BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 5 For purposes of this Article:

(a) "Euthanasia" means putting an animal to death by drug in a manner
provided by regulation of the Department of Agriculture (the Department).
(b) "Impoundment" means strict confinement under restraint by leash, cage
or paddock upon premises specified by order of the Director of Agriculture (the
"Director").
(c) "Officer" means a member of the Guam Police Department, a Mayor of
Guam, or a person authorized by the Director.
(d) "Person" means any natural person, association, partnership, firm,
corporation or any government entity.
(e) "Pet" means a cat or dog.
(f) "Pet owner" means any person or legal entity who harbors, cares for,
exercises control over or knowingly permits any pet to remain on premises
occupied by that person or legal entity.
(g) "Running at large" means any dog that
(1) is not restrained on private property in a manner that physically
prevents the dog from leaving that property or reaching any public
areas; or
(2) when on public property, or any public area, is not restrained by
a leash, tether or other physical control device not to exceed eight (8)
feet in length and under the physical control of a capable person.
(h) "Unlicensed pet" means any pet not exempted under the provisions of
this Article for which the license for the current year has not been issued or to
which the license tag is not attached.
(i) "Department" means the Department of Agriculture.
(j) "Director" means the Director of Agriculture."
Section 2. §34201 of Chapter 34, Article 2 of 10 GCA is hereby amended to
read:

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"§34201. Definitions.

For purposes of this Article:

- (a) "Animal" means any live non-human vertebrate creature, domestic or
- (b) "Animal shelter" means any facility operated by a humane society, the government of Guam or their authorized agents for the purpose of caring for animals held under the authority of this Article;
- (c) "Auctions" mean any place or facility where animals are regularly bought, sold or traded, except for those facilities otherwise defined in this Article. This does not apply to individual sales of animals by owners:
- (d) "Circus" means a commercial variety show featuring animal acts for public entertainment;
- (e) "Commercial animal establishment" means a pet shop, grooming shop, auction, riding school or stable, zoological park, circus performing animal exhibition, animal quarantine facility or kennel;
- (f) "Grooming shop" means a commercial establishment where animals are bathed, clipped, plucked or otherwise groomed;
- (g) "Officer" means a member of the Guam Police Department, a Mayor or a person authorized by the Director of Agriculture (the "Director");
- (h) "Kennel" means any premises wherein any person engaged in the business of boarding, breeding, buying, letting for hire, training for a fee, selling dogs or cats, or any premises in a non-agricultural zone area upon which five (5) or more adult dogs or cats are harbored or kept;
- (i) "Owner" means any person, partnership or corporation owning, keeping or harboring one (1) or more animals. An animal shall be deemed to be harbored if it is fed or sheltered three (3) consecutive days or more;

(j) "Performing animal exhibition" means any spectacle, display, act or event other than circuses in which performing animals are used; (k) "Pet" means any animal kept for pleasure rather than utility; (1) "Pet shop" means any person, partnership or corporation, whether operated separately or in connection with another business enterprise except for a licensed kennel that buys, sells or boards any species of animal: (m) "Public nuisance" means any animal that: (1) Molests passersby or passing vehicles; (2) Attacks other animals; (3) Trespasses on school grounds; (4) Is repeatedly at large; or (5) Damages private or public property: (n) "Restraint" means any animal secured by a leash or lead or under the control of a responsible person and obedient to that person's commands or within the real property limits of its owner; (o) "Riding school or stables" mean any place which has available for hire, boarding and/or riding instruction, any horse, pony, donkey, mule or burro; (p) "Veterinary hospital" means any establishment maintained and operated by a licensed veterinarian for surgery, diagnosis and treatment of disease and injuries of animals; (q) "Vicious animal" means any animal that constitutes a physical threat to human beings or other animals; (r) "Wild animal" means any animal which is not commonly domesticated, or which is not native to Guam, or which, irrespective of geographic origin, is of wild or predatory nature, or any domesticated animal, which because of its a size, vicious nature or other characteristics would constitute an unreasonable

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danger to human life or property if not kept, maintained or contained in a safe and secure manner;

- (s) "Zoological parks" means any facility, other than a pet shop or kennel, displaying or exhibiting one (1) or more species of non-domesticated animals operated by a person, partnership, corporation or government agency;
- (t) "Permitting authority" means the Department of Agriculture (the Department) which shall be the permitting authority for purposes of this Article."
- **Section 3.** §34307 of Chapter 34, Article 3 of 10 GCA is hereby *amended* to 9 read:

"§34307. Creation of Rabies Prevention Fund.

There is created a special fund called the "Rabies Prevention Fund," which shall be exclusively used to support the implementation of this Act and to maintain, enhance and secure the prevention of rabies on Guam. All money collected under the provisions of this Chapter shall be deposited in the Rabies Prevention Fund. The Department of Administration shall be responsible for maintaining the accounting and administration of this fund. No later than December 31st of each year, the Directors of the Departments of Administration and Agriculture shall report to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* and *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* on the administration of this fund, including the total monies collected and deposited in this fund and the total expended."

Section 4. Administrative Rules and Regulations. The Director of Agriculture may adopt administrative rules, regulations and fees identical to those used by the Department of Public Health and Social Services immediately prior to the enactment hereof without compliance with the Administrative Adjudication Law (5 GCA, Chapter 9) with regard to licenses, sanitary permits and other matters described herein. Amendments to such rules, regulations and fees shall be subject to the provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Law (5 GCA, Chapter 9).

- Section 5. Effective Date: The effective date of the provisions of this Act shall
- 2 be ninety (90) days from the date of enactment hereof.

