

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that sons
- 3 and daughters of Guam have served with distinction and bravery in the
- 4 United States Army for many decades, and have served in such conflicts as

the Second World War, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Grenada and Panama campaigns, Desert Storm and the Persian Gulf campaign, and the current struggles for freedom in Afghanistan, Iraq and elsewhere. Moreover, the United States Army played a vital role in the liberation of Guam from occupation during World War II, and continues to serve the cause of liberty throughout the world. For these reasons, I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds it fitting that Route 16 be named and designated "Army Drive" to honor our many veterans who served proudly and bravely in the United States Army and continue to serve to this very day, those Army units that participated in the liberation of Guam, and the United States Army in general.

Section 2. A new Section 834.1 is hereby *added* to Title 1 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:

"§834.1. Designation of Route 16 as 'Army Drive'. Route 16 is hereby designated as 'Army Drive', from its junction with Route 8 to its junction with Route 1, Marine Corps Drive. The Department of Public Works shall post signs along Route 16 at reasonable intervals that visibly designate Route 16 as 'Army Drive'. The Department of Public Works shall further cause to be fixed, in prominent overhead display, signs that designate Route 16 as 'Army Drive', at the intersection of Route 16 and Route 8 and the intersection of Route 16 and Route 1, Marine Corps Drive. The Department shall further cause to be displayed along the roadside, at or near such designated intersections, signage that dedicates 'Army Drive' to our Army veterans, to those soldiers of the United States Army who aided in the liberation of Guam, and to the men and women who serve in the United States Army

generally. A dedication ceremony for the designation of Route 16 as
'Army Drive' shall be conducted *no later than* sixty (60) days after the
effective date of this Act."

COMMITTEE REPORT ON BILL NO. 49 (EC)

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 834.1.TO 1GCA TO DESIGNATE ROUTE 16 AS "ARMY DRIVE" TO HONOR THE MEN AND WOMEN WHO HAVE SERVED AND CONTINUE TO SERVE IN THE UNITED STATES ARMY, THOSE ARMY UNITS THAT PARTICIPATED IN THE LIBERATION OF GUAM IN WW II, AND THE THOUSANDS OF OUR PEOPLE WHO ARE ARMY VETERANS.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters held a public hearing at 9 a.m. on February 14, 2005 in the Public Hearing Room, I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Public notice advertisement was given in the February 7, 2005, edition of the Pacific Daily News (PDN), posted in the Government Meetings Section in the February 10 and 11, 2005 editions of the PDN. A live broadcast of the public hearing appeared on Channel 61 that day (February 14, 2005).

Senators present at the public hearing were:

Speaker Mark Forbes, Chairman Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr. Senator Robert Klitzkie Senator Lou A. Leon Guerrero Senator Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals appearing before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill are as follows:

Col. Jerry M. Rivera, Acting Adjutant General of the Guam National Guard – In Favor Mr. Juan S. Finona, President of the Vietnam Veterans of America, Guam Chapter 668 – In Favor

Col. Jerry Rivera, Acting Adjutant General of the Guam National Guard presented oral testimony in favor of Bill 69. He stated he is in favor of naming any routes on Guam after the Armed Forces and if the Legislature could find a "Drive" to name for the Navy and Air Force, because of their sacrifices. He stated he was in favor of the renaming the "Marine Corp. Drive" and certainly of "Army Drive" and with our global war on terrorism we have all our armed services gainfully engaged in fighting our terrorist around the globe. He stated his presence at the public hearing is the Acting Adjutant General and representing both the Army and Air Force and reiterated his favor for the bill to honor our men and women in uniform. The renaming of the roads after the armed services would be reminder to everyone of the sacrifices that these men and women put in everyday of their lives, not only of today, but those who have served in the past and those who have passed on. He further stated that Bill 49 is a non-controversial bill, and that he cannot foresee anyone opposing a bill such as Bill 49. He commended Speaker Forbes on the bill.

Mr. Juan Finona. President of the Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 668 Guam presented oral testimony in favor of Bill 49. He expressed that on Friday night last week, he was approached by a Navy member of his Chapter and asked if he could support "U.S. Navy Drive" and which he responded by stating to the member that he would speak with Speaker Mark Forbes. He indicated that the drive to be renamed will be the road at the traffic light at the entrance of Naval Station to the entrance of Naval Magazine. He stated on behalf of the Vietnam Veterans they honor Bill 49, they support the bill and that they hope that the Navy and Air Force will not be forgotten, because they too sacrificed their lives, as well as our current active duty members are fighting for us also.

