120-R16, Municipality Of Dededo, With Lot Number 5400-R6, Municipality Of Mangilao, On A Value For Value Basis To Address The Protective Buffer Zone **Requirements For The Department Of Corrections Pursuant To Public** Law 17-54.

BILL NO. 125 (EC)

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters held a public hearing at 9:00 a.m.. on September 01, 2005 in the Public Hearing Room, I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Public notice was given to all media (see facsimile confirmation page) on August 25 and August 29, 2005 and posted in the Government Meetings Section in the August 31, 2005 edition of the PDN.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals that appeared before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill were as follows:

There are no oral and written testimonies on this bill.

Remarks:

Speaker Forbes said that the author of the bill, Senator Calvo, was not present to comment on the bill and that testimonies on the bill would be accepted thereafter.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters finds that the intent of Bill No. 125 would allow for a fair exchange of land affected by the requirements set by local law and by the US Department of Justice in enforcing the protective buffer zone surrounding Department of Corrections in Mangilao. The property owners have waited for over twenty years to see some settlement from the Government of Guam, unable to improve or build on the property. The committee further finds that this measure will provided an equitable resolution in the private owner's unforeseen condemnation of their properties by the government.

Accordingly, the Committee on General and Omnibus Matters to which BILL No. 125 (EC) was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan **TO DO PASS BILL No. 125 (EC),** "An Act Authorizing I Maga'lahen Guåhan To Exchange A Portion Of Government Land Within Lot Number 10120-R16, Municipality Of Dededo, With Lot Number 5400-R6,

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

Severability. *If* any provision of this Law or its 7 application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to 8 law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this 9 Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, 10 and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
