Section 1. Legislative findings and intent. I Liheslaturan Guāhan finds that with the high volume of compostable material generated on Guam daily, and the need to reduce waste from entering the landfill, there is a need for alternative means of reducing waste in an environmentally friendly method. Therefore, the value of composting biodegradable wastes will greatly benefit the people and environment of Guam.

8 I Liheslatura further finds that the University of Guam's Inarajan Agricultural 9 Station has conducted successful composting projects, and would be best suited to 10 operate and expand composting operations that will benefit the community.

Section 2. Deappropriation and Reappropriation. The sum of Fifty
Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) is deappropriated from the sums appropriated to the
legislature prior to July 1, 2004 and reappropriated to the University of Guam's Inarajan
Agricultural Experiment Station for the sole purpose of purchasing a compost turner
and needed supplies for the compost operations. Notwithstanding any other law or

rule the Fiscal Officer of the legislature is authorized to reduce the allotment to Vice Speaker Brown by an amount equal to the sum deappropriated by this section.

Section 3. Reporting. One hundred and eighty (180) days upon the enactment of this law, and upon the expenditure of these funds, the University of Guam's Inarajan Agricultural Experimental Station shall prepare financial reports for the President of the University of Guam who shall then submit the reports to I Liheslaturan Guahan. No portion of this appropriation shall be used for purposes other than specifically defined in Section 2 of this law.

Section, S. Severability. If any provision of this law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this law are severable.

# COMMITTEE REPORT ON BILL NO. 35 (EC)

AN ACT TO DEAPPROPRIATE FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000) FROM THE SUMS APPROPRIATED TO THE LEGISLATURE AND TO REAPPROPRIATE SAID SUM TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM INARAJAN AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENT STATION.

### I. OVERVIEW

The Executive Committee held a public hearing at 9 a.m. on February 11, 2005 in the Public Hearing Room, I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Public notice advertisement was given in the February 7, 2005, edition of the Pacific Daily News (PDN), posted in the Government Meetings Section in the February 10 and 11, 2005 editions of the PDN, and Public Notice Ads in the February 4 and 9, 2005 editions of the Marianas Variety, Guam Issue. A live broadcast of the public hearing appeared on Channel 61 that day (February 11, 2005).

Senators present at the public hearing were:

Speaker Mark Forbes, Chairman Vice Speaker Joanne M.S. Brown, Member Senator Robert Klitzkie, Member Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr., Member Senator Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr., Member Senator Lou A. Leon Guerrero

### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

**Dr. Mohammad Golabi, professor University of Guam,** provided written testimony in favor of Bill 35 and provided a basic review of the program at the Inarajan Experimental Station. Dr. Golabi briefly described the islands current situation with the closure of the Ordot Dump and the opening of a municipal landfill. Dr. Golabi stated that one of the methods to ensure that the islands next landfill does not exceed its capacity before it is expected would be to promote methods like Bioconversion(composting). Dr. Golabi also stated that by composting materials on island may benefit the islands economy in tremendous ways. Mr. Golabi provided written testimony which is attached.

**Dr. Greg Wiecko, professor University of Guam,** offered oral testimony in support of Bill 35 and commended the work that Dr. Golabi has given to the composting program and that the appropriation will be put to great use in educating the people of the island on the importance of composting and reducing the amount of waste in our landfill.

Mr. Paul Tobiason, Recycling Association of Guam member, provided written testimony in support of Bill 35 and wanted to commend the author of Bill 35 on helping to keep Guam clean.

### Member Questioning and Comments

On the issue of the Bill, **Senator Lou Leon Guerrero** stated her support of Bill 35 and just wanted to know if the Experimental Station would be open to the public to dispose of their wastes. **Dr. Golabi** stated that they will welcome any wastes and that the Experiment Station will be more than happy to assist the public and private companies in developing a composting system specifically for each individual or company. **Senator Frank Aguon Jr.**, also expressed his support of the appropriation and that any program

Adolpho Palacios stated that he is in full support of the intent of this bill. Vice Speaker Brown briefly stated, since she toured the Experiment Station she has known that if the program were to get equipment such as a composting machine that the program would be able to expand its operations out to the community. Vice Speaker Brown also stated that the Agricultural Experiment Station has been very successful in their program by introducing and assisting Farmer Ernie Wusstig with his corn plantation.

### III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters finds that the intent of Bill 35 to deappropriate Fifty Thousand Dollars and Reapproprite it to the University of Guam's Inarajan Experiment Station is well founded. The bill will assist a program that the community will view as a valuable program for our future that will provide other means of disposing of our daily wastes rather than discharging them in our landfill.

Accordingly, the Committee Executive Committee, to which Bill No. 35 (EC) was referred, does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan **TO DO PASS BILL NO. 35 (EC)**, "An Act To Deappropriate Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) From The Sums Appropriated To The Legislature And To Reappropriate Said Sum To The University Of Guam Inarajan Agricultural Experiment Station."

Testimony Provided by Dr. Mohammad Golabi from the University of Guam in support of Bill No. 35 that is stated as:

"AN ACT TO DEAPPROPRIATE FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000) FROM THE SUMS APPROPRIATED TO THE LEGISLATURE AND TO REAPPROPRIATE SAID SUM TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM INARAJAN AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENT STATION".

### DESCRIPTION OF THE PROBLEM

The current waste disposal crisis in Guam has villages and government officials searching for alternative disposal methods. Reusing, Recycling and Composting are three good ways to keep trash out of landfills and take advantage of their benefit.

