AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW SECTION 80105 TO TITLE 21 G.C.A. RELATIVE TO DEVELOPING A COMPREHENSIVE ZONING PLAN FOR ANCESTRAL LANDS.

2 **Section 1**. A new Section 80105 is hereby *added* to Title 21 G.C.A. to read:

"Section 80105. Comprehensive Zoning Plan.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

(a) A Provisional Commission for the Zoning of Ancestral Lands, hereinafter referred to as the "Provisional Commission", is established to include the Executive Director of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, the Director of Land Management, the Administrator of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency, the Director of Agriculture and the Director of the Bureau of Statistics &

Plans. The Executive Director of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall serve as chairperson of the Provisional Commission. Members of the Provisional Commission shall assign employees from their respective departments to assist the Commission in its work.

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- The **(b)** Provisional Commission shall complete comprehensive zoning plan for all properties and parcels under the jurisdiction of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, including parcels that have been previously deeded to ancestral land claimants in accordance with the statutes, rules and regulations governing the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission but have not, as of the effective date of this Act, been zoned or rezoned by any means. If a parcel under the jurisdiction of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, including parcels that have been previously deeded to ancestral land claimants in accordance with the statutes, rules and regulations governing the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, has been previously zoned or rezoned by any means other than that mandated herein, said parcel shall not be rezoned by the comprehensive zoning plan mandated by this Section.
- (c) In formulating the comprehensive zoning plan, the Provisional Commission shall request and consider the opinions of all affected ancestral land claimants. The Provisional Commission shall conduct hearings and present a draft zoning plan to claimants before it adopts the plan.

- (d) The Provisional Commission shall approve the plan by the affirmative vote of at least three (3) of the five (5) members before transmittal to the Ancestral Lands Commission.
- **(e)** After the Provisional Commission approves the comprehensive zoning plan, it shall transmit the plan to the Ancestral Lands Commission, which shall approve the plan by a resolution signed by a majority of its members. The Ancestral Lands Commission shall attach this resolution to the plan and transmit the same to *I Maga'lahi*.
- (f) I Maga'lahen Guåhan shall approve the comprehensive zoning plan by a written memorandum which he shall attach to the plan and the approval resolution of the Ancestral Lands Commission and transmit the same to I Liheslaturan Guåhan.
- (g) The comprehensive zoning plan mandated by this Section shall be subject to the approval of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* in bill form."

"Section 80105. Comprehensive Zoning Plan. (a) A Provisional Commission for the Zoning of Ancestral Lands, hereinafter referred to as the "Provisional Commission", is established to include the Executive Director of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, the Director of Land Management, the Administrator of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency and the Director of the Bureau of Planning. The Executive Director of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall serve as chairperson of the Provisional Commission. (b) Employees of the departments and agencies whose heads constitute the Provisional Commission in its work, as determined by the sundry heads of departments and agencies comprising the Provisional Commission. (c) The Provisional Commission is tasked with completing a comprehensive zoning plan for

(e) The approval of a majority of members of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission by affirmative vote shall be required prior to the transmittal to I liheslaturan Guahan of the comprehensive zoning plan mandated by this act. (f) The approval of IMaga'lahen Guahan shall be required prior to the transmittal to I liheslaturan Guahan of the comprehensive zoning plan mandated by this

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act. (g) The comprehensive zoning plan mandated pursuant to this act shall be subject to the approval of I Liheslaturan Guahan in bill form. Upon receiving the approval of I Maga'lahen Guahan as memorialized in attachment, and the approval of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, as memorialized by an attached resolution of such approval and attested to by signature of at least a majority of the members of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, the Provisional Commission shall transmit the comprehensive zoning plan mandated by this act to I Liheslaturan Guahan. (h) In formulating the comprehensive zoning plan, the Provisional Commission shall seek and take into consideration the input of all effected ancestral land claimants. AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 80105. TO 21 GCA RELATIVE TO DEVELOPING A COMPREHENSIVE ZONING PLAN FOR ANCESTRAL LANDS

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters held a public hearing at 9:00 a.m. on March 8, 2006 in the Session Hall, I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Public notice was given to all media (see facsimile confirmation page) on March 1 and March 6, 2006. Notice was placed in the PDN on March 6, 2006.