Section 4. Administrative Rules and Regulations. The Department of Agriculture may adopt identical Administrative Rules, Regulations and Fees as was used by the Department of Public Health and Social Services immediately prior to the enactment of Sections 1, 2, and 3 herein without adjudication as required by the Administrative Adjudication Law (5GCA: Chapter 9) with regards to Licenses, Sanitary Permits and other functions herein. Any changes, however, to such Rules, Regulations and Fees shall be subject to the provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Law (5GCA: Chapter 9).

Summary of Testimonies: Bill No. 253

Mr. Joseph D. Torres; Deputy Director, Department of Agriculture. Mr. Torres presented oral testimony in favor of the Bill. He noted that prior law transferred Articles 1 and 3 of Chapter 23 of Title 10 to the Department of Agriculture but not Article 2. The Bill's sponsor, Senator Kasperbauer noted that the Bill only addressed those changes that were necessary to transfer all animal control functions to Agriculture. He further noted that although prior law did make changes to Articles 1 and 3 that references to the Department of Public Health and Social Services still remained. He stated that this Bill would correct those portions of law and transfer the functions in Article 2 as well.

Dr. Tom Poole, Territorial Veterinarian, Dr. Poole did not testify but was available for questions on general matters regarding the animal control functions to the Department of Agriculture.

Ms. Marie Chenery: President, Guam Animals in Need (GAIN). Ms. Chenery testified in favor of the Bill. She noted that GAIN had lobbied in the past to transfer all animal control functions to the Department of Agriculture and that the transferring of Article 2 would be the final step in that process. Additionally, she advised the committee of other areas outside the scope of the bill that legislature might consider addressing.

Karen Johnson, GAIN. Ms. Johnson signed in to testify in favor of the Bill but left before the hearing commenced.

Findings and Recommendations: Bill No. 253

The Committee on Judiciary, Governmental Operations & Reorganization finds that the functions of Animal Control are largely the responsibility of the Department of Agriculture. The Committee also finds that greater efficiency and better public service can be realized if the remaining responsibilities that are currently administered by the Department of Public Health and Social Services were transferred to the Department of Agriculture. The Committee therefore recommends that Bill No. 253 (EC) be reported out with the recommendation to DO PASS.

Such transfer will enable the Department to carry out and enforce animal control statutes. Comments:

The two (2) attached Fund Analysis reports pertain to total funds collected under the Rabies Prevention Fund and the Environmental Health Fund. The fiscal impact of the proposed bill entails an increase under the former Fund as mentioned above, with a decrease under the latter Fund, in the estimated amount of \$1,890 per year, beginning FY 2006, based on 14 establishments currently paying sanitary permits. A listing from the Department of Public Health, Division of Environmental Health indicates the 14 establishments paying the sanitary permit, the amount of which is currently being deposited under the Environmental Health Fund. The proposed bill will require such deposits to be made under the Rabies Prevention Fund. The multi-year projected revenue for purposes of this fiscal note assumes status quo number of permits over a 5-year period. Any other increase in collection will depend on new applicants for permits, enforcement efforts made under the program to result in additional permits, or any subsequent change to the fee rate.

. ~ (1) Molests passersby or passing vehicles; 1 2 (2) Attacks other animals; 3 (3) Trespasses on school grounds; 4 (4) Is repeatedly at large; or 5 (5) Damages private or public property; 6 (n) Restraint means any animal secured by a leash or lead or under the 7 control of a responsible person and obedient to that person's commands or within the 8 real property limits of its owner; 9 (o) Riding school or stables mean any place which has available for hire, 10 boarding and/or riding instruction, any horse, pony, donkey, mule or burro; 11 (p) Veterinary hospital means any establishment maintained and operated 12 by a licensed veterinarian for surgery, diagnosis and treatment of disease and injuries of 13 animals; 14 (q) Vicious animal means any animal that constitutes a physical threat to human beings or other animals; 15 16 (r) Wild animal means any animal which is not commonly domesticated, or 17 which is not native to Guam, or which, irrespective of geographic origin, is of a wild or 18 predatory nature, or any domesticated animal, which because of its size, vicious nature 19 or other characteristics would constitute an unreasonable danger to human life or 20 property if not kept, maintained or contained in a safe and secure manner; 21 (s) Zoological parks means any facility, other than a pet shop or kennel, displaying or exhibiting one (1) or more species of non-domesticated animals operated 22 23 by a person, partnership, corporation or government agency: 24 (t) Permitting authority means the Department of Public Health and Social

Services Agriculture (the Department) which shall be the permitting authority for

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purposes of this Article.

Section 3. §34307 of Chapter 34, Article 3 of 10 G.C.A is hereby amended to read:

§ 34307. Creation of Rabies Prevention Fund.

There is created a special fund called the "Rabies Prevention Fund," which shall be exclusively used to support the implementation of this Act and to maintain, enhance and secure the prevention of rabies on Guam. All money collected under the provisions of this Chapter shall be deposited in the Rabies Prevention Fund. The Department of Administration shall be responsible of maintaining the accounting and administration of this fund. Annually, but not later than December 31 of each year, the Directors of the Departments of Administration and Public Health and Social Services Agriculture shall report to I Maga'lahen Guahan and I Liheslaturan Guahan the results of operations of this fund, including the total monies collected and deposited in this fund and the total expended

Section 4. Administrative Rules and Regulations. The Department of Agriculture may adopt identical Administrative Rules, Regulations and Fees as was used by the Department of Public Health and Social Services immediately prior to the enactment of Sections 1, 2, and 3 herein without adjudication as required by the Administrative Adjudication Law (5GCA: Chapter 9) with regards to Licenses, Sanitary Permits and other functions herein. Any changes, however, to such Rules, Regulations and Fees shall be subject to the provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Law (5GCA: Chapter 9).

Section 5. Effective Date: The effective date of the provisions of this Act shall be Ninety (90) Days from the date of enactment hereof.