Land filling of solid waste material is a major problem for the island of Guam. Landfilling of the huge volume of solid waste material not only causes environmental problems, but is in fact loss of valuable resources which could be available for other uses such as soil amendment in forest lands, farm fields, landscaping and home gardens.

We propose to develop an organics recovery and recycling of organic wastes for Guam which will consist of [1] a pilot project for a composting and bioconversion of solid wastes to a useful agricultural product, [2] product testing, and [3] design of a full-scale organics recycling program. The solid wastes targeted will include; [1] typhoon debris and organic fraction of the municipal solid wastes, [2] yard wastes/leaves and tree trimmings, [3] food waste (including restaurants and fish waste), and [4] animal manures.

#### SOLUTION BEING SOUGHTH TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM

Bioconversion (composting) of organic wastes can be a suitable method of treatment that eliminates the usual problems of solid organic wastes by (1) improving handling characteristics of solid waste, (2) reducing weight, moisture content and volume, and (3) removing nuisance due to odors. The resulting product will increase storability and improve physical characteristics and a balanced nutrient base suitable for high rate application in agriculture, forestry, landscaping and related industries. Composting also leads to a volume reduction of up to one-half of the initial volume, depending upon the raw material.

Herein a one-year project to develop a large scale composting of solid waste program and the production of mature compost and its use as a renewable resource for soil conditioning and ameliorant on the forestlands and agricultural fields in Guam is proposed.

Composting, as a waste management strategy will reduce the overall cost of solid waste disposal and create products that are useable in other areas (Agriculture, Forestry, and Horticulture). The development and demonstration of this operation will be a long-term solution for the solid waste management in Guam and the other islands of Micronesia.

#### **COMPOSTING METHODS**

There are many methods of composting organic materials. These include active windrow (with turning), passive composting piles, passively aerated windrow (supplying air through perforated pipes embedded in the windrow), active aerated windrow (forced air),

bins, rectangular agitated beds, silos, rotating drums, containers, anaerobic digestion, and vermicompost (using earthworms).

In this project we are proposing to use active windrow, which requires a 'pull-behind compost turner' called 'AEROMASTER'. The 'AEROMASTER' compost turner is capable of turning large piles of compost and provides maximum blending and optimum air circulation.

Turning compost allows oxygen in and carbon dioxide  $(CO_2)$  out. By turning we provide an aerobic condition for an aerobic process. Turning allows oxygen to circulate and creates an environment for the aerobic microbes to continue to function.

The composting material should be turned whenever the temperature rises above 145°F to prevent overheating. Weekly reading of temperature, and moisture levels will be taken to monitor the compost operation for a quality final renewable product to be used not only as soil conditioner but also as fertilizer in order to improve the quality of the degraded soils

### THE BENEFITS OF COMPOSTING

One of the benefits of composting is that it lowers the risk of pollution and nuisance, destroys pathogens, suppresses diseases that otherwise would spread as the result of mishandling of municipal garbage. Properly processed compost reduces soil borne diseases without the use of chemical control.

#### LAND APPLICATION OF COMPOST


The composted material is an odorless, fine-textured, low-moisture material that can be used in gardens, potting, nurseries, or applied as fertilizer and soil amendment on crop fields and forest lands with little or no odor or fly breeding potential. Compost can be an excellent source of organic matter, nitrogen and other nutrients. However, nitrogen in compost is stabilized and becomes gradually available to the crop in a slow release process. Since the mature compost is fine textured and has less water than the raw material, it can be applied more uniformly and with better control. The composted material also can be stored and applied when convenient.

### WHO CAN BENEFIT FROM COMPOST?

People of Guam will certainly benefit from the development of our composting methodology not only as an efficient waste management strategy but also farmers, ranchers, households, hotel landscapers and public in general will befit from the compost application on their land for whatever the land is used for.

This Bill (Bill No. 35) will provide funding for the composting project to be conducted by the University of Guam researcher in order to introduce a large scale composting technology and to develop a long-term solution to an old problem of waste management in the island of Guam.



AN ACT TO DEAPPROPRIATE FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000) FROM THE SUMS APPROPRIATED TO THE LEGISLATURE AND TO REAPPROPRIATE SAID SUM TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM INARAJAN AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENT STATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative findings and intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that with the high volume of compostable material generated on Guam daily, and the need to reduce waste from entering the landfill, there is a need for alternative means of reducing waste in an environmentally friendly method. Therefore, the value of composting biodegradable wastes will greatly benefit the people and environment of Guam.

*I Liheslatura* further finds that the University of Guam's Inarajan Agricultural Station has conducted successful composting projects, and would be best suited to operate and expand composting operations that will benefit the community.

Section 2. Deappropriation and Reappropriation. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) is deappropriated from the sums appropriated to the legislature prior to July 1, 2004 and reappropriated to the University of Guam's Inarajan Agricultural Experiment Station for the sole purpose of purchasing a compost turner and needed supplies for the compost operations. Notwithstanding any other law or

rule the Fiscal Officer of the legislature is authorized to reduce the allotment to Vice
Speaker Brown by an amount equal to the sum deappropriated by this section.

Section 3. Reporting. One hundred and eighty (180) days upon the enactment of this law, and upon the expenditure of these funds, the University of Guam's Inarajan Agricultural Experimental Station shall prepare financial reports for the President of the University of Guam who shall then submit the reports to *I Liheslaturan Guahan*. No portion of this appropriation shall be used for purposes other than specifically defined in Section 2 of this law.

**Section 5. Severability.** *If* any provision of this law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this law are severable.