Senators present at the public hearing were:

Speaker Mark Forbes, Chairman Vice Speaker Joanne M.S. Brown Senator Larry Kasperbauer, Member Senator Lou Leon Guerrero, Member Senator Robert Klitzkie Senator Ray Tenorio Senator Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals that appeared before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill were as follows:

Mr. Joseph Borja, Director, Department of Land Management and Administrative Secretary, Guam Land Use Commission, oral testimony in support of Bill No. 268. Mr. Borja said that he is in favor of the bill and was concerned that a more definitive section regarding the staffing for the provisional committee be addressed in the bill. He is concerned that the work required by the provisional committee, which will more likely meet in the evening hours to accommodate the interest of the public, would burden the existing staff of the Department of Land Management and the Guam Land Use Commission. He said that the current staff will set aside the duties required by the provisional committee for the duties required during their day jobs at the Department of Land Management and the Guam Land Use Commission. He said he wants to insure that staffing for the provisional committee be specific for this purpose or that funding be made available for overtime hours for those existing staff who opt to work the extra hours in the evening. Mr. Borja also recommended that a legislative review be implemented on a quarterly basis for the work being conducted by the provisional committee. He also indicated that a quarterly report and a progress tracking report of the provisional committee be required and sent to the legislature, governor and the Guam land Use Commission. He further said that a sunset clause of 15 months be the time frame for the commission and that if additional time is needed by the commission, legislative action will be required for its existence. Mr. Borja had several issues involving the current dilemma of approving Ancestral Lands Maps which do not have public access connections to these lots, either basic lots and/or subdivided lots and the issue of resolving surveyor disputes. He said he had problems with mapping out land lock properties. He suggested that lots and maps can be approved for properties deemed excess from the federal government and recommended that an exemption be made for title purposes. In written testimony he states, "Exceptions to title shall be memorialized on the title and noted on the maps relative to lots that do not have public access roadway right-of-way abutting it". In reference to surveyor disputes, he said the current rules and regulations require that 3 surveys be made on properties and if there are disputes on the figures generated by the surveys, resolution must be done by the three surveyors. Mr. Borja said this is an occasional occurrence and time consuming and he suggested that the Chief Cadastre at the Department of Land Management mediate over such surveyor disputes. He said the disputes can arise over +/- differences in measurements. (see attachment).

Mr. Joseph Garrido, Maga Lahi, Nasion Chamoru, oral testimony. Mr. Garrido stated that he is neither in support or against Bill No. 268. He had concerns over the property rights of land owners whose property may be reduced to a fractional size as a result of the comprehensive zoning plan and the requirements for easements in the zoned area. He said he would like to see a win-win situation for all involved.

Mr. Felix Dungca, Guam Chief Planner, Department of Land Management, written testimony in support of Bill No. 268. Mr. Dungca in his written testimony said that he has been instrumental in the completion of the "Land Use Master Plan for the Dos Amantes Planning Area" submitted to the current administration by Mr. Dan Swavely. He strongly urged the legislature to review the plan, which has been developed over the course of two and half years. He questioned that there is no time frame for the provisional committee to complete such comprehensive zoning plan and suggested that one to two years is sufficient for the provisional committee to complete such plan. (See attachment).

Mr. Randy Sablan, Administrator, Guam Environmental Protection Agency, oral and written testimony in support of Bill No. 268. Mr. Sablan gave his brief remarks stating that the Agency will work together with the provisional committee to insure that environmental regulations and laws are complied with and that an assessment of the land be conducted in the zone planning. He said that "if the Zoning Plan is to succeed, the bill should express a desire on the part of the legislature to deny spot zoning requests until the zoning plan is adopted for the properties in question". He provided written testimony. (see attachments).

