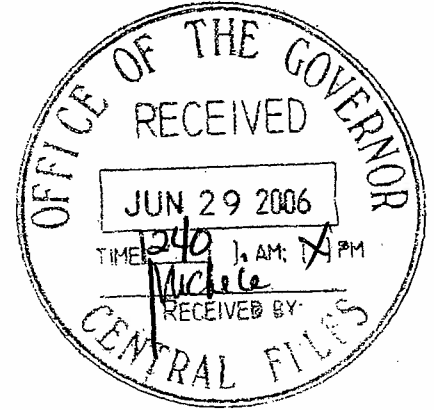

AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW §834.3 TO TITLE 1, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO DESIGNATE ROUTE 8 AS “PURPLE HEART MEMORIAL HIGHWAY” TO HONOR AND PAY SPECIAL TRIBUTE TO ALL RECIPIENTS OF THE MILITARY ORDER OF THE PURPLE HEART.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds

that several of our island brothers and sisters who have served in the U. S. military have been wounded in battle or have been killed in action, thus making the ultimate sacrifice for island and country. These individuals and their families deserve numerous accolades and recognition for their love and service to Guam and her people. Although a recent memorial constructed in the Skinner’s Plaza recognized such contributions, members of the Military Order of the Purple Heart on Guam have requested that our uniformed armed services members who have

1 been wounded or killed in war be further recognized by renaming Route 8 the
2 “Purple Heart Memorial Highway”.

3 **Section 2.** A new §834.3 is hereby *added* to Title 1, Guam Code
4 Annotated, to read as follows:

5 **“§834.3. Designation of Route 8 as “Purple Heart Memorial**
6 **Highway”.** (a) Route 8 highway is hereby designated, in memory of all
7 recipients of the Military Order of the Purple Heart in Guam, as the “Purple Heart
8 Memorial Highway” from its junction with Route 1 (Marine Corps Drive) to its
9 junction with Route 10 and Route 16, *Barrigada*.

10 (b) The Department of Public Works shall post, along the Purple
11 Heart Memorial Highway, Route 8, at appropriate intervals, signs that visibly
12 identify the highway’s official name. The Department of Public Works shall place
13 said signs in prominent overhead locations at the intersection of Route 1 (Marine
14 Corps Drive) and Route 8, *Hagatna*; and the intersection of Route 8, Route 10
15 (Vietnam Veterans Highway) and Route 16 (Army Drive), *Barrigada*. The
16 Department shall display signage or a monument along the roadside dedicating the
17 “Purple Heart Memorial Highway” to the men and women of the United States
18 Armed Services who have been wounded or killed in action while in service to
19 their island of Guam and their country, recipients of the Military Order of the
20 Purple Heart.”

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Intent and findings.

3 The Liheslaturan Guahan finds that several of our island brothers
4 and sisters who have served in the U. S. military have been wounded in
5 battle or have been killed in action, thus making the ultimate sacrifice that
6 any person can make for his/her island or country. These individuals and
7 their families are certainly deserving of numerous accolades and
8 recognition for their love and service to Guam and her people. Although a
9 recent memorial monument was constructed in the Skinner's Plaza
10 recognizing such contributions, members of the Military Order of the
11 Purple Heart on Guam have requested that our uniformed armed services
12 members who have been wounded or have been killed in war be further

recognized through the naming of Route 8 the "Purple Heart Memorial Highway".

Therefore this provision would further extend the recognition and honor on behalf of the people of Guam to the numerous men and women of the United States Armed Forces who were wounded or killed in action through the naming of Route 8, one of Guam's major roadways, the "Purple Heart Memorial Highway". A special and deserving tribute to those who have been awarded accordingly and have served our island of Guam and our country.

Section 2. Designation of Route 8 Highway, the "Purple Heart Memorial Highway".

A new section §834.3 is hereby added to Title 1, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

§834.3. Designation of Route 8 as "Purple Heart Memorial Highway".

