- 3 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the villages of Yigo and Mangilao have
- 4 increased significantly in their respective resident populations. In the 2000

1 population census, the number of people residing in the village of Yigo increased

2 tremendously by thirty seven percent (37%) between 1990 and 2000, becoming the

3 second most populated village community in Guam with a resident population of

4 nineteen thousand four hundred seventy four (19,474) people. The village of

5 Mangilao also experienced a twenty six percent (26%) increase in its resident

population in the same time frame, reaching a population of thirteen thousand three

7 hundred thirteen (13,313) people.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further recognizes that the villages of Dededo, Tamuning and Barrigada (which represent the first, third and fifth most populated villages in Guam, respectively) presently have Vice-Mayors.

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to provide the people of Yigo and Mangilao with additional representation and support through the creation of Vice-Mayor positions, which shall be filled at the next islandwide elections conducted for Mayors and Vice-Mayors.

Section 2. Establishment of Vice-Mayor Positions for the Villages of Yigo and Mangilao, Guam. §40101 of Chapter 40, Division 4, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"§40101. Number of Mayors and Vice-Mayors. There shall be a Mayor and/or Vice-Mayor for the municipalities and villages of Guam as indicated in the following table:

Section 3. Election to Fill Newly Created Vice-Mayoral Positions for Yigo and Mangilao. The newly created Vice-Mayoral positions for the villages of

Yigo and Mangilao. The newly created Vice-Mayoral positions for the villages of Yigo and Mangilao shall be filled at the next islandwide election for Mayors and Vice-Mayors, and said election shall be conducted in the same manner as filling other Mayor or Vice-Mayor positions in accordance with existing laws.

The additional budgetary requirements created by the establishment of the Vice-Mayoral positions for Yigo and Mangilao shall be incorporated into the Mayors Council of Guam's budgetary request for every fiscal year beginning in FY 2007.

Section 4. The Mayors Council shall study, investigate, and report to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* regarding how to best structure the Mayor's Offices, including, but not limited to, the need for Vice-Mayors, the desirability of electing

With the corresponding increases in resident populations of these villages, it is important that appropriate representation in the village leadership be expanded to include a Vice-Mayor, which would provide additional representational support to the villages of Yigo and Mangilao. recognizable increase in the community's population has called for residents in the village to request that I Liheslaturan Guahan consider providing a Vice-Mayor position to further support its community's needs.

I Liheslaturan Guahan further recognizes that the villages of Dededo, Tamuning, and Barrigada (which represent the first, third, and fifth most populated villages in Guam respectively) presently have Vice-Mayor representation. The provision of a Vice-Mayor position would provide additional support to the Mayors of Yigo and Mangilao and to the people in these villages toward improving their quality of life for the increasing number of residents.

Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to provide the people of Yigo and Mangilao with additional representation through the provision of a Vice-Mayor position, which position shall be filled at the next islandwide elections to be conducted for Mayors and Vice-Mayors.

Section 2. Establishment of a Vice-Mayor Position for the Villages of Yigo and Mangilao, Guam.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters held a public hearing at 9:00 a.m.. on September 01, 2005 in the Public Hearing Room, I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Public notice was given to all media (see facsimile confirmation page) on August 25 and August 29, 2005 and posted in the Government Meetings Section in the August 31, 2005 edition of the PDN.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals that appeared before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill were as follows:

Nito Blas, Mayor of Mangilao, written testimony In Support of Bill No. 152. Mayor Blas said that he supports the measure.

Robert Lizama, Mayor of Yigo, in support of Bill No. 152. Mayor Lizama said that he is submitting an approximate two hundred signatures (petitions) of Yigo residents who support the need for a vice mayor in their village. He said he has been the Mayor of Yigo for nine years and has seen the village grow significantly. He said currently there are approximately twenty thousand residents in Yigo. He said he is concerned of the budget breakdown for the various villages and is seeking the support of the legislature in providing a larger budget for his village.

Discussion:

Senator Kasperbauer asked Mayor Lizama if he is more favorable of the idea of an Administrative Officer Position for his office rather than a Vice Mayor Position? Mayor Lizama and Mayor Blas both said yes, with the intent that the AO Position be salaried above \$30,000. per annum to attract potential applicants. Mayor Lizama said he would like to fill the AO Position with an individual who could assess and care for the needs of the community while he is away from the office or busy with other duties of his office.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters finds that the intent of Bill No. 152 would allow for a new elected position of vice mayor to be represented in villages that have populated significantly, in reference to the villages of Mangilao and Yigo. The added representation of the vice mayor will contribute to the resident's demand for community representation and governmental services in the community level of operations. The new elected position of vice mayor for these two villages would provide for assistance in the mayoral duties and daily tasks and management of community operations and supervision.

Accordingly, the Committee on General and Omnibus Matters to which BILL No. 152 (LS) was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan **TO DO PASS BILL No. 152 (LS),** "An Act Relative To Providing Additional Representation And Support To The People In The Villages Of Yigo And Mangilao At The Municipal Level Through The Establishment Of A Vice-Mayor Position For Each Of These Villages, In Recognition Of The Growing Resident Population In These Areas As The Second And Fourth Most Heavily Populated Villages In Guam And To Address The Corresponding Increasing Needs Of Its Residents; Thus Amending §§40101, Chapter 40, Division 4, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated."

This can be counter-productive.


Additionally, in this Bill senators should also move to reduce the Vice-Mayors in communities that have populations significantly less than

- 3 The Liheslaturan Guahan finds that the villages of Yigo and

I Liheslaturan Guahan further recognizes that the villages of Dededo, Tamuning, and Barrigada (which represent the first, third, and fifth most populated villages in Guam respectively) presently have Vice-Mayor representation. The provision of a Vice-Mayor position would provide additional support to the Mayors of Yigo and Mangilao and to the people in these villages toward improving their quality of life for the increasing number of residents.

Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to provide the people of Yigo and Mangilao with additional representation through the provision of a Vice-Mayor position, which position shall be filled at the next islandwide elections to be conducted for Mayors and Vice-Mayors.

Section 2. Establishment of a Vice-Mayor Position for the Villages of Yigo and Mangilao, Guam.

§§40101 of Chapter 40, Division 4, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to Number of Mayors and Vice Mayors is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 4. Severability Clause.