Mr. Eddie Benavente, Director, Ancestral Lands Commission, written testimony in support of Bill No. 268. Mr. Benavente indicated in his testimony that "although the Commission support the intent of the Legislature in trying to resolve the zoning issues with many of the parcels that were in excess, the Commission however feels the proper authority should be with the Guam Land Use Commission under the Department of Land Management and amended to include the Guam Ancestral Land Commission's Director or designee as a provisional member that expires upon the last zoned Excess parcel". (see attachment).

Discussion:

Speaker Forbes asked if the properties in the Ancestral Land's Commission Inventory and those transferred to original land owners are adjacent to Federal Properties. Mr. Borja said there are some lots that border Federal Properties.

Senator Lou Leon Guerrero asked if there are any Ancestral Lands that already have been zoned. Mr. Borja said yes. Speaker Forbes interjected and said he is aware of two properties that have been zoned. He cited property for the Calvo's in Maite and Mr. John Shen whose property is located on the Harmon Cliffline. He said both properties had gone through legislature approval and to the Governor for his approval.

FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters finds that the intent of Bill No. 268 will allow for the comprehensive zoning of areas under the Ancestral Lands Commission Inventory and those already returned to Ancestral Land Owners and which such properties have no zone. The bill will create a provisional committee consisting of the Director of Land Management, the Executive Director of the Ancestral Lands Commission, the Administrator of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency and the Director of the Bureau of Planning & Statistics to oversee the comprehensive zoning plan. The Committee also finds that the provisional committee will be created for the sole purpose of the

comprehensive zoning plan and by which a suggested time frame of 15 months for the existence of such provisional committee. The committee finds that the intent of the bill is to fast track the process of zoning those identified un-zoned lots and to allow for the harmonious development of the zoned areas in relation to existing zoned areas. The bill will not change any existing zoned lots and will allow for those un-zoned lots adjacent or nearby to reflect a unified zoned area.

Accordingly, the Committee on General and Omnibus Matters to which BILL No. 268 (EC) was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan TO DO PASS BILL No. 268 (EC), "An Act To Add A New Section 80105. 



Testimony:

Bill 268

The Department of Land Management supports the intent of Bill 268.

However, we have the following recommendations and suggestions:

1. While the bill addresses "administrative assistance" from the various agencies involved, that assistance might not be prioritized as much as their day to day operations. Further, a large majority of the Provisional Commission's staff work would probably be after 5pm or even on Saturdays and/or Sundays (the hearings and transcriptions and word processing). We recommend that specific administrative staff support be identified in personnel positions and funding source.

The recommended funding source is the Department of Land Management's Land Survey Revolving Fund. In FY2004 the LSRF brought in \$759,339. In FY2005 the LSRF brought in \$868,725. For FY2006 \$728,805 of that amount was appropriated to DLM from the LSRF. For FY2006, Oct to Jan 2006 only, the LSRF has already brought in \$336,782. The comparable amount for the same time period in FY2005 is \$291,091. Expenditures should include personnel costs (salaries and benefits), computer equipment, supplies and publications, and possibly hearing space rentals and equipment if necessary and hearing space equipment (public address system, recording

equipment, tents and chairs which I believe GALC already has).

The following personnel positions are recommended: Administrator / Certifying Officer: GLUC Executive Secretary, which is the Director of DLM, no additional compensation needed for this additional responsibility and the GLUC Executive Secretary can also serve as the link between the Provisional Commission and the GLUC.

Chief Planner: This existing position in DLM is presently unfunded. If funded, this position should be exclusively assigned to the Provisional Commission, no DLM/Planning Division work should be given to this position (person) so that he/she can concentrate on work only for the Provisional Commission.

Commission Secretary/Data Entry Clerk: This should be either a new LTA hire for the duration of the Provisional Commission or an overtime funded plan should be put in place for an existing employee.

Geographic Information System (GIS) technician: This should be either a new LTA hire for the duration of the Provisional Commission or an overtime funded plan should be put in place for an existing employee.

Land Agent and/or Land Abstractor III: This should be either new LTA hires for the duration of the Provisional Commission or an overtime

funded plan should be put in place for an existing employee at this pay I level.

