



Footnotes: The proposed bill entails a fiscal impact on the Healthy Future's Fund by an amount of \$155,262 for the purpose of procuring new hardware and software to upgrade and update the Absent Parent Automated System Information (APASI) system. The proposed amount represents 34% in local matching funds from a total cost of \$456,654, as estimated to meet the intent of the proposed legislation. The 66% federal matching hare totals \$301,392 which will be funded under the Child Support Enforcement Program. Please note that based on the Fund Balance She of September 30, 2003, 2004 & 2005 for the Healthy Futures Fund, the Unreserved Fund Balance indicates a deficit of \$931,756.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Finance, Taxation, and Commerce held a Public Hearing on, 9:30 a.m. at *I Liheslaturan Guahan's* Public Hearing Room on Bill No. 243 (LS), "An Act To Appropriate One Hundred Fifty-Five Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-Two Dollars (\$155,262.00) from the Healthy Futures Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for the Local Matching Requirements of Federal Funding Awarded for the Sole Purpose of Procuring New Hardware and Software to Upgrade the Child Support Computer System AKA Absent Parent Automated System Information (APASI)." Notices of this public hearing were disseminated throughout all local media via facsimile and are attached herein.

II. SUMMARY OF VERBAL TESTIMONIES:

Following introductory remarks by Chairman Edward J.B. Calvo, Senator Ray Tenorio, author of Bill No. 243 (EC), briefly explained that Office of the Attorney General of Guam is requesting assistance from the Legislature to purchase new hardware and software equipment for its Absent Parent Automated System Information (APASI) program. The local appropriation, if made, will cover the remaining one third (1/3) of the total purchase cost for the new equipment, with the remaining two thirds (2/3) covered by the federal government. Senator Tenorio concluded his remarks highlighting the importance of preventing any loss of valuable information relative to the maintenance of child support records and organized check-distribution computer programs.

This public hearing was adjourned at 3:03 p.m. Chairman Calvo informed the Committee that a roundtable meeting would be scheduled to allow for a continuation of discussion by representatives from the Office of the Attorney General and as well as to receive any additional testimony from the public concerning Bill No. 243 (LS).

In accordance with public notice requirements, the Committee held a roundtable meeting on Friday, February 10, 2006, 10:29 a.m. at *I Liheslaturan Guåhan's* Public Hearing Room in *Hagåtña*.

Mrs. Barbara Cepeda, Deputy Attorney General for the Child Support Division, Office of the Attorney General of Guam, along with other representatives from her office, was present to present additional testimony relative to Bill No. 243 (LS). According to Mrs. Cepeda, the computer system in her division is approximately ten (10) years old and is approaching a state of malfunction. Mrs. Cepeda reiterated statements made by the bill's author, Senator Ray Tenorio, regarding the need for the local government to take advantage of funding only one third (1/3) of the total cost for the new computer programs, with the federal government covering the remaining two thirds (2/3). The Deputy Attorney General shared comments recognizing the importance of preventing a complete systems failure, which would jeopardize the division's ability to continue collecting approximately one million dollars as well as issuing a total of five thousand (5,000) checks on a monthly basis.

Following general statements from panel members echoing the importance of maintaining a viable computer system within the Child Support Office, Chairman Calvo informed and encouraged members of the public that his Committee will continue to accept written testimonies at his office within ten (10) working days following today's meeting. The Chairman concluded this public hearing at 10:53 a.m.

III. COMMITTEE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Committee finds that the child support computer system, also known as Absent Parent Automated System Information (APASI) program, used by the Office of the Attorney General has not been upgraded or updated since 1996. The Child Support Enforcement Division (CSED) uses the same system to perform certain tasks such as license suspension, passport denial, and automated income withholding. The current hardware and software being utilized by the APASI system is outdated and continues to be a risk for the maintenance and operation of the system.

Covansys, the prime vendor contracted to maintain and operate the APASI system, has indicated several issues and risks related to the APASI hardware, system software, network and infrastructure components that require immediate mitigation. The potential impact, should the system fail, freeze or crash, would be an unrecoverable system, loss of data, exposure and accessibility of confidential information. CSED personnel will resort to manual processing of information which will delay, at the very least, compilation of data required for court hearings and child support payments. The

Committee further recognizes the health and safety interests of those children who depend of support checks for their food, clothing, and housing necessities.

The Committee, therefore, recommends that *I Liheslatura* provide the necessary funding to the Office of the Attorney General to upgrade the APASI system in order to stabilize the Child Support Division's network system and to avoid the risk of a complete systems failure.

At that discussion, you mentioned that your staff found that the Attorney General's Office has about \$731,000 in lapses from previous years.

I met with Terry Ascura, Acting Chief of Administration to discuss this issue and she informs me that the Attorney General's Office has numerous pending GG-1's at the Department of Administration. Per the Budget Law authorization, the funds are committed to hiring new prosecutors. Based on these projections, we anticipate that we will exhaust current funding as well the \$731,000 in lapses.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED SIXTY-TWO DOLLARS (\$155,262.00) FROM THE HEALTHY FUTURES FUND TO THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL FOR THE LOCAL MATCHING REQUIREMENTS OF FEDERAL FUNDING AWARDED FOR THE SOLE PURPOSE OF PROCURING NEW HARDWARE AND SOFTWARE TO UPGRADE THE CHILD SUPPORT COMPUTER SYSTEM AKA ABSENT PARENT AUTOMATED SYSTEM INFORMATION (APASI).

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Intent and Findings. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that 3 the child support computer system also known as Absent Parent Automated System 4 Information (APASI) used by the Office of the Attorney General has not been 5 upgraded or updated since 1996. The Child Support Enforcement Division (CSED) 6 uses the system to perform certain tasks such as license suspension, passport denial, 7 and automated income withholding. The current hardware and software being 8 utilized by the APASI system is outdated and continues to be a risk for the 9 maintenance and operation of the system.

10 Covansys, the prime vendor contracted to maintain and operate the APASI 11 system, has indicated several issues and risks related to the APASI hardware, 12 system software, network and infrastructure components that require immediate 13 mitigation. The potential impact, should the system fail, freeze or crash, would be an unrecoverable system, loss of data, exposure and accessibility of confidential
information. CSED personnel will resort to manual processing of information which
will delay, at the very least, compilation of data required for court hearings and
child support payments. Every child depends on these checks for their food,
clothing and shelter.

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6 Therefore, it is the intent of the *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to provide the necessary 7 funding to the Office of the Attorney General to upgrade the APASI system to 8 stabilize the network system and avoid the risk of a breakdown.

9 Section 2. One Hundred Fifty-five Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-two
10 Dollars (\$155,262.00) is hereby appropriated from the Healthy Futures Fund to the
11 Office of the Attorney General for the sole purpose of procuring new hardware and
12 software to upgrade and update the APASI system.
