Transmitted herewith is Bill No. 33 (EC), "AN ACT TO AMEND §43.50, CHAPTER 43 OF TITLE 9 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO REQUIRE PERSONS, ENTITIES OR CORPORATIONS BUYING COPPER WIRE TO MAINTAIN A LOG BOOK OF ALL PURCHASES MADE FROM ON-ISLAND SOURCES AND TO RETAIN ALL COPPER WIRE PURCHASED FOR A PERIOD OF SEVEN (7) DAYS BEFORE ALTERING, SELLING, MELTING, DESTROYING, OR OTHERWISE DISPOSING OF THE COPPER WIRE," now designated as Public Law 28-18.

In recent months, there have been approximately 30 thefts involving copper wire costing our ratepayers more than \$18,000. The damage from these thefts exposes the community to the danger of dangling, live wires and power outages sometimes affecting those on life support systems.

It is difficult to trace these thefts because people or companies who purchase the wire do not have to record the transaction. With this legislation, we will require the buyers of copper wire to keep a record of their transactions, thereby deterring future theft. This will save ratepayers' money in the long run but more importantly, it ensures the safety of our community.

I thank Senator Joanne Brown for introducing the solution to this problem and commend her consistent record of passing legislation that protects the public interest. I also commend the Guam Power Authority and the Consolidated Commission on Utilities for working prospectively with Senator Brown to deter these thefts and to raise public awareness on the issue.

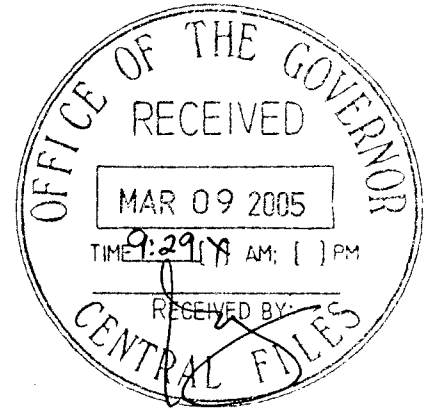



**AN ACT TO AMEND §43.50, CHAPTER 43 OF TITLE 9  
GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO REQUIRE PERSONS,

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings.** *I Mina'Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan*  
3 *Guåhan* finds that the theft of copper wire has reached epidemic levels.  
4 Thieves have brazenly stolen copper wire from both public and private

1 entities, and buyers of copper wire are currently under no requirement to  
2 identify the sellers of the stolen wire. A legal requirement that buyers of  
3 copper wire keep a record of their transactions will deter theft.

4 **Section 2. §43.50, Chapter 43 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated**  
5 **is hereby *amended* to read:**

6 “(f) Any person, corporation or entity who, as a substantial  
7 part of a business, buys and sells used items, including copper  
8 wire, and including any contractor who buys copper wire in the  
9 course of conducting his or her business, shall retain, for a  
10 minimum of one (1) year after the last entry, a log book of all  
11 purchases of copper wire from on-island sources, indicating the  
12 nature of the items bought, the name and address of the seller, the  
13 price paid, and the date of purchase, and shall obtain and  
14 maintain a copy of each seller’s identification documents,  
15 including, *but not limited to*, a government driver’s license,  
16 government identification card or passport, and a copy of the  
17 registration certificate of the vehicles used to transport the copper  
18 wire. The above records shall be made available to law  
19 enforcement officers upon request.

20 (g) Any person, corporation or entity who, as a substantial  
21 part of a business, buys and sells used items, including copper  
22 wire, and including any contractor who buys copper wire in the  
23 course of conducting his or her business, who purchases said wire  
24 from persons who do not have a business license for buying or  
25 selling copper wire, shall keep such wire for a period of seven (7)

1 days before altering, selling, melting, destroying, or otherwise  
2 disposing of copper wire purchased on Guam.

3 (h) Any knowing violation of Subsections (c), (d) or (e) of  
4 §43.50 of Chapter 43 of Title 9 GCA shall be a misdemeanor upon  
5 the first conviction of any such violation, and shall be a felony of  
6 the third degree for any subsequent offense. Any violation of  
7 Subsections (f) or (g) shall be a felony of the third degree. A third  
8 conviction of any such violation shall require revocation of the  
9 offender's business license."