Author of the Bill, Speaker Forbes, spoke briefly stating that the purpose of the bill is to recognize a few things. Stating, "First, on the day of our liberation from Japanese occupation in WWII, there were both army and marine units, who hit the beach and conducted operations on Guam. Currently we are

all aware of Marine Corp Drive, which runs from the gate of Naval Station, all the way to the gate of Anderson Air Force Base, has been designated over the course of many decades to honor the contribution of those marines who hit the beach on Guam. And although it is not well known, the road that is commonly known as the "Back Road to Anderson", is actually named "Seventy Seventh Army Division Drive". But, that is something that has not penetrated the consciousness of most of us. Maybe because the name is long, I have no idea, but that is not something that the average person knows. Most people still consider it the "Back Road to Anderson". But, the 77th Army Division did participate in the liberation of Guam and in the course of their operation they had significant responsibilities in that portion of the action, as the less forces were pushing towards Mt. Barrigada, Machete Hill, otherwise Route 16. Clearly if any of the roads are in the vicinity of Machete, Route 16, is the road. Secondarily, all of us who have been in Guam for a long time know that Guam is the home to many, many veterans. Our per capita veteran population on Guam is the equal, if not greater than, any other American community. And the bulk of those veterans are US Army Veterans. This is something we need to recognize, we need to recognize that so many of our men and women have chosen to serve their nation and serve their community and serve the world wearing an Army uniform. This is not in any way, shape or form, diminished the contributions that have been made by our veterans and other branches, but, it is a fact that the majority of our veterans have been U.S. Army Veterans, and this is something to recognize as well. To this very day, the participation of our local community, the armed forces tend to be the heaviest in the United States Army. And this is something, that I think ought to be recognized. And addition to that, Route 16 bears the interesting distinction of being the road that one travels to get to the Thomas Santos Readiness Center and to Fort Juan Muna, and all of the facilities that currently have an association on Guam with the United States Army.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on General and Omnibus Matters finds that the intent of Bill No. 49 serves to honor the men and women of the U.S. Army, those who have died, those who are Veterans and those are active and reserved members. This notable gesture is way overdue, to the those who are still alive and the families of those who have died, this measure recognizes their invaluable service, contribution, and sacrifices to the country, the people, and the world they have served to protect the inherent rights of freedom. The committee further finds that the purpose of this measure is to be twofold, first to acknowledge one of the two armed forces who first secured the island during the occupation of Japanese forces on Guam, the U.S. Army. The 77th Army Division held a vital role in the liberation of Guam by infiltrating the inner terrain of the island and securing the area such as Mt. Barrigada, and Mt. Macheche Hill (Route 16) for the operations of the U.S. Army. Secondly, this measure appropriately recognizes that Route 16 is the travel thoroughfare to the Thomas Santos Readiness Facility and the Fort Juan Muna Facility, both in association with the U.S. Army. The appropriateness to rename this thoroughfare "Army Drive" befits its locality to these facilities.

Senator Frank Aguon expressed that Guam lead the nation per capita in the armed forces in the number of lives lost as a result of war. He states "that in the past several years, since 9-11, there has been a better acknowledgement of the contributions of the US Armed Forces members, its difficult for me to even before 1997, when I had the opportunity to participate in a very good organization of the military branch, prior to that, I did not have the sensitivity of understanding fully what it meant to dawn a uniform and to know and understand what our people are doing in terms of making ultimate sacrifices, serving our nation in this capacity, and since then, certainly I have a different perspective and better

appreciation for what our men and women do in terms of their service. I stand in support of the concept of paying appropriate treatment and recognition to our Army personnel.

Accordingly, the Committee on General and Omnibus Matters to which Bill No. 49 (EC) was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan **TO DO PASS BILL NO. 49 (EC),** "An act to add a new Section 834.1.to 1GCA to designate Route 16 as "Army Drive" to honor the men and women who have served and continue to serve in the United States Army, those army units that participated in the Liberation of Guam in WW II, and the thousands of our people who are Army Veterans."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Findings. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that sons of daughters 2 of Guam have served with distinction and bravery in the US Army for many 3 decades, and have served in such conflicts as the Second World War, the 4 Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Grenada and Panama campaigns, Desert 5 Storm and the Persian Gulf campaign, and the current struggles for freedom 6 in Afghanistan, Iraq and elsewhere. Moreover, the US Army played a vital 7 role in the liberation of Guam from occupation during WWII, and continues to 8 serve the cause of liberty throughout the World. For these reasons, I 9 Liheslaturan Guåhan finds it fitting that Route 16 be named and designated 10 "Army Drive" to honor our many veterans who served proudly and bravely 11 in the US Army and continue to serve to this very day, those Army units that 12 participated in the liberation of Guam, and the US Army in general. 13

Section 2. A new section 834.1. is added to 1GCA to read:

"Section 834.1. Designation of Route 16 as Army Drive. Route 16 1 is hereby designated as "Army Drive", from its junction with Route 8 to its 2 The Department of Public Works shall post signs 3 junction with Route 1. along Route 16 at reasonable intervals that visibly designate Route 16 as 4 "Army Drive". The Department of Public Works shall further cause to be 5 fixed, in prominent overhead display, signs that designate Route 16 as "Army 6 Drive", at the intersection of Route 16 and Route 8 and the intersection of 7 Route 16 and Route 1. The Department shall further cause to be displayed along the roadside at or near such designated intersections signage that 9 dedicates "Army Drive" to our Army veterans, to those soldiers of the US 10 Army who aided in the liberation of Guam, and to the men and women who 11 serve in the US Army generally. A dedication ceremony for the designation of 12 Route 16 as Army Drive shall be conducted no more than sixty (60) days after 13 the effective date of this act." 14