- 2. Include a Sunset Provision for commission existence not to exceed 15 months and require Quarterly Progress Reports to the Legislature, the Governor and the GLUC.
- 3. There is an option that authority be given up by the Legislature to the GLUC to (initially) zone all these Federally excessed lands. This would surely backlog the GLUC for 2-3 years. Unless a revamping of existing GLUC administrative procedures and timeframes (mandated by public law, executive orders and the Administrative Adjudication Law) is undertaken by the Legislature, the individual private landowners would have to utilize the existing GLUC process which would be more costly, time consuming and cumbersome than a provisional commission. Specific processes would have to be mandated by law as they are now for regular lots. The added caseload to the GLUC and DLM staff would have to be addressed by the creation and funding of an increase of DLM staff positions. This option would also backlog regular GLUC applications.
- 4. On a related issue, DLM is having problems approving Ancestral Lands maps which do not have public access connections to lots, either basic lots and/or subdivided lots. We recommend an amendment to Chapter 62 (Subdivision Law), Article 1, Section 62108 to allow the creation of lots and recording of maps from Ancestral Lands property excessed by the Federal Government). Maps shall be for title and ownership purposes. Exceptions to title shall be memorialized on the title and noted on the maps relative to lots that do not have a public access roadway right-of-way abutting it. This exception shall be for Ancestral Lands only that were excessed by the Federal Government. This can also be done by probate case orders but is rarely done and is only applicable when the property is subject to probate.
- 5. On another related issue, include a section where the DLM Survey Division under the direction of the Chief of Cadastre shall coordinate all mapping of all ancestral lands parcels and shall mediate, correct and decide survey boundaries where discrepancies, inconsistencies and disputes exist within excess lands parcels.

Buenas Yan Hafa Adai,

Please allow me to provide my written testimony to the Committee relative to both Bill Nos. 268 and 260 via Email. I am unable to attend the scheduled public hearing in person due to sick leave, but ask that my testimony be entered into the record for purposes of supporting both bills.

Before stating my position, I would like to inform the committee of my educational background and government experience in the area of land use planning. I have a bachelors of science degree in urban land use planning, and have worked for the government for over 20 years, both at DPW and Land Management. My current position is that of Guam Chief Planner, Dept. of Land Management and former director of both DLM and the Chamorro Land Trust Commission. Currently, I am detailed and assigned to the Mass Transit Division, Dept. of Administration to assist them in the area of transportation planning. I also have a degree as a certified financial planner (1989) with the College for Financial Planning.

Bill 260- I am in full support of Bill 260 being aware for many hears of the shortfalls that current subdivision laws on Guam fail to address in the area of "good land use development". We (Planners at DLM) have for many years recognized these loop holes and shortfalls that exited for many years allowing potential developers to purchase large tracts of land, subdivide them, sell off the lots to potential purchasers to make an "up front" profit and then move on to the next project. This has been the norm and practice during the late 1980's and '90 period economic boom.

It should be noted that this practice is not necessarily the fault of developers as they are simply operating within the law and rules set by the government. As a result of the recent problems facing the Gill Baza, Gil Breeze and other existing subdivision, it has become obvious that the government must now recognize the shortcomings of existing subdivision law and pass stiffer legislation to ensure that this practice not be allowed for future subdivisions in the interest of ensuring good land use development on Guam.

More importantly, the protection of our groundwater protection zoned, northern aquifers and other environmental resources must take paramount to the individual profits of a limited number of developers. The time has come for policy makers to make, and take responsible action to protect the environment through legislation. Thank you.

Bill 268- again, I am in full support of Bill 268 and its' intent to address the zoning, or lack of local zoning designation for ancestral lands. In that respect, I bring to the legislatures' attention a recently completed report by Daniel D. Swavely entitled "Land Use Master Plan for the DOS AMANTES PLANNING AREA" dated 19th, July 2005.

This report was formally presented to the administration last year on August 12, 2005 and represents a comprehensive approach to the zoning and master planning of approximately 2,143 acres of prime lands in and around the Dos Amantes area.