10 **Section 3. Severability.** *If any provisions of this Act or its application*  
11 *to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such*  
12 *invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which*  
13 *can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this*  
14 *end the provisions of this Act are severable.*

## I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Criminal Justice, Public Safety, Youth & Foreign Affairs conducted a public hearing on February 10, 2005 in the Legislative Public Hearing Room, *Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Public notice was printed in the Pacific Daily News on February 3 and February 8, 2005.

## II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

**Douglas Moylan, Attorney General of Guam**, provided written testimony (see attached) in support of Bill No. 33. Mr. Moylan conveyed in his testimony that broadening the scope of materials that are purchased or sold as used items could strengthen the Bill.

**John Benevente, General Manager, Guam Power Authority**, appeared before the Committee to offer oral testimony in support of Bill No. 33. Mr. Benevente stated that the theft of copper wire has become an epidemic. There have been 28 incidents of theft recorded since November 01, 2004 costing GPA nearly \$100,000. Mr. Benevente further stated GPA has initiated an awareness program for the public and has appealed to the various recycling companies and businesses with bucket trucks to monitor such activity. Mr. Benevente suggested that the charge of misdemeanor upon the first conviction be changed to a felony of the first degree.

**Henry Simpson, Guam Racing Federation**, provided oral and written (see attached) testimony in support of Bill No. 33. Mr. Simpson suggested that other types of metal and items be included as part of the requirement to help curb this illegal activity.

**Ben Gumataotao, Mayor, Piti Village**, presented oral testimony in support of Bill No. 33. Mr. Gumataotao proposed that the requirement be extended to other recyclable materials. He further proposed that the punishment be more severe than what is currently written in the bill.

**Raymond Perez, Captain, Guam Police Department**, appeared before the Committee in support of Bill No. 33. Capt. Perez expressed that the legislation would greatly assist GPD with regards to enforcement. Capt. Perez suggested that other commodities be applied to the requirement.

**Mark Torre, Sergeant, Guam Police Department**, appeared before the Committee in support of Bill No. 33. Sgt. Torre suggested that a provision be added to require businesses, corporations, or entities that buy or receive copper wire in large volume to report such transaction to the authorities and to include measurement information. Sgt. Torre also suggested that the timeline of seven (7) days to retain the copper wire before disposing be extended to thirty (30) days to allow GPD more time when conducting an investigation and ensuring that no evidence is lost.

**Senator Kasperbauer** posed the question to Capt. Perez why nothing could be done in the case of Henry Simpson, where wire was stolen from his property and later found at a scrap yard. Capt. Perez answered that he was not aware of the case and did not know of the specifics surrounding the case.

**Senator Palacios** suggested that a provision be included that would require the buyer to immediately report to authorities (i.e. GPD, GPA) when a large volume or quantity of copper wire is being sold.

**Vice Speaker Brown** expressed her appreciation to the panel for their comments and suggestions and her disappointment that no one from the recycling companies came forward to provide testimony. She pointed out that there must be a balance between addressing the need to curb the number of thefts of copper wire and placing considerable requirements on businesses in the recycling industry.

**Chairman Tenorio** expressed his appreciation to the panel for their presence and support of the Bill. He further stated that the needs of law enforcement officials to conduct thorough investigations are met but, also, being mindful of the impact it may have on businesses that will be required to store the material for a certain period of time.

### III. FINDINGS

The Committee on Criminal Justice, Public Safety, Youth & Foreign Affairs finds that the recent rash of copper wire theft has reached epidemic levels. The Committee also finds that, copper wire is a lucrative commodity that can be easily obtained illegally and sold for profit. The requirement of obtaining certain information about the

customer and the material being sold provides a mechanism for police officers to conduct a thorough investigation into illegal exchange of copper wire to scrap dealers.

#### IV. RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Criminal Justice, Public Safety, Youth & Foreign Affairs hereby reports out Bill No. 33 (EC): "An act to amend 9 GCA §43.50 to require persons, entities, or corporations buying copper wire to maintain a log book of all purchases made from on-island sources and to retain all copper wire purchased for a period of seven (7) days before selling, melting, destroying, or otherwise disposing of the copper wire." to *I Mina Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* with the recommendation **TO DO PASS.**

### LEGISLATIVE TESTIMONY

#### Bill Number 33

(Public Hearing on Thursday, February 10, 2005)

The Office of the Attorney General currently is in support as to the above identified legislation as drafted. The reasons are set forth below.

