It is, therefore, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to assist the Department through the deappropriation of the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) from the budgeted allotment of Vice Speaker Joanne M.S. Brown, and to reappropriate this amount to the Department of Agriculture for the purchase of uniforms, law enforcement equipment and supplies for its Law Enforcement Division.

Section 2. Deappropriation and Reappropriation. The sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) is hereby deappropriated from the sums appropriated to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for Fiscal Year 2006 and reappropriated to the Department of Agriculture to purchase needed uniforms and law enforcement equipment and supplies for its Law Enforcement Division. Notwithstanding any other law or rule, the Fiscal Officer of *I Liheslatura* is authorized to reduce the allotment to Vice Speaker Joanne M.S. Brown by an amount equal to the sum deappropriated by this Section.

**Section 3. Reporting.** The Director of Agriculture shall submit a written report regarding the expenditure of this appropriation to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* after the funds have been expended. No portion of this appropriation shall be used for purposes other than that specifically defined in Section 2 of this Act.

# I. OVERVIEW

# II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals that appeared before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill were as follows:

Celestino Aguon, Acting Chief, Division of Aquatic & Wildlife Resources, Department of Agriculture, oral and written testimony in support of Bill No. 192. Mr. Aguon read his written testimony which was cosigned by, Joseph D. Torres, Deputy Director of the Department of Agriculture. Mr. Aguon said the infusion of funds will provide conservation officers with much needed supplies and equipment, and improve the morale of the dedicated and law enforcement personnel. He concluded by thanking Vice Speaker Joanne M.S. Brown, author of Bill 192 for her continued support. Please see attached testimony.

# Comments:

**Senator A. Palacios** asked Mr. Aguon if the funds would help in the enforcement of personal watercraft, specifically jet ski, violations.

Mr. Aguon commented that this enforcement is under the jurisdiction of, and in consultation with, the Department of Parks and Recreation.

Vice Speaker J. Brown, Author, thanked the nine conservation officers for their work. She noted that it is not a lot of money, but with the help of her colleagues, funding for the division was included in the FY 2006 budget. She further noted that the new Natural Resources Attorney also assists with the prosecution of related violations.

# III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Executive Committee finds that the intent of Bill No. 192 (EC), as amended, is to assist the Department of Agriculture Law Enforcement Division protect and conserve the island's natural

resources. I Liheslatura further finds that Conservation Officers must be adequately equipped to carry out their duties, and funds, which will be provided through this legislation, will assist in the procurement of necessary items to assist in the prevention or arrest of those who choose to willfully participate in the violation of the laws.

ANACT TO **DEAPPROPRIATE** TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$25,000.00) FROM THE SUMS APPROPRIATED TO I LIHESLATURA FOR FISCAL YEAR 2005 AND TO REAPPROPRIATE SAID SUM TO THE **DEPARTMENT AGRICULTURE** OF TO **PURCHASE** UNIFORMS. **SUPPLIES** AND LAW **ENFORCEMENT** EQUIPMENT FOR ITS LAW ENFORCEMENT DIVISION.

# 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that
- 3 the Department of Agriculture's Law Enforcement Division is charged with
- 4 protecting and conserving Guam's preserves, their natural resources and
- 5 marine life.
- 6 To prevent against endangerment or threats to maintain the viability
- 7 and health of the marine ecosystem I Liheslaturan Guahan further finds that
- 8 Conservation Officers must be adequately equipped to carry out their duties.
- 9 Lack of funding, however, has presented hardships in the department's
- ability to procure the items necessary to prevent and arrest those who
- 11 willfully and carelessly participate in the degradation of our preserves in
- 12 violation of the law.

- 1 It is, therefore, the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to assist the
- 2 department carry out its vital mission through the deappropriation of the sum
- 3 of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) from the budgeted allotment of
- 4 Vice Speaker Joanne M.S. Brown, and to reappropriate this amount to the
- 5 Department of Agriculture for the purchase of uniforms, law enforcement
- 6 equipment and supplies for its Law Enforcement Division. Moreover, the
- 7 purchase of this equipment will enhance our Conservation Officers' abilities
- 8 to track and arrest poachers and violators of laws established to protect the
- 9 preserves.
- Section 2. Deappropriation and Reappropriation. The sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) is hereby deappropriated from the sums appropriated to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for Fiscal Year 2005 and
- 12 the sums appropriated to I Liheslaturan Guåhan for Fiscal Year 2005 and
- 13 reappropriated to the Department of Agriculture to purchase needed
- 14 uniforms and law enforcement equipment and supplies for its Law
- 15 Enforcement Division. Notwithstanding any other law or rule, the Fiscal
- 16 Officer of I Liheslatura is authorized to reduce the allotment to Vice Speaker
- 17 Joanne M.S. Brown by an amount equal to the sum deappropriated by this
- 18 Section.
- 19 Section 3. Reporting. The Director of the Department of Agriculture
- 20 shall submit a written report regarding the expenditure of this appropriation
- 21 to I Liheslaturan Guåhan after the funds have been expended. No portion of
- 22 this appropriation shall be used for purposes other than that specifically
- 23 defined in Section 2 of this act.