Route 8 highway is hereby designated in memory of all recipients of the Military Order of the Purple Heart in Guam, as the "Purple Heart Memorial Highway"; from its junction with Route 1 (Marine Corps Drive) to its intersection junction with Route 10 and Route 16, Barrigada.

The Department of Public Works shall post signs along the newly designated Purple Heart Memorial Highway, Route 8, at appropriate intervals that visibly identify the highway's official name. The Department of Public Works shall further insure the placement of appropriate signs in

prominent overhead locations at the intersection of Route 1 (Marine Corps Drive) and Route 8, Hagatna; and the intersection of Route 8, Route 10 (Vietnam Veterans Highway) and Route 16 (Army Drive), Barrigada. The Department shall further display signage or a monument along the roadside dedicating the "Purple Heart Memorial Highway" to the men and women of the United States Armed Services who have been wounded or killed in action, while in service to their island of Guam and their country; recipients of the Military Order of the Purple Heart."

Section 3. Severability Clause.

If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters held a public hearing at 9:00 a.m. on September 2, 2005 in the Public Hearing Room, I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Public notice was given to all media (see facsimile confirmation page) on August 26 and August 29, 2005 and posted in the Pacific Daily News on September 5, 2005 on page 7.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals that appeared before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill were as follows:

Jack Shimizu, member, Vietnam Veteran's Association, oral testimony in support of Bill No. 182. Mr. Shimizu said that since the organizations creation in 2003, the association has aimed in seeking the recognition for those individuals killed or wounded in combat.

Franklin T. Artero, member, Vietnam Veteran's Association, oral testimony in support of Bill No. 182. Mr. Artero said there are four hundred living recipients of the Purple Heart Award here on Guam. He said we should remember those too who are living and who gave bravely and had sacrificed much for our country.

Remarks:

Speaker Forbes said he is aware of thousands of service men and women who have done extraordinary acts of bravery and selfless contributions to our country to protect freedom. He said by naming such roads, it enshrines the courageous acts of these individuals.

The author of Bill No. 182, Senator Aguon, said it is appropriate to rename one of our island's roads to commemorate those individuals who have died or been wounded in combat.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters finds that the intent of Bill No. 182 would honor the dead and injured military servicemen and women, active and retired, as a result of war combat. The

committee further finds that this measure is long overdue to those heroes and this act of acknowledgment is befitting of their courageous acts of heroism.

Forbes: GWA, DPW need to team up to fix potholes

Guam has a pothole problem — not because there's a lack of funding to fix the problem, but because government agencies don't communicate with each other.

This became clear at a public hearing yesterday, in which lawmakers grilled Public Works officials about potholes.

Public Works Chief Engineer Mark Gagarin said the primary barrier to fixing the roads has been coordinating with Guam Waterworks Authority — the primary cause of the potholes.

"So much of this could be solved by the simple act of working in concert," said legislative Speaker Mark Forbes. "Just getting these two agencies to coordinate is half the battle."

Potholes have plagued island drivers for years, but the issue has been in the spotlight lately because the attorney general launched an investigation into whether anyone can be held accountable for the pothole problem.

Yesterday's hearing was on a bill that would require mayors' certification that roads have been fixed before money is released to government agencies and contractors who break into the roads.

The public hearing came just days after it was discovered that the Federal Highway Administration wrote a letter to Public Works early last month threatening to withhold future funding if the government of Guam doesn't fix the pothole problems.

The letter was made public through the attorney general's office, not the Public Works department.

Forbes said he was upset that the letter wasn't made public earlier. "If they received this letter three or four weeks ago, I never heard about it, and I talk to these guys all the time," he said. "They have an absolute obligation to tell the public about it."

Yesterday, Attorney General Douglas Moylan wrote the Federal Highway Administration's territorial representative, letting her know of his office's investigation into the matter and asking for the agency's recommendations on the proper repair to road surfaces in climates such as Guam's.

The Legislature plans to appropriate some funds for road maintenance this year, Forbes said.