The “in the business of buying or selling copper wire” language is not broad enough to include the business owner that says he is not in the business of buying or selling copper wire, but is in the business of buying, selling all sorts of items, one of which might be copper wire.

The Bill could be strengthened by making it applicable to persons who, as a substantial part of a business, buy and sell used items. The Bill only applies to those who are “in the business” of buying and selling, we would have to prove that this was a substantial part of their business before the criminal statute could be applied to them. This problem was encountered when businesses were buying stolen storm shutters.

A major problem at the time was that business were not required to keep any records of what from whom they bought. The record keeping requirements of the Bill will help with this problem.

**Legislative Testimony**

The Bill would probably not be enforceable because there would be no way to prove that a given amount of wire was purchased from off-Island. Since GPA has said that it does not mark its wire, it would be hard to prove. We should require that all buyers and sellers of wire keep the required logs identifying where the material was purchased from.

Dear Chief Ishizaki,

The changes I think would help are:

1. All scrap yard, pawn shops, and ect. Must pay for the items they buy by check. The check must include the full name and, address, drivers license number or other picture identification of the seller.
2. All Buyers must provide a fingerprint system such as Authentiprint Identification System or similar system and record the index fingerprint of every seller.
3. All Buyers must take a picture of the seller and the objects he sells. Picture (s) must include full height of seller, objects he sells, and the sellers vehicle with license plate. Buyer must keep records for 90 days and make them available to the police at anytime during working hours
4. Penalties:
  - 1.) \$10,000.00 fine for non compliance
  - 2.) Loss of business license
  - 3.) Arrest

## 9 G.C.A. § 43.50

Guam Code Annotated  
TITLE 9. CRIMES AND CORRECTIONS.  
CHAPTER 43. THEFT AND RELATED OFFENSES  
ARTICLE 1. DEFINITIONS  
Current through P.L. 27-23 (2003)

**§ 43.50. Theft by Receiving Stolen Property; Defined.**

→ (a) A person is guilty of theft if he intentionally receives, retains or disposes of movable property of another knowing that it has been stolen or believing that it has probably been stolen. It is a defense to a charge of violating this Section that the defendant received, retained or disposed of the property with intent to restore it to the owner.

→ (b) Where the defendant is in the business of buying, selling or otherwise dealing in property, proof that he obtained stolen property without having made reasonable inquiry whether the person from whom he obtained it has the legal right to sell or deliver it, and that he obtained it under circumstances which should have caused him to make such inquiry, gives rise to an inference that he obtained it knowing that it has been stolen or believing that it has been probably stolen.

(c) Any person or corporation which is in the business of buying or selling gold, diamonds, coins, silver, or gems or jewelry shall retain for a minimum of one (1) year after the last entry a log book of all purchases made from on-island sources, indicating the nature of the items bought, the name and address of the seller, the price paid, and the date of purchase. In addition, in the case of items purchased from a person not in the business of selling gold, coins, diamonds, gems, silver, or jewelry, the purchaser shall either take a picture of the seller, or shall obtain identification from the seller containing a picture. The above records shall be made available to law enforcement officers upon request.

(d) Any person or corporation which is in the business of buying or selling gold, diamonds, coins, silver, or gems or jewelry shall retain all items purchased on Guam from persons not business licensed for the purpose of buying or selling gold, diamonds, coins, silver, gems or jewelry for a period of seven (7) days before selling, melting, destroying, or otherwise disposing of such items purchased on Guam.

(e) It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly purchase gold, diamonds, jewelry, silver, gems or coins from any person under the age of eighteen (18) years, provided that nothing herein shall be construed as prohibiting the parent or guardian of a minor child from selling gold, diamonds, jewelry, coins or gems belonging to a minor child, on behalf of said child.

(f) Any knowing violation of Subsections (c), (d) or (e) of § 43.50 of Chapter 43 of Title 9 GCA shall be a misdemeanor upon the first conviction of any such violation, and shall be a felony of the third degree for any subsequent offense.