I strongly encourage the committee and the legislature to support the recommendations within this report as it realistically addresses not only the future economic potential of these lands, but also identifies certain challenges that currently exist such as the maze of easements within the bonders of these properties.

I would welcome an opportunity to participate and provide my technical input into this process, and look forward to the passage of Bill 268.

Buenas Mark! I would like to submit my comments on Bill 268 relative to the formation of a Provisional Commission for the Zoning of Ancestral Lands. My comments are as follows:

"I have reviewed Bill 268 in its' entirety and offer a couple of concerns as follows:

- 1. i am assuming that Bill 268 is a prelude to the recent submittal of the Land Use Master Plan for the Dos Amantes Planning Area, recently transmitted by Dan Swavely to the administration. Dan and I first conceived this "Pro-bono" project back in early 2003 when i was the Director of Land Management. it has take over 2.5 years for Dan to complete this report which i have reviewed and find that it is worthy of the time put into it's development.
- 2. With respect to Bill 268, i didn't notice any time period that this new commission has to complete the master land use zoning plan. it seems to me that 1-2 years should be adequate considering that most of the work has already been done by Dan Swavely.
- 3. Secondly, as you know, the Ancestral Lands Commission has land inventory spread all over the island, however, the bulk of its inventory, approx 2,413 acres are grouped and confined to the Harmon Cliffline area, bordered by Route 1 (Marine Corp Drive) to the South, Route 3 to the East, the Cliffline to the West and Dos Amantes to the north.

it is this area that is addressed by the Dan Swavely report because of the grouping of huge amounts of lands.

Lastly, i noticed that Bill 268 does not allow the commission to retain "Professional Services/Consultants/Planners*, nor does it provide any funding. I just wondered if some clause should be inserted to allow for the hiring of professional consultants, should the need arise.

PUBLIC HEARING ON BILL 268(EC): AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 80105. TO 21 GCA RELATIVE TO DEVELOPING A COMPREHENSIVE ZONING PLAN FOR ANCESTRAL LANDS.

Buenas yan Saluda, Speaker Mark Forbes and Committee Members. In response to your invitation, I am pleased to have the opportunity to provide Guam Environmental Protection Agency's testimony on Bill 268.

Bill 268 proposes to develop and adopt a Comprehensive Zoning Plan for Guam Ancestral Lands. Such a plan is urgently needed to provide direction and legal

authority for the efficient and immediate use of these valuable properties. The provision of this Comprehensive Zoning Plan should allow for infrastructure planning for designated appropriate land uses, and intensity of these uses, while protecting the environment and increasing property values.

A critical example of environmental resources which demands protection through management by land use zoning is our Northern Aquifer. Guam's Northern Aquifer is designated as a sole source aquifer. The Northern Aquifer provides Guam with over 80% of our island's drinking water and is increasingly threatened by pollution, most notably leaching of contaminants from septic tank systems built over the aquifer. To accommodate the occupation of properties that lack sewer, owners have been permitted to install approved septic tanks and leaching fields. But scientific evidence shows that the safety of our drinking water is becoming seriously threatened by the increased use of these individual home wastewater disposal methods. The solution of providing public sewers is dependent on planning for service needs based on the future uses as defined in a comprehensive plan.

The consequence of not having such a plan is uncoordinated individual spot zoning, which has been occurring at owners' requests on a lot by lot basis. This practice

not only does not promote the overall value of these unzoned properties, it is likely to have a negative impact on the value of adjacent and surrounding properties.

Furthermore, spot zoning does not require the provision of infrastructure to these lots, as a zoning plan would demand. All this leading to deficiencies in infrastructure and public services, damage to natural resources, degradation of the environment, loss of potential economic development and lowering of the overall quality of life.

The potential impacts of this zoning plan reach well beyond the ancestral owners and the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission and will have major impacts on Guam's economy and quality of life

The next task would be to develop a land use master plan for Guam which would ensure that the use and development Ancestral Lands is in harmony with a broader comprehensive vision. In 1994 the 22nd Guam Legislature wisely required this comprehensive Island-wide land use and zoning approach, under the I Tano'-ta planning project. A new comprehensive plan should match zoning (and permitted uses) to the existing infrastructure and also allow for automatic zone upgrades as

infrastructure (especially sewers) becomes available. This was a key principle included in I Tano'-ta.