But he said it became clear from the testimony of Gagarin and utilities czar John Behavente that the primary problem has been a lack of coordination between Waterworks and Public Works.

BILLS

These are some of the bills considered in a public hearing of the Legislative Committee on General and Omnibus Matters yesterday.

▲ **Bill 75:** Would end the two-term limit for the elected public auditor.

▲ **Bill 96:** Would require all elected officials and any appointed official to attend an ethics in government program at the University of Guam.

▲ **Bill 104:** Establishes a performance bond requirement for whoever runs the new landfill. The system would provide money to the community if the landfill harms public health or contaminates the environment.

▲ **Bill 132:** The "Independent Counsel

Act of 2005," establishing procedures to choose a special prosecutor in the case of prosecution against the attorney general, in the case of an acquittal, the prosecution would pay for the defense's (attorney general's) legal costs.

▲ **Bill 152:** Creates the position of vice mayor for the villages of Yigo and Mangilao.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION §834.3 TO TITLE 1, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO DESIGNATE ROUTE 8 AS "PURPLE HEART MEMORIAL HIGHWAY" TO HONOR AND PAY SPECIAL TRIBUTE TO ALL RECIPIENTS OF THE MILITARY ORDER OF THE PURPLE HEART, MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED SERVICES WHO HAVE BEEN WOUNDED OR KILLED IN ACTION THUS MAKING THE ULTIMATE SACRIFICE IN THE PROTECTION OF FREEDOM AND LIBERTY.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Intent and findings.

3 The Liheslaturan Guahan finds that several of our island brothers
4 and sisters who have served in the U. S. military have been wounded in
5 battle or have been killed in action, thus making the ultimate sacrifice that
6 any person can make for his/her island or country. These individuals and
7 their families are certainly deserving of numerous accolades and
8 recognition for their love and service to Guam and her people. Although a
9 recent memorial monument was constructed in the Skinner's Plaza
10 recognizing such contributions, members of the Military Order of the
11 Purple Heart on Guam have requested that our uniformed armed services
12 members who have been wounded or have been killed in war be further

1 recognized through the naming of Route 8 the "Purple Heart Memorial
2 Highway".

3 Therefore this provision would further extend the recognition and
4 honor on behalf of the people of Guam to the numerous men and women
5 of the United States Armed Forces who were wounded or killed in action
6 through the naming of Route 8, one of Guam's major roadways, the
7 "Purple Heart Memorial Highway". A special and deserving tribute to
8 those who have been awarded accordingly and have served our island of
9 Guam and our country.

10 **Section 2. Designation of Route 8 Highway, the "Purple Heart**
11 **Memorial Highway".**

12 A new section §834.3 is hereby added to Title 1, Guam Code
13 Annotated, to read as follows:

14 **"§834.3. Designation of Route 8 as "Purple Heart Memorial**
15 **Highway".**

16 Route 8 highway is hereby designated in memory of all recipients of
17 the Military Order of the Purple Heart in Guam, as the "Purple Heart
18 Memorial Highway"; from its junction with Route 1 (Marine Corps Drive)
19 to its intersection junction with Route 10 and Route 16, Barrigada.

20 The Department of Public Works shall post signs along the newly
21 designated Purple Heart Memorial Highway, Route 8, at appropriate
22 intervals that visibly identify the highway's official name. The Department
23 of Public Works shall further insure the placement of appropriate signs in

1 prominent overhead locations at the intersection of Route 1 (Marine Corps
2 Drive) and Route 8, Hagatna; and the intersection of Route 8, Route 10
3 (Vietnam Veterans Highway) and Route 16 (Army Drive), Barrigada. The
4 Department shall further display signage or a monument along the
5 roadside dedicating the "Purple Heart Memorial Highway" to the men and
6 women of the United States Armed Services who have been wounded or
7 killed in action, while in service to their island of Guam and their country;
8 recipients of the Military Order of the Purple Heart."

9 **Section 3. Severability Clause.**

10 If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or
11 circumstances is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other
12 provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the
13 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act
14 are severable.