The Guam Waterworks Authority is currently developing a Master Plan to address current deficiencies associated with water and wastewater facilities, and as important, to strategize and address Guam's future needs. Meanwhile, the Department of Public Works and Guam Power Authority continue to carry out infrastructure planning that must be coordinated with potential for land uses on the unzoned properties.

It would seem appropriate that federal authorities be afforded the opportunity for input to this Zoning Plan. Such involvement could result in avoiding contention over plans previously accepted as the basis of releasing Federal properties and demonstrate an open and progressive approach to change.

Although the in-house expertise for developing this plan may be available, resources necessary to complete the proposed plan are not readily available in the designated agencies. Therefore, appropriation to cover planning costs is critical and should be added to the bill. This should provide for expenses of media

announcements of public input opportunities, holding of public meetings, printing of drafts and final plans, including accurate mapping.

If the Zoning Plan is to succeed, the bill should express a desire on the part of the Legislature to deny spot zoning requests until the Zoning Plan is adopted for the properties in question.

The Guam Environmental Protection Agency supports the foundation of the provisions of Bill 268 and recommends that it be approved, with the incorporation of our suggestions.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 80105. TO 21 GCA RELATIVE TO DEVELOPING A COMPREHENSIVE ZONING PLAN FOR ANCESTRAL LANDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new section 80105 is added to 21GCA to read:

"Section 80105. Comprehensive Zoning Plan. (a) A Provisional Commission for the Zoning of Ancestral Lands, hereinafter referred to as the "Provisional Commission", is established to include the Executive Director of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, the Director of Land Management, the Administrator of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency and the Director of the Bureau of Planning. The Executive Director of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission shall serve as chairperson of the Provisional Commission. (b) Employees of the departments and agencies whose heads constitute the Provisional Commission shall be assigned to assist the Provisional Commission in its work, as determined by the sundry heads of departments and agencies comprising the Provisional Commission. (c) The Provisional Commission is tasked with completing a comprehensive zoning plan for

all properties and parcels under the jurisdiction of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, including such parcels as have been previously deeded to ancestral land claimants in accordance with the statutes, rules and regulations governing the activities of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission but have not as of the effective date of this Act been zoned or rezoned through any mechanism. If a parcel under the jurisdiction of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, inclusive of parcels as have been previously deeded to ancestral land claimants in accordance with the statutes, rules and regulations governing the activities of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, shall have been previously zoned or rezoned through some alternative mechanism to that mandated in this act, such parcel or parcels shall not be rezoned as part of a comprehensive zoning plan designed or promulgated pursuant to this act. (d) The approval by affirmative vote of at least three (3) of the four (4) members of the Provisional Commission shall be required prior to the transmittal to I liheslaturan Guahan of the comprehensive zoning plan mandated by this act. (e) The approval of a majority of members of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission by affirmative vote shall be required prior to the transmittal to I liheslaturan Guahan of the comprehensive zoning plan mandated by this act. (f) The approval of IMaga'lahen Guahan shall be required prior to the transmittal to Iliheslaturan Guahan of the comprehensive zoning plan mandated by this

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act. (g) The comprehensive zoning plan mandated pursuant to this act shall be subject to the approval of I Liheslaturan Guahan in bill form. Upon receiving the approval of I Maga'lahen Guahan as memorialized in attachment, and the approval of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, as memorialized by an attached resolution of such approval and attested to by signature of at least a majority of the members of the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission, the Provisional Commission shall transmit the comprehensive zoning plan mandated by this act to I Liheslaturan Guahan. (h) In formulating the comprehensive zoning plan, the Provisional Commission shall seek and take into consideration the input of all effected ancestral land claimants. The Provisional Commission shall conduct hearings and present a draft zoning plan to claimants prior to adoption by the Provisional Commission.

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
